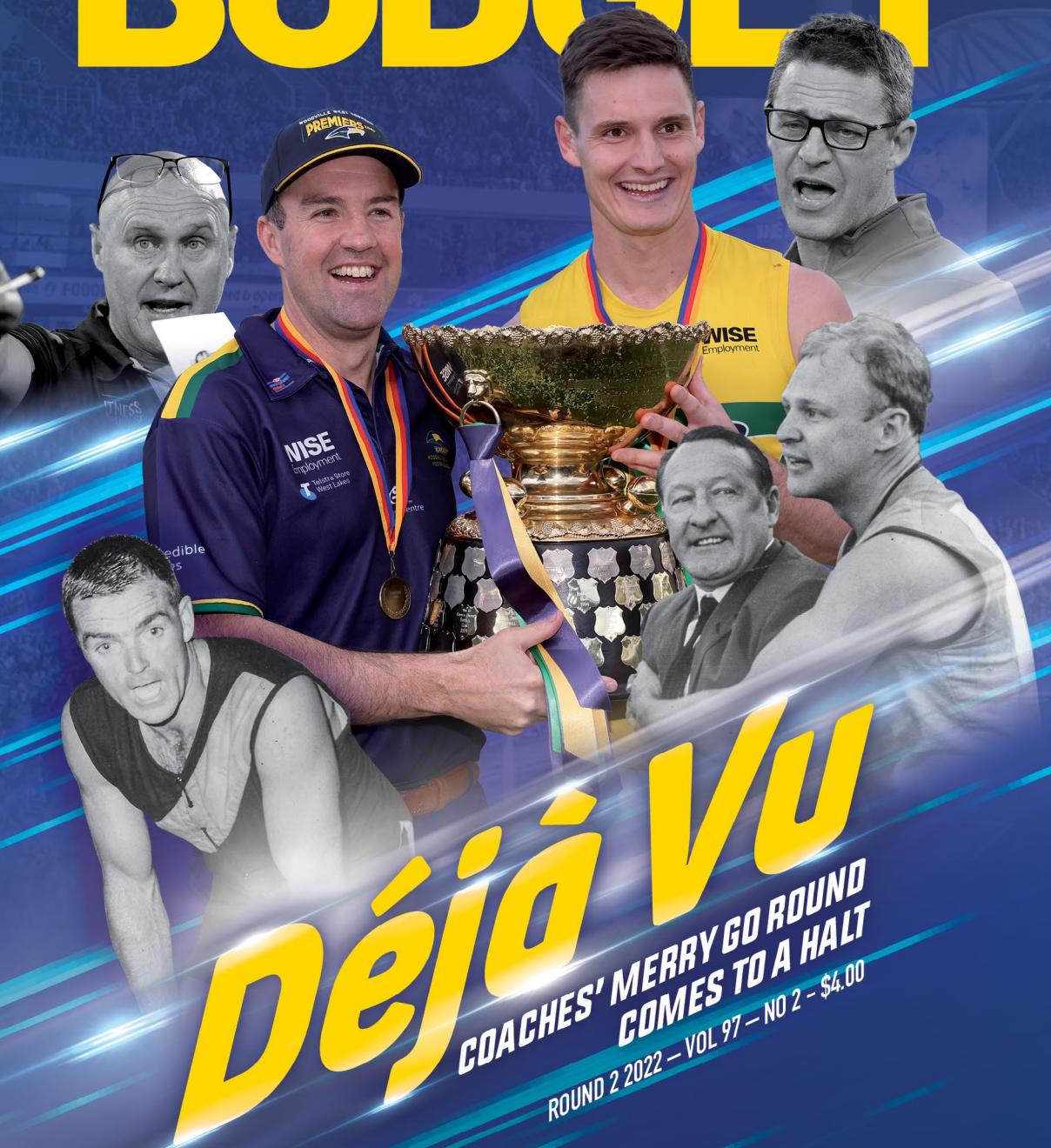

UP, UP AND AWAY

We have liftoff!
It was the first game of the season, the SANFL Showdown between Adelaide and Port Adelaide. And the Crows were off to a flyer.

But no-one soared higher than Adelaide forward Shane McAdam, who may just have snared the Mark of the Year in just the fourth quarter of the season.

McAdam lit up Adelaide Oval when he leapt onto the shoulders of Magpies defender Tom Corcoran in the

southern end goalsquare and grabbed this stunning mark.

Sturt fans came to expect skyscraping marks – along with freakish goals – from this sublimely talented player in 2018 and the Crows picked him up after he showed his class in the SANFL finals. McAdam, who hails from Halls Creek, a remote town in north-east WA, booted three goals in Adelaide's 62-point win against Port.

And the Crows soared straight to the top of the table.

MATCH PREVIEWS

NORWOOD V EAGLES

There's a fine line between pleasure and pain. The last time these clubs clashed was in a hard-fought qualifying final last year. And what followed could not have been more contrasting. The Redlegs trailed by just four points at the 22-minute-mark of the last quarter, having missed two chances to snatch the lead. The Eagles scrambled home by kicking three successive behinds and, for them, the rest was history.

The Legs suddenly were history when they were beaten by 19 points by South in the first semi-final. The Eagles, of course, swept to back-to-back premierships. It's a fine line. And it was like that for Norwood in this campaign's opening round as well. The Legs smashed Glenelg 44-32 in clearances at the Bay. They had more inside-50s (53-52) and the same number of scoring shots but kicking 0.5 in the first quarter was not reward for effort. But there's no question about the effort – Nik Rokahr, ruckman Harry Boyd, who won 40 hit-outs, and inspirational skipper Matt Nunn won plenty of hard ball and Declan Hamilton seemed to have the ball on a string – and Jade Rawlings' men are not far away from toppling a giant. Tonight could be the night.

Jade Sheedy performed a minor miracle in redefining his side after losing so much talent before last season to conjure back-to-back flags. This year could be an even harder task. The losses of Magarey Medallist James Tsitas, Jack Oatey Medallist Jack Hayes and electric Tyson Stengle, whose opportunist goalkicking was so crucial in last year's major round, are huge and the Eagles were caught short by 22 points by North in the season opener, despite Daniel Menzel's six goals. But he's done it before, so don't doubt Sheeds. Or the remarkable team spirit and powerful belief he has built at Oval Avenue.

CENTRAL V WEST

The SANFL competition is tightening up and, although the bottom two sides from last season suffered first-round losses, they put up heartening performances to hit back from big deficits in the second quarter to strongly challenge for victory.

The Bulldogs were stiff to miss by five points against South. Making the trek to Noarlunga without coach Paul Thomas because of Covid protocols – Nick Russell took charge – and tackling a side that had made preliminary finals in the past two seasons, Central trailed by six goals in time-on of the second quarter. But it banged on the next five goals and it was game on. With Travis Schiller in everything as always, with 30 touches, the Doggies snatched the lead at the 23-minute-mark of the last quarter when ruckman Billy McCormack goaled. But it was not for long.

The Bloods didn't quite get that close against Sturt but they more than made a game of it after trailing by 35 points at the four-minute-mark of the second term. They kicked five of the next six goals and by early in the final quarter the Richmond crowd was up and about as they edged within 16 points. Westies stepped up the pressure – the tackle count was

even for the night – and Lachlan Squire, with 22 disposals and three goals, was a constant threat. Sturt kicked away with four goals in a six-minute burst, reinforcing the message the Bloods need to be consistently hard at it for a full game – they had conceded three goals in three minutes late in the first quarter.

NORTH V ADELAIDE

They weren't necessarily everyone's tips in the opening round but these sides were off to a flyer in 2022. No-one flew higher than Shane McAdam, who soared for a remarkable mark in a three-goal haul in the Crows' 62-point demolition derby win. And the Roosters passed the toughest test with flying colours, beating back-to-back premiers the Eagles by 22 points with plenty of fresh faces. The experienced hands still led the way, with six goals to premiership forward Keenan Ramsey and Aaron Young (33 disposals), Harrison Wigg (29) and captain Alex Spina (27) in the thick of it but there's some early excitement around Jacob Surjan's men.

Youth can bring plenty of energy and excitement but experience can also give you an edge, as it was with skipper Matthew Wright's five goals in Adelaide's big win against Port. Sam Berry (28 disposals, nine

clearances) and Jay Boyle (29 and seven) controlled the centre square as the Crows claimed their biggest SANFL win against Port, beating the 56-point success at Kadina in 2018. And midfielder Louis Sharrad had a memorable debut for the Crows against his former club, picking up 19 touches and kicking a goal.

STURT V GLENELG

The Bays have won their past four clashes against the Blues, including the two most recent battles at Unley. But pretty much all of them have been tight tussles and Brett Hand's men will know they are in for more of the same this time. Both sides are coming off first-up wins and there were good signs, including a strong defensive effort, in the Bays' 15-point success against Norwood, along with some concerns. One was the discrepancy in clearances, which Norwood dominated, but Jack Oatey Medallist Matt Snook could return this week and he was the biggest clearance winner in the league last season. The Tigers' tackling was fierce and this pressure produced plenty of Redlegs turnovers and missed shots on goal. And they moved the ball well in two three-goal blitzes in the first two quarters, while Brett Turner did his fair share around the ball with eight clearances, along with 11 tackles and 27 possessions.

With so many players snapped up by AFL clubs as footy continues to take a hit because of Covid, it's surprising Sturt has been able to keep hold of Casey Voss. The Blues already lost boom recruit, premiership star Jarrod Lienert when he clinched St Kilda's final list spot a month ago and it would be harsh if they were to lose Voss, who is on the Crows' Covid contingency list. But, while Voss is not as quick, or tall, or possibly athletic as players AFL clubs seem most interested in, he sure knows how to get his hands on the footy. His reading of the play and rebounding

is outstanding and last season's best-and-fairest winner was at it again in the opening round, setting up heaps of play with his 31 touches and 17 marks in a 43-point win against West.

PORT V SOUTH

The Panthers have fallen just short of a long-awaited grand final spot in the past two seasons so some new faces and young blood have given fans hope there might be an extra spark. And, of course, ruck ace Keegan Brooksby is back and his 41 hit-outs in the five-point win against Central gave a reminder of how big an influence he can be. Newcomers Jye Menzie (four goals) and Ryan Garthwaite (three) were dangerous against the Dogs, North Hobart recruit Menzie a livewire

with a goal on the run, one from a set shot, a snap, then a remarkable volley from mid-air. But it was 19-year-old Nic Kraemer whose snap under pressure from 40m dribbled through for the sealer.

Port skipper Cam Sutcliffe at the SANFL season launch said how much the Magpies were enjoying having Anthony Wilson back at the club and warned about what he could do. And the electric midfielder-forward showed all that and more in the first-up loss against the Crows. One of his three goals, when he flew for what would have been a spectacular mark in the forward pocket but couldn't quite hold onto it, yet, while sprawled on the ground, soccered it through from a tight angle, was an early contender for Goal of the Year.

Since Covid has struck, everyone has come to expect everything to be constantly changing. And when it comes to footy coaches, the merry go round they're on never seems to stop.

So it comes as a shock this season is the first time in 23 years all SANFL coaches are the same ones who finished the previous campaign. It's the first time since 1999 none has jumped from the merry go round – or been pushed off it. Every previous year this century at least one club has changed its coach for the next season.

Since Central District and Woodville stepped up to league ranks in 1964 there had only previously been three seasons all coaches continued in charge at the same club as the previous year. Those were in 1969, 1987 and 1999.

But Covid certainly had an impact on SANFL's opening round. The South Adelaide-Central District clash at Noarlunga incredibly took place without either club's senior coach at the ground. South Adelaide's Jarrad Wright, who has taken the Panthers to the past two preliminary finals, and Central District's second-year mentor Paul Thomas were isolated at home, unable to be at the game because they were close contacts under Covid rules.

Former Crows star Brent Reilly stood in for Wright and banked a hard-fought five-point win for the Panthers, while Nick Russell stepped up for Thomas, so-near-yet-so-far as the Doggies hit back from a six-goal deficit to narrowly miss.

It was a different world back in 1969 when all 10 SANFL clubs retained their coaches. They were halcyon times for SANFL and there were some huge names in

charge, including three of the most highly-respected coaches in Australian football history – Jack Oatey, Fos Williams and Neil Kerley. That season Oatey coached Sturt to the fourth of five successive premierships, overwhelming Kerley's Glenelg in the grand final, a game still talked about to this day because of the appearance of Richmond champion Royce Hart with the Tigers.

STARMER'S STAR QUALITY

Athletic ruck Isabelle Starmer has been just what the doctor ordered for Central District.

In between studying for her medical degree, Starmer, from country New South Wales, has taken SANFLW by storm in her second season.

Her stats in the Bulldogs' Round 7 win against Woodville-West Torrens were stunning – 19 kicks, seven marks, six handballs, 28 hit-outs and five tackles – showing how dominant she was in all facets of the game in her best-on-ground performance.

Starmer, who only kicked off her footy career three years ago, came out to the Ponderosa at the beginning of the 2021 campaign, debuting against the Eagles in the opening round and playing all 11 games for the campaign.

She played for Tanunda Magpies in the Barossa Light and Gawler competition in the winter, while completing a medical internship at the hospital in the township.



"I came across to Adelaide from Moruya in rural New South Wales," Starmer said. "I decided to get involved in the local community and make some friends, so I had a crack at Aussie Rules footy.

"Where I come from the rugby codes rule the footy landscape, so I had no understanding of the (Aussie Rules) game before I tried it for the first time with Flinders University. Now I'm keen to be involved in some success at Central District, to give back to the club as they have been great support to me."

Starmer quickly gained the respect of her team-mates and the coaching staff at Elizabeth, with her outstanding work ethic and commitment to the contest.

Bulldogs coach Ben Hunt said: "Izzy initially came to a Central District 'come and try' day back in 2020. She was pretty raw from a skill and knowledge base but she is definitely the type of character who is always looking to improve her game. Izzy will watch plenty of vision, ask questions and works hard

on all aspects of her craft.

"She is still studying for her medical degree, being about six months away from being Dr Starmer."

Hunt said the thing that stands out most with Starmer's footy is her workrate. "She is 100 per cent committed to the contest and her skillset is improving," he said. "There is no questioning the defensive aspects of her game, as she consistently has high tackle count numbers. Another strength is her follow-up work at stoppages and around the ground."

And Hunt came up with a stunning comparison. "There is a hint of the Jimmy Stynes style in aspects to her game with her becoming an extra midfielder when the ball hits the ground," he said. "She is very team-oriented and wears her heart on her sleeve.

"Now 26, she has become a part of our leadership group and she is loved by the playing group." Just what the doctor ordered.

Glenelg maintained its early place at the top of the table with a comfortable 36-point win against Norwood at The Parade.

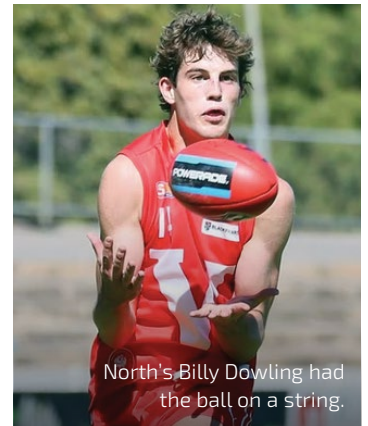

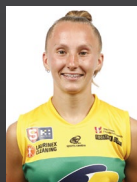
