ON THE FENCE

achie Hosie has mixed feelings about the AFL's contentious mid-season rookie draft.

On the one hand, there is the pride he feels for Glenelg team-mates Brett Turner, who was picked up by Adelaide, and Sam Durdin, who headed to Carlton. And the 2019 revival of the mid-season draft concept saw Hosie realise a childhood dream by playing five AFL

games after being picked up by North Melbourne.

On the other hand, the prospect of State League clubs' premiership hopes being cruelled by the draft's less-than-ideal timing doesn't rest easily with him. It still stings a bit, too, that Hosie, who was leading the SANFL goalkicking when he was pinched by the Kangaroos, missed out on playing in the Tigers' drought-breaking SANFL flag.

"I'm kind of on the fence," the 25-year-old said. "As a player, you'd be mad to not jump at the opportunity to get on a list and fulfil your dreams. As someone who's a good friend of Sam and Brett, I couldn't be happier for them, especially having been on the ride with Sam, getting delisted together and coming back to play together here.

"At the same time, it does kill some sides in the SANFL. Our teams don't get much in return when their players are taken from them. I just wish now it could be at the end of the year, maybe by creating two more rookie spots after the season."

Hosie made a dream start to his AFL career, jagging two first-quarter goals on debut against Geelong, and generally looked the part. But the Covid-19 pandemic wasn't kind to him. Hosie found hub life on the Gold Coast challenging and was denied the opportunity to impress for regular selection following the 2020 cancellation of the VFL.

Ultimately, the reduction in list sizes ended Hosie's North Melbourne stint and saw him return to Glenelg.

"I was in the hub for seven months, which I found difficult, being in our own little bubble and losing touch with what was going on in the real world," he said. "If you weren't playing (AFL), you were doing 10-12km sessions on matchday, which wasn't ideal in trying to put your best foot forward for selection. But there aren't too many people who can say they played in the AFL, so I'm happy with that."

Back at the Bay, Hosie forms – with triple Ken Farmer

"Playing with two of the competition's best forwards is a real privilege every weekend," said Hosie, who runs his family's swimming pool installation business. "We all bring different tricks and skills to the table. Liam takes that big defender, Luke's more up the ground and I do my best work more towards goals. I don't think there are too many defences that can stop us when we're all on."

The trio – and several other team-mates – were well held in last season's shock 67-point grand final loss to Woodville-West Torrens. There is no shortage of motivation in the Tigers camp to rectify that debacle. "What happened last year has fuelled a lot of the boys even more," Hosie said. "I took it personally – I took it really hard. I know we took a lot from that and I wouldn't want anything more than to go one further and get this club another premiership."



MATGH PREVIEWS

As if the excitement of this year's Country Championships isn't enough to set the season alight, the SANFL comp is hotting up after a round full of shocks and plot twists with seven sides still in the mix for finals honours.

Remarkably, only one win separates second side Adelaide from sixth-ranked Sturt after Round 14. And leader of the pack North is just one game clear of the Crows.

Showing just how even is the competition, the top three sides are smarting from losses, with Glenelg's defeat at the hands of South Adelaide proving the seventh-placed Panthers are far from giving up on their finals ambitions.

There are some critical match-ups this week – top versus second in Whyalla, last year's grand finalists Glenelg and the Eagles at it again and South's must-win clash against a Norwood side on the way up all mouth-watering prospects.

GLENELG V EAGLES

If the traditional Anzac Day clash between the previous year's grand finalists is any indication, we're in for a treat with this one. The Tigers snatched a stunning five-point win at Woodville thanks to Reid Kuller's last-gasp snapped goal in a game of fluctuating fortunes. That made it four wins from four for Glenelg to start the season and the Tigers were clear on top of the table. After Round 12 the Bays still were joint top with North with a 9-2 record but after comprehensive losses to Adelaide and South, they suddenly are just one win ahead of sixth side Sturt. It certainly hasn't been plain sailing for last year's premiership rivals, because the Eagles only have a slight percentage advantage on the Double Blues, just inside the top



five. But, boosted by the return of former Crow and Lion Cam Ellis-Yolmen, they will be buoyed by a strong 60-point win against Port when dynamic Daniel Menzel just about wrapped up the Ken Farmer Medal with a stunning seven-goal haul. Classy Menzel now has 46 goals from 13 games, 14 ahead of Sturt's Abe Davis, followed by Tigers duo Lachie Hosie (31) and triple Farmer Medallist Liam McBean – who finished goal-less for the first time this season against the Panthers - on 29. The Bays, dominated by ruckmen Kieran Strachan and Keegan Brooksby in the past two weeks, will be desperate to get back on track, pointing to another memorable clash between these clubs that wouldn't be contemplating the thought of missing finals.

CENTRAL V STURT

While the last clash between the Eagles and Glenelg was a top-shelf thriller, the most recent encounter between these sides was anything but, the Blues hammering the

Bulldogs by 98 points. After that Round 6 clash, Sturt was on top of the table and Central just one win clear of bottom. But a lot has happened since then and Sturt will know it's anything but an easy trip coming to the Ponderosa. Central won't be making the finals but it will play a part in shaping them. With three wins in the past four games Paul Thomas's men appear to have turned the corner and they've already provided big hiccups to finals hopefuls by claiming fighting wins against the Eagles and South. Last week's success against West gave the Dogs successive wins in a season for the first time since 2019 and they are desperate to add to their run, especially against a side that embarrassed them last time. Sturt stayed right in the hunt by surviving a scare and steadying impressively to beat the high-flying Crows for the second time this season. Consistent Guy Page seems to be getting better with age and the dual premiership backman controlled proceedings from the back half -



with 15 marks and 27 disposals – just as he had done when the Blues crunched the Doggies in Round 6.

PORT V WEST

A win sure will be welcome for either of these sides. West has lost its past 26 games, making Port's four successive losses seem not nearly so bad but both sides will be desperate to put a full stop to their runs. The depths of their line-ups have been sorely tested by injuries and Covid protocols and Port fielded just 11 AFL-listed players in a 60-point loss to the Eagles last week. Returning from injury was AFL lead ruckman Scott Lycett, in his first game for three months after having shoulder surgery, and he looked the part, mobbed by his team-mates when he kicked an early goal as the Magpies made a strong start. Veteran Steven Motlop made his presence felt with 32 possessions, while Nick Moore again was in the thick of it with 12 tackles and 15 possessions. A poor tackle count in the first half disappointed West coach Brad

Gotch as the Bloods slipped 27 points behind Central by the main break. But he was pleased his side "stuck at it" with their workrate and intensity in the second half.

NORTH V ADELAIDE

Whyalla couldn't have wished for a better match-up as part of its country footy celebrations than one-versus-two in the big Saturday SANFL clash – even though both sides are smarting from losses. Just when North was on a roll, a game clear with a 10-2 win-loss record and with coach Jacob Surjan having re-signed a new deal to coach the Roosters for three more years, they were stunned by hard-hitting Norwood. And the Crows, who had had to make plenty of changes including losing ball magnet Matt Crouch back to the AFL, didn't seem to know what had hit them when they trailed Sturt by 43 points in the second quarter. Coach Mick Godden was pleased by the way his men arrested the momentum and remarkably snatched the lead back in the third term. Elliott Himmelberg, who booted Adelaide's first two goals, was thrown into ruck and helped turn the game around as the Crows showed why they are premiership threats. But they fell 11 points short in the end. The Roosters led in the second quarter at The Parade but Norwood's pressure proved almost unstoppable in a six-goal loss. It was a slip-up the top side could afford. "We lick our wounds and go again next week," Surjan said. But he will want this week to be different.

SOUTH V NORWOOD

The Panthers showed how strongly they still want to be a part of finals action with a stunning 45-point win against Glenelg. But this week's bid to stay right in the fight looms as even tougher. Norwood has won its past four games - and six of its past seven and its past two wins, against reigning premiers the Eagles and top side North, could not have been more impressive. The Legs' pressure game of winning contested ball and tackling ferociously is proving just about unstoppable. Ruckman Harry Boyd continues to get the ball rolling but he could have his hands full in a much-anticipated matchup. Keegan Brooksby, described as "unbelievable" by coach Jarrad Wright, set South alight against the Bays with 52 hit-outs, 19 disposals, nine clearances and a goal. In what makes this loom as a hard-hitting clash, the Panthers also were strong through the contest and tight defensively as Glenelg was kept goal-less in the first half. Norwood may be without injured skipper Matt Nunn but Jacob Kennerley has been leading the way in his absence and he had 33 touches and kicked two goals against the Roosters, while Nik Rokahr just continues doing the hard things and winning the ball, averaging 29 disposals a game. The Legs have risen from seventh, to sixth, to fifth, to fourth over the past month. It wouldn't be surprising to see that trend continuing.

ELITE BUSH CLUB

orth Adelaide ball magnet Campbell Combe is part of a special club of footballers who have made their mark in the country and the city.

When the star Rooster snared the Magarey Medal in 2020 he became one of just five players to have completed the Magarey Medal-Mail Medal double. And he joined some pretty illustrious company – Harold 'Dribber' Hawke, Barrie Barbary, Ron Benton and Ken Eustice.

Combe, who has starred in previous SA Country Football Championships, will feature in a big weekend with North Adelaide tackling the Crows in Whyalla as part of this year's country titles.

Combe came under notice as a member of the SA under-18 side that in 2013 won the national championships, coached by another North Adelaide Magarey Medallist, Brenton Phillips. He debuted with North in the opening round of 2014 against the Crows, in their first game in the SANFL, but returned to the family farm at Crystal Brook and spent the next four years with the Northern Area Football League's Roosters. He followed three generations of family tradition in 2015 by becoming a premiership player at his foundation club and he won another two flags in the next

three seasons. Combe remarkably won a hat-trick of Mail Medals with Crystal Brook in 2016-18 and, apart from being the dominant player in the NAFL, played outstanding footy in the country championships, winning a couple of Barrie Robran Medals as Northern Zone's best player. He was voted the under-21 player of the championships in 2015 and '16.

Combe loved being a part of the country carnivals, so much so when he was forced out of the '17 campaign with a broken hand, he acted as Northern Zone's runner. He also enjoyed playing Country State football, having a couple of games at Adelaide Oval and travelling to Perth to tackle WA Country at Fremantle Oval. Combe last year became part of another special club when he donned the red SANFL State jumper against the WAFL. Since the turn of this century only former Eagles and North Adelaide utility Todd Miles – who is coaching Central Zone in this year's country championships – and Combe have played for the SA Country State side and SANFL State team.

But, among Combe's many honours, one stands out above the rest. In the Covid-interrupted 2020 season he joined fellow North Adelaide players Hawke and Barbary and West Adelaide's Benton and Eustice with a Magarey to go with his Mail Medals. Hawke won his Mail Medal for Curramulka in 1936 and the Magarey travelling from southern Yorke Peninsula in 1937. Eustice won a Mail Medal playing for Swan Reach in 1956 and SANFL's top gong in 1962. Barbary won his Magarey in North's premiership year of 1960 before securing Mail Medals with the Kybybolite Tigers in 1965 and '66, while Westies dasher Benton won a Magarey in 1957, then the Mail Medal with the Freeling Redlegs in 1960.

"It's a huge honour to be in that company," Combe, 26, said. "These are the type of things you reflect on after you've finished playing."

He will also remember the people who played a role in his development in his four years back at 'the Brook'. "Shane Arbon was my coach and an important mentor. And growing up Joel Head was an important person in my football education," Combe said.

"The driving force behind travelling to Adelaide these days is to add a league premiership at North Adelaide and play in one alongside (younger brother) Will." A win against the Crows in Whyalla would be a big step towards that goal.



ALL ROADS LEAD TO WHYALLA

eady, set, go for one of the largest annual regional sporting events – the Think! Road Safety SA Country Football Championships – this weekend in Whyalla.

SA's best male and female country footballers and a further 200-plus officials and volunteers have descended on the north-eastern Eyre Peninsula city from regional leagues across the State to represent their zones in matches at Bennett and Memorial ovals.

A feature of the weekend also will be the much-anticipated top-of-the-table SANFL clash between North Adelaide and Adelaide, at Bennett Oval on Saturday. And Australian Football Legend Barrie Robran, recruited from Whyalla to play at North Adelaide, with which he won three Magarey Medals, is expected to be back in his home city for the match.

Head of SANFL Community Football Lisa Faraci said prepurchased ticket sales for the event had been strong, with at least 4000 spectators expected to attend across the weekend. "The SANFL regional match has been played as part of the Country Championships for the past few years and gives locals and everyone involved an opportunity to experience SANFL footy up close." Faraci said. "We are also in for a real treat by having the clash between the two top teams of the Hostplus SANFL League – the Roosters, in the heartland of their regional zone, against the strongperforming Crows."

Faraci said SANFL also was pleased to confirm that, on the back of the Country Championships, the SA Country versus WA Country match returns this year after a three-year hiatus due to Covid. At the end of the championships, a team of the carnival will be announced, with the majority of these players forming the SA Country squad. Central District Jack Oatey Medallist Rick Macgowan has been announced as coach of SA Country.



Macgowan, who started his football with Darke Peake Football Club in the Eastern Eyre Football League, played 222 games with Central between 1992-02. In 2004 he added 15 games with North Adelaide and in 2007 he coached Sturt into the finals.

"We are thrilled to confirm the State Country match will be played as a curtain-raiser to the Adelaide v Carlton match at Adelaide Oval on July 30," Faraci said. "This match is always a great showcase of SA and WA's best regional players and a unique opportunity for them to play on world-class Adelaide Oval on an AFL match day. While State Country football has been a tradition for male players, SANFL and WAFL are also working towards expanding the annual contest to include a game for our talented female players, possibly by 2023."

The SA Country Championships feature male and female representative teams from six regional zones – Central, Eastern, Eyre Peninsula, South East, Northern and Southern Districts. Southern Districts will be hoping to defend its 2021 crown in the men's championship, while Northern is chasing back-to-back glory after taking out its first women's title last year.

City of Whyalla Mayor Clare McLaughlin said the weekend was a major tourism boost for the region, with more than \$1 million expected to be injected into the local economy. "Our community will once again have the rare opportunity to witness elite athletes in their own city, which is made possible by our upgraded sporting facilities – the best outside metropolitan Adelaide," Mayor McLaughlin said. The outstanding Bennett Oval ground and facilities upgrade was winner of the 2021 AFL Community Facility Project of the Year.

Faraci acknowledged the continuing support of the Country Championships' naming rights partner, Think! Road Safety, for SA community football. "Without our valuable partnership with Think! Road Safety, events such as the Country Championships would not be possible," she said.

CENTRAL

oached by Todd Miles. Central will be well led and its focus will he to move the hall quickly. "We will be looking for guys like Leigh Ryswyk, Patrick White and Tyson Irlam as our on-field leaders," said Miles, who has already achieved plenty as a player in the country championships. He was voted best under-21 player in 2005 and player of the tournament in '08 and donned the SA State Country team guernsey before and after his impressive SANFL career with the Eagles and North Adelaide.

"CMS Crow and former SANFL player Ben Edwards will give us a strong target up forward and he can play as a key back as well," Miles said. "My Barossa District team-mate in the premiership years there, Darren Shillabeer, has played at this level for a long time and will also give us a presence in attack, Hamish Latchford, a classy half-back from Mintaro-Manoora, is a polished player, while Caleb Edmead will bring some X-factor as a small forward."

Elite midfielders Steve Burton and Flynn Pisani, from Barossa, Light and Gawler premier South Gawler, will be keys, while Jackson Murphy, who has played State country football and cricket, will be one of Central's under-21 players.

"We are keen to put our best foot forward this weekend and it would be nice personally to add a championship title as a coach," Miles said.

EYRE PENINSULA

Scott 'Fingers' Feltus, who clinched the title in Renmark in 2018, is coach for the fourth time. with Xavier Watson his on-field leader. United Yeelanna Eagles' Watson, a former Port Adelaide player, is a long-term servant of country footy. Key forward Syd Masters is vice-captain.

There is a strong family connection with Watson's teammates, the three Crettenden



brothers - Michael, Matthew and Stephen – who all played last year, back again for the Whyalla event. Sons of Evre Peninsula legend Milton Chandler and brothers of Melbourne-listed Kade, Harlee and Jesse also don the EP jumper. Football journeymen, now back home playing for Ports in the Eastern Eyre competition, 'Magic' (Aisera) and 'Bobby' (Aseri) Raikiwasa add to the already experienced squad.

"We have come up with a pretty reasonable squad," Feltus said in his understated way. "There is plenty of SANFL experience and also some youthful talent. We're confident we can be competitive again and for a change the travel itinerary isn't that large for this campaign. Saying that, the bus trips of previous campaigns have been wonderful for the morale of the squad."

SOUTH EAST

Robe Roosters' Jack Kelly, a former Sturt league player, is coach. And he knows what it is like to be a winner – South East last snared the title at Murray Bridge in 2017, when Kelly was player of the championships.

Interleague coaches Nick Davis, who has led Mundulla Tigers to the past two flags (KNTFL) and Ben McGregor (MSEFL) will be Kelly's assistants. Naracoorte Demons coach Matt Willson is captain,

with KNT seven-goal forward in the representative side, Bordertown's Tom Whittlesea and State country cricketer Nick McInerney, from the North Gambier Tigers, vice-captains.

"We have an exciting young midfield group and a lot of competitors," Kelly said. "Our rucks will be led by 208cm Hatherleigh Eagles big man Mark Marriott, who is from country Victoria. Fraser Bradley, from the Millicent Saints, is an electric wingman, while former North Adelaide player Pat Davies, now at Kalangadoo, and Lawrie Bradley- Brown from West Gambier are ones to keep an eye on.


"And there are full back Tom Gaden and Darcy King, an athletic lead-up marking forward, who hail from Mundulla."

NORTHERN

Matthew Promnitz is looking to take the hosts to the promised land, chasing a first SA Country Championships title after Chris Bollard lifted Northern into the final at Port Pirie in 2019.

Smooth-moving Kriston Thompson, a former North Adelaide player and State junior who has also had a successful tenure with South Augusta Bulldogs, will be a kev member of the midfield.

"We've had a strong commitment to this year's event and want to put our best foot forward." Promnitz said. "Broken Hill lad Marc Purcell,





from the South Roos, is a hard-asnails on-baller who has experience at this level. The mercurial Shayne Ballantyne, back at his home club Southern Flinders, is expected to have a role as a key forward.

"Steven Jackson, a 20-year-old talent from Weeroona Bay, was best player in the representative game between Spencer Gulf and Whyalla league on the June long weekend, racking up a massive 46 disposals. Former Barracker BLG Rookie of the Year, Gawler Central premiership and Lions flag winner Andrew Wright will give the Northern Zone plenty of run and carry."

Northern captain is long-term State country footballer Joel Palmer, a Mail Medallist when at Kadina Bloodhounds who has been at Prop-Risden Lions for the past two years, while Purcell will be his deputy.

EASTERN

Looking for a first crown since being called Murray Mallee Barrier Barossa back in 2008. Eastern will be coached by experienced Matthew Dent, who played 118 AFL games with Fitzroy, Western Bulldogs and Hawthorn. Originally from Sturt, he returned to the Double Blues and played in their drought-breaking 2002 premiership before embarking on an extensive coaching career in community and country football. This includes flags at Edwardstown in 2005, Happy Valley (2012) and for his foundation

club Border Downs Tintinara Crows in 2018 and '19. He also coached Tailem Bend and Colonel Light Gardens and now is in charge at Lameroo Hawks. This year Dent also engineered the Mallee-Riverland combined team's inaugural Association game win against Hills Country. A man not afraid to take on big tasks, Dent wants to turn Eastern Zone's fortunes around.

"I have been informed we've won one game in the past seven years. Nick Jaensch from Nairne said he has played in two Zone wins across 15 games at this level," Dent mused. "We are looking to make some inroads here. We have a good contingent from the Riverland and a couple from the Mallee who I reckon can step up to the level.

"Midfielders Tim Woolford, from Renmark, and Troy Parker-Boers, from Hahndorf – a Team of the Championships selection last year - will be our on-field leaders.

"Alex Pfeiffer, from Murray Bridge Ramblers, was one of the best players in the interleague game in June and we're looking for big things from him in defence, Sam DeMichelle from Imperials is a classy small forward who can excite the crowd and kick freakish goals."

SOUTHERN

The reigning champion, a longtime force having won the Country Championships eight times across the past two decades, will be coached by dual Flagstaff Hill

Falcons premiership mentor Russell Veenvliet, Former State Country player and journeyman Scott Wendleborn, who is coaching Encounter Bay, will be his assistant this year, as they have swapped positions.

"Our strength will be a depth of midfield options and our pace across the ground," said Southern Districts chairman of selectors Garv Summerton, "We have a number of big grounds in our zone, so there is not much concern about the big ovals in Whyalla. We will work on getting enough targets in attack and big men for the contest."

Expected to be among the leadership group again is Falcon and one time Adelaide Crows topup player Sam Tharaldsen, along with Brett Ellis from McLaren.

Crows-listed key forward Bailey Marshman and on-baller Cameron Hutchens, the medallist for Great Southern in the annual representative game, are key players. Former Port and South Adelaide player Anthony Biemans, who won Southern League's medal in this year's Barry Pilmore Cup game against GSFL, has also put his hand up to play. Langhorne Creek's Troy Blackwell also has impressed at interleague level and will be one to watch. Victor Harbor. midfielder Jessie McKinnon, son of West Adelaide 1983 premiership player Robbie, was impressive in the same contest.

NORTHERN

he reigning champion will again have a significant Broken Hill contingent and again have Phil Neal, title-winning co-coach from last year - with Anthony Tidball – at the helm as co-coach. Neal, who has been involved with the Northern zone at country championships since the women's program started, will this year be joined in the coaching role by Jake Peters, who is mentor of South Broken Hill's women's side.

"Our runner for the championships will be Central Magpies coach Ethan Kimble and Jan Corev is team manager." Neal said, "There are a couple of girls from the Spencer Gulf area who played last year but the majority of the squad is from the Broken Hill competition. We're confident we are moulding a strong group to compete strongly. We have a solid and settled backline and our midfield group has plenty of pace and footy smarts."

Experienced pair Abby Stevens and Rebecca Deer have been honoured as co-captains. Tamika Cox and Tamika Reid are key personnel from SA, while teenage Indigenous talent Katelyn Whyman has been a late call-up. She has been travelling from Wilcannia to play for South Broken Hill and is a lively goalkicking small forward.

"Paige Cuy, Paris Ralph, Shebly Raven, Makayla Berg, Abbey Stevens and Phobe Knell have been involved all four years of the Northern women's team," Neal said. "Ashleigh Anderson, Penny Billings and Sophie Palmer also enjoyed the success last year at Victor Harbor."

CENTRAL

Shaun Ribbons, Central District's inaugural SANFL women's coach, is in charge of Central zone. "I have been able to connect back with some girls I coached at Central," said Ribbons, who was a part of a Central zone men's title in the Riverland in 2006. "I'm enjoying the challenge and am having fun. We



are going with no expectations but equally we arrive with an intent to win. I'm keen to play fast, flow-on football and have a crack."

Aishia Thomas, who played SANFLW on a wing at 16 in the first vear of the Central District women's program, will captain the Central zone side in Whyalla. Her sister, running defender Abbie Thomas, has recovered from an ACL injury and is back for her first season with South Gawler Lions. They are daughters of Central District 1980s defender Jamie Thomas.

Zoe Perry, now playing at Angle Vale, has also had league experience under Ribbons at Central District. Noted for her pace, she will be among the on-ball rotations. Shalie O'Brien from Barossa District. the sibling of former Central District league player Jordy O'Brien, will play as an athletic medium defender and has been selected as vice-captain.

Glenelg development team members Kayla Mudge, Erica Rowe and Jess Hill, who are playing at Gawler Central, will be part of the squad. Willaston ruck Nakita Mcrostie, in the development league with Woodville-West Torrens, Light forward Halle Butcher, back from a knee reconstruction, and Jasmine Elsworthy, a half-back from

Snowtown, are worth keeping an eve on.

EASTERN

Patrick Sim takes charge of Eastern for the third time, after being the inaugural women's coach in 2018 at Renmark. In the first tournament Sim led Eastern to a grand final win over Southern to raise the cup.

Sim, in his second year as Uraidla coach in the Hills Football League, enjoyed being North Adelaide forward line coach alongside Krissie Steen for the Roosters' SANFL Women's premiership this year.

"Among our key senior players is Mount Barker talent Brianna Burt. who will be one of the midfield rotations," Sim said. "From Onkaparinga Bulldogs, Annabelle Prowse, a sibling of Sturt and Crows-drafted ruck Zoe, who was best-afield in the SANFLW grand final, is in line for a role in ruck.

"Beth Prestwood, from Mt Lofty Demons, is a hybrid ruck-forward type who should impact. From up in the Riverland we had Amy Shapeley from the Berri Demons, who will add tenacity and footy smarts. She is a West Adelaide junior who is progressing in the game. Goalkicking ace Brienna Medder has been excelling for Blackwood and



performed strongly for the Hills in the women's interleague game, finishing with a bag of seven goals.

"I believe we have brought a strong mix to the carnival but it is about what happens over this weekend."

SOUTHERN

Wade Phillips, who led the Great Southern league to victory in the women's game at the Interleague day on Bice Oval in early June, is in charge at Southern. The reigning premiership coach at Willunga, he started at Yankalilla in 2020 and now is in his second year at the Demons.

Ruck Rachel Searle, from Goolwa-Port Elliot Football Club. is Southern Districts skipper, while Christies Beach midfielder Mel Koster is her deputy.

"We have looked to bring together a side with plenty of skill and speed," Phillips said. "The reigning medallists in each league, Katrice Turner from Willunga and Maddison Bennett from Reynella, will be key players for us. Another Wineflies footballer, Grace Doran, who can play a variety of roles, and pacy half-back Phillipa Worthley from Port Noarlunga are also exciting young talents.

"Tess Huxtable, still just 19, who has played a little league footy at South, is a young ruck who competes well, while Kalani Bates is a lightning-quick midfielder-winger."

Mount Compass talent Amy Vitkunas, who comes from a netball background, will add midfield pace and an "in-and-under" work ethic.

SOUTH EAST

Mundulla sports legend Michael Hunt will be in charge of the South East women's squad again this year. Hunt is a 10-time A-grade premiership footballer with the Tigers as well as a strong country cricketer and one of SA's great rural characters.

The South East squad incorporates the Limestone Coast Women's competition that stretches from Millicent and Kongorong, to the Mundulla Tigers in the north and Casterton across the border in Victoria. Hunt is in his second year as coach of the South East side, which played in the grand final against Northern last year.

"Utility Scarlett Jarrad from Casterton will be our skipper with Tess Andrews, a midfielder from South, and Kybybolite's Annabel Mould as her deputies." Hunt said.

"We have 13 players who experienced Country Championships footy at Victor last year. We may be a little shorter this year but what we would have lost in height, we should have covered with extra speed. We ran into a very strong Northern side in the final but it was a good experience."

Alice Tentye, a teenage small forward, has been high in goalkicking lists across the past couple of seasons. Kybybolite premiership player Ella Jones is a running half-back with an excellent attack on the ball and strong game awareness. Penola Eagles talent Caroline McGrath won this year's Association Medal for the Limestone Coast competition, after a number of years away from the district. Casterton Sandford's Sophie Arkun is a young talent who is expected to develop quickly.

EYRE PENINSULA

Brett Howell continues as coach for a third year, with Alex Mason, who has played SANFLW football for West Adelaide, as captain. Waybacks pair Vic Gregory and Abby Curbow will be deputies.

Across the breadth of the expansive West Coast there is just one women's competition. "They ran a six-week 14-a-side women's competition this year in Port Lincoln," Howell said. "There were also two exhibition games, the first before the West-Norwood SANFL league game in April and a match on the Saturday morning of the Mortlock Shield in June.

"Each of the five clubs in Port Lincoln had players selected in the final EP side. A couple of exciting teenagers are Elsie Maddern from Boston and Billie Thompson from Marble Range Football Club. Elsie is a skilful half-back/midfielder who has played junior boys football for United Yeelanna Eagles. Billie has strong sporting genes in her family and both are also very talented nethallers."

Kendall Howell, who has been on Glenelg's SANFLW list, will add much-needed experience to the young squad.

THE GRASS IS ALWAYS GREENER

hvalla's Bennett Oval will look a million dollars when North Adelaide faces Adelaide in a big-stakes SANFL twilight clash as part of the SA Country Football Championships. And Memorial Oval's playing surface will also be a sight for sore eyes as these grounds host the cream of the crop among men's and women's country talent.

There's been quite a transformation at these ovals over the past three years, bringing conditions to tip-top shape for this weekend's footy bonanza.

Whyalla City Council in June 2019 committed to improving the surfaces at Bennett and Memorial Ovals and to the creation of a new turf cricket pitch square at Bennett Oval for the benefit of locals and to attract regional, State and national sporting fixtures.

That the grounds now bring visions of always-pristine Adelaide Oval should come as little surprise considering the Oval's legendary former curator Les Burdett and SACA grounds manager Trent Kelly were on the team who brought Whyalla Council's vision to life. The Council sought advice from the SANFL and SACA, leading to the appointment of Kelly, Burdett, Daryl Sellar from Living Turf and Cameron Irrigation Consulting to develop a management plan and timeline for the projects. And there was no time to lose, with Bennett Oval needing to be primed for a pre-season AFL clash between Adelaide and Port Adelaide in March 2020.

Some of the key items identified for the ovals after initial inspections in 2019 were:

THE NEED TO REMOVE weeds and undesirable grasses, relieve soil compaction, correct surface levels and promotie kikuyu.

SOIL and irrigation water analysis to assist development a turf management program.

REPLACE irrigation systems to improve efficiency of water use and uniformity of coverage.





REVIEW existing machinery to ensure sustainable future management.

DELAY cricket pitch construction at Bennett Oval until after AFL preseason.

While the RainBird irrigation system was being installed in spring of 2019, the turf program was being implemented to accelerate the promotion of the kikuyu, which was going to be critical in particular for Bennett Oval to be suitable for the AFL game.

The turf program accelerated when the irrigation systems were completed and watering could recommence over summer. This allowed the surfaces to be aerated and more than 300 tonnes of sand to be applied to improve surface levels, with fertiliser and amendments promoting strong kikuyu growth without competition from other grasses and weeds. With more drought and heat tolerant grass and vastly-improved irrigation to all parts of the ovals,

the warm summer months could be used effectively to improve the density of grass coverage. This was necessary in preparation for the Country Showdown but also to provide a strong base for local footy for the 2020 season.

The AFL clash was a big success, with great reviews from all stakeholders, but there was still no respite – it was time to construct Bennett Oval's cricket pitch square.

When planning the redevelopment of the ovals' surfaces, it was clear the long-term success of the project hinged on the Council team embracing change some minor, some significant. Regular workshops were held and phone calls exchanged for help and support but it would mean little if it wasn't for the attitude of the Council team to take on the new challenge – the efforts of Les Hosking, Peter Farrer, Gordon Conlin, Damien Allens and Kane Boss have been nothing short of outstanding.

TORRENS UNIVERSITY U18 WRAP

A standout display from classy Sturt midfielder Nick Sadler was a major catalyst in the Blues' 34-point Round 13 Under-18 Torrens University Cup win against the Eagles at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval.

A member of the Torrens University SA Under-18 team's leadership group, Sadler tuned up nicely for the Croweaters' next contest against Victoria Metro this Sunday by collecting a game-high 35 disposals while also booting two goals. Team-mates Will Torode and Blake Fidge were also rated highly by Sturt's coaches, while key forward Chad Reschke bagged five goals. The Eagles were spurred on by solid performances from Brody Mair, Nathan Barkla and Jordan Tilbrook but it wasn't enough to close a three-goal deficit at the final change.

Norwood produced a stirring second-half revival to seal an invaluable 36-point win against ladderleading North Adelaide at Prospect Oval.

Trailing by 19 points at half-time, the Redlegs slammed on 9.10 to 1.3 en route to inflicting the Roosters' second loss of the season. Logan Evans (28 disposals), Josh Bradford (25) and Tyson Walls (24 disposals, two goals) were key drivers as tall forward Phoenix Foster kicked three goals. North ball magnet Billy Dowling racked up a game-high 30 disposals, while Crows Next Generation prospect Isaac Keeler booted three goals to go with 22 disposals and seven marks.

Glenelg clicked into gear in the second half to produce a comfortable 42-point win against South Adelaide at ACH Group Stadium.

Nestled nicely in the competition's top two, the Bays turned a 10-point half-time deficit into a 21-point lead



at the final change by booting 6.3 to the Panthers' 1.2 in the third term. Bodie Ryan, Will Trevena and Kynan Dunn played key roles in the Tigers' turnaround. South officials lauded Myles Amos, Will Verrall and Jack Delean (18 disposals, two goals) for showing spirit under heavy pressure.

West Adelaide kept its faint finals chances alive with a massive 129-point win against Central District at X Convenience Oval.

The Bloods led by 98 points at the main change after slamming on 16.2 while holding the Bulldogs scoreless for a half. Exciting tall forward Harry Lemmey booted a game-high six goals to go with 18 disposals and 10 marks in a best-afield display as team-mates Adam Bunworth (23 disposals, three goals) and Lukas Zvaigzne (five goals) also had huge impacts. Trent Tattoli performed strongly for Central with 35 disposals.
