REVELLING IN THE PRESSURE

Not much ruffles Casey Voss's feathers.

Opposition forwards, draft day washouts, the pressures of following in the formidable footsteps of his famous footballing father ... the gun Sturt backman takes it all in his stride.

But there was that one nerve-racking time in 2006 when Casey faced his toughest challenge, presenting in front of a huge venue of luminaries and thousands more watching on television on Brownlow Medal night. To commemorate the 10-year anniversary of Michael Voss and James Hird's 1996 Brownlow tie, their suited-up sons – six-year-old Casey Voss and five-year-old Thomas Hird – were summoned front-and-centre at Melbourne's Crown Palladium for a public speaking cameo.

"We got up on stage and had to say a few things in front of 1000 people, which isn't something I loved doing at that age," Casey, now 21, recalled with a laugh. "I was definitely very nervous. I don't remember the night particularly well but I've seen videos of it."

Similarly, memories are thin but Youtube clicks numerous when it comes to the son-of-a-gun's awareness of dad Michael's legendary playing feats. "I was very young and don't remember much from dad's career but I've watched plenty of footage of his games over the years," said Casey, who was days shy of turning six when Michael, who captained the Brisbane Lions' 2001-03 premiership hat-trick, played the

last of his 289 AFL games. "He's been a huge help and has always encouraged me to do all the extra little things to better myself."

As for any additional baggage associated with carrying the illustrious Voss name, Casey has never felt the pinch. "I didn't feel too much pressure at all," he said. "Growing up in Brisbane probably helped, as footy wasn't spoken about as much."

Occasional setbacks – and there haven't been many – have equally been taken in their stride. A dearth of rookie spots effectively denied Casey his dream of donning the Lions' maroon, gold and blue as a father-son pick back in November 2018. An even bigger surprise, at least from the outside, came when Casey's name wasn't among those called out in this year's mid-season draft. Sturt's 2021 club champion and recipient of the Fos Williams Medal as SA's best in the Croweaters' win over WA in May, Casey endured a rare quiet outing against Woodville-West Torrens in the lead-up to draft day, kept to 14 disposals. "That was just one of those days when the ball didn't bounce my way," he said. "I never put too much pressure on myself when it comes to footy. I went to training that Wednesday night not expecting my name to get called out." His AFL ambition remains well and truly alive, though. "I've still got aspirations to play at that level but right now I'm enjoying work and playing for Sturt," said Casey, who is an engineering consultant. "I'm pretty comfortable with how life is going but it's still a dream of mine."



Casey moved to SA when Michael became Port Adelaide's midfield coach ahead of the 2015 season, spending one season with Glenelg's under-16s before the family moved closer to Unley Oval. After beginning his footballing journey as a midfield bull, like his old man, Casey has starred since switching to defence. His attacking rebounding and expert intercepting – he leads the SANFL in marks – are his calling cards.

"I started in the midfield but I would definitely say my preferred position now is across that half-back flank," Casey said. "(Coach) Marty (Mattner) is very easy to approach and talk to and has given me the confidence and licence to play my way."

"We started the season quite strongly then had that mid-season slump but we've got back to having a bit of fun, getting around each other and everyone playing their role."

HOME AWAY FROM HOME PORT V CENTRAL

Port Adelaide is on the move – facing Central District in a “home” game at Woodville Oval – but there are no dramas like there were when the Magpies left Alberton Oval in the mid 1970s.

Port's last two home clashes this season have been relocated due to construction work at Alberton Oval. With new coaches' boxes and media and broadcast facilities being built, the SANFL side's Round 15 match against West Adelaide was switched to Richmond. But this week's clash against Central District has been moved from Alberton to a neutral location, Woodville Oval. The unusual venue for a Port-Central clash brings back memories of the time the Magpies played Glenelg at – wait for it – Elizabeth Oval. It was the opening round of the 1971 season and the sides were unable to face-off on Adelaide Oval because baseball's Claxton Shield was being held there.

Adelaide Oval became Port Adelaide's home in 1975-76 when the Magpies were unceremoniously kicked out of Alberton Oval because of a dispute with the local council

over seating arrangements in the Bob Quinn Stand. On the eve of the '75 season a group of 2000 angry supporters marched on Port Adelaide City Council's Town Hall in a vocal protest. The dispute had ended by 1977, Port was back home and promptly won SANFL's centenary flag.

Central was forced to find a home away from home in its debut season in 1964. The Bulldogs' new grandstand was not ready until Round 12 – when they faced Glenelg in their home debut. The side that failed to win a game in its first season was further disadvantaged by playing a long run of away games to kick off its time in league footy. And in Round 10 Central played South Adelaide at the unexpected location of Richmond Oval. Westies' home ground was also a surprise venue for South-Sturt clashes in 1974 and 1993.

The novel Port-Central clash is one both sides will be desperate to win. The Magpies have lost their past five games and will want to make Woodville seem like “home sweet home” with an overdue win. And the Bulldogs, unlucky not to snatch a hat-trick of wins when

they agonisingly fell four points short against Sturt, will be keen to show just how much progress they are making. It's a much-anticipated clash on the weekend of some critical match-ups.

NORWOOD V ADELAIDE

What a match-up! And what a premiership table. To say it's tight at the top is a massive understatement. It's hard to remember a SANFL season when there's been so little between the sides still in the fight for the flag. Back-to-back premiers, the Eagles, are out of the five right now – but who would dare discount them from having a shot at a historic hat-trick? One game between top and fifth at this time of year is crazy. This clash sure looks like a beauty. Top-side Adelaide against fourth-placed Norwood, which is just one win behind the Crows. It's the No. 1 attacking side in the comp against the No. 1 defensive team. High-scoring Adelaide, which averages 96 points a game to be well out in front of anyone else, won't find it as easy against the miserly Legs, who concede just 65 points a game and play with high-intensity pressure

and tackling all over the ground. And both have ruckmen who have kept hitting the heights this year, Harry Boyd and Kieran Strachan averaging a touch over 35 hit-outs a game and continually setting their sides in motion.

WEST V GLENELG

What a feeling! There could be nothing like it. A win after a 441-day drought. After 26 successive losses, 13 to end last season, another 13 to start this season. It was the equal third-longest SANFL drought, so it's little wonder the Bloods were celebrating singing 'We're a Happy Team at Westies' after beating Port by 27 points. There were plenty of SANFL fans of other sides pleased for the Bloods, although not quite to the extent of opposition clubs at other grounds giving a rousing 'Three Cheers' for Glenelg in 1925 when it ended its record 56-game losing run. "The players deserved that win ... everyone did their bit," Bloods boss Brad Gotch declared, having watched proceedings from the boundary rather than the coaches' box for the first time in his 27 years as a coach. Tigers boss Brett Hand challenged his men

ahead of last week's big clash against the Eagles and he, too, got the response he wanted as last year's runners-up kept the premiers goalless in an outstanding first half on the way to a convincing 25-point win. Not anything like in the 'drought' category, successive big losses against the Crows and Panthers had raised some concerns. They were answered emphatically.


STURT V SOUTH

Close games make such a huge difference to a season. And they're pretty tough on the coaches. South's Jarrad Wright and Sturt's Marty Mattner had tough afternoons with nail-biting finishes last week. But it was much tougher on Wright, because his Panthers lost – by three points to fast-finishing Norwood. It's been an all-too-familiar story for Wright over the past six games because they've lost three by less than a goal. The Blues, on the other hand, held on for a courageous four-point win against the barnstorming Bulldogs at Elizabeth. A win to South and loss to Sturt would have left the Panthers just a win behind the Blues. Instead, they are three wins from fifth, finals looking unlikely.

In such an even competition, it's the small things that count, including winning margins. And Wright has had to endure nine games that have been decided by less than two goals – for four wins and five losses. He will have been shattered his men let late leads evaporate against Central and Norwood and will know any further slip-ups will be fatal. The Blues, though, have their fate in their own hands, buoyed by three wins in a row against West, the Crows and the Dogs, and set to regain strength with Tom Lewis (ruptured spleen) to resume late in the minor round.

NORTH V EAGLES

Jade Sheedy always looks so calm and collected but surely he must be feeling the pinch, at least a little, as the Eagles crashed and burned against Glenelg and slipped a game outside the top five. Seemingly too much of a nice guy to make a successful coach, Sheeds and 2002 Sturt premiership team-mate Martin Mattner made amazing starts to their SANFL coaching careers by taking their sides to back-to-back flags in their first two seasons. Last year Sheedy had to overcome pretty much an overhaul to his side that stormed to the flag with 13 wins from its last 15 games and this year player losses and injuries have hurt. But now, it's just about crunch time and, after failing to kick a goal in the first half against the Tigers, Sheedy lamented, "We didn't play our Eagles brand, which is unsociable and contested, and we have to get back to that." It won't be easy against a Roosters outfit suddenly under the pump as well. Two rounds ago Jacob Surjan's North moved a game clear at the top of the table with a 10-2 record but successive losses against Norwood and Adelaide have put it in a six-way fight for finals spots. It's a huge clash for two proud clubs and two proud coaches.

South East grabbed the glory with a nail-biting one-point win against Central in the men's grand final of the SA Country Championships on Sunday at Bennett Oval in Whyalla.

Despite the River Murray Football League shifting to Eastern since last year's carnival, the boys from the Limestone Coast earned their fourth title, adding to victories in 2014, 2016 and '17 as Murray South East.

South East had six players selected in the Team of the Championships, including former South Adelaide and Eagles forward Tom Whittlesea and captain Matt Willson, who also earned the Don McSweeney Medal as player of the championships.

Victorious South East mentor Jack Kelly was awarded the Bill Murdoch Medal as coach of the championships. Pacy Southern Districts rover Luke Mitton was adjudged best under-21 player, while former Port Magpies defender Sid Masters proved he can play at either end after winning the leading goalkicker trophy with nine majors for Eyre Peninsula. Hudson Noack was selected as Umpire of the Championships for the second year in a row.

Southern Districts surged to its second SA Women's Country Championships crown with a comfortable 21-point win against South East in the grand final at Bennett Oval in Whyalla.

Adding to their inaugural title in 2019, the Navy Blues went through the tournament undefeated after winning their qualifying matches against Eyre Peninsula and Northern. Southern Districts had seven players selected in the Team of the Championships, including Glenelg wing Madison Bennett, who won the prestigious Player of the Championships award. Southern Districts coaches Wade Phillips and Mark Rix shared the coach of the championships mantle after guiding their team to victory while the Navy Blues' Tamara Page was leading goalkicker with four, including two in the title decider. Promising young Central ruck Nikita McRostie sealed her stunning carnival with selection

A LIFE IN FOOTY

Glenelg and Port Adelaide footy clubs haven't always seen eye to eye, so what sort of person would you have to be to be remembered as a great at both clubs?

The answer would be: John Robinson.

A humble, highly-respected man with an extensive SANFL history on the field and off, the league life member died on July 2. He was 87.

He is officially a Great of Glenelg, one of just 18. He also is in Port Adelaide's Hall of Fame, a premiership player during the Magpies' run of six successive flags in the 1950s.

He incredibly played in premierships in each of the four grades – including two at league level – in the space of six years at Alberton. He captained Port's junior colts premiership side in 1951, added a senior colts flag in '52, played in the back pocket in league grand final wins against West in 1954 and Norwood in '55 and in 1956 played in the Magpies' seconds grand final win.

Robinson, who played 42 league games with Port, was tallish for his era at 183cm but was wiry, weighing just 65kg to be one of the lightest men in SA footy. It was his pace and rebound that made him a formidable back pocket. In the days before interchange players he would stand the 'resting' rovers and use his height against them to win the ball and explosive speed to dash clear.

Robinson's association at Glenelg, which started when he moved into the area, was over a remarkable 65 years. He played 46 league games for the Tigers between 1957-59 but Glenelg wasn't the club it is today. "There were no social facilities, one little grandstand and we never had much success," he said. And it was a different game back then, as Robinson showed with this story: "I'd just got married and hurt my ankle (again). Legendary head trainer Reg Hoggood went to work on me – on his dining room table. 'I



can fix you.' He goes out into the garden and comes back with cauliflower leaves, crushes them up, pours Penetrene, made this poultice, stinks like hell. 'Leave that there until you go to work tomorrow.' I had been married for a week... 'you're not coming in here with that on!'"

Robinson was determined to give the players support he felt was lacking in the late '50s when a couple of Tigers committeemen "tried to run things too much" but they didn't always have the club's best interests at heart. It was the polar opposite of Robinson's six decades at the Bay. He knew strength off the field would help bring success on it and set about achieving the goal. He coached Glenelg's junior colts to a rare flag in 1960, then was senior colts coach in 1961-62. By 1967, under Neil Kerley, the other Great of Glenelg to have passed in a sad past month, he

was a selector. Incredibly, he was a selector – he also rose to chairman of selectors – for at least some time in each of the 1960s, '70s, '80s and '90s. He was a committeeman from 1975-95, chairman for nine seasons from 1987-95, recruiter for many years and a member of the Hall of Fame selection committee from its inception in 2001 until this year.

Another Great of Glenelg, club president Peter Carey, said: "John made an enormous contribution to Glenelg Football Club over 65 years ... I would be hard pressed to name anyone who has done more for our club in such a variety of roles." Robinson also had plenty of SANFL roles, as a director and club delegate and member of the SANFL Football Development Foundation from 1995-2005. And he served on the SA School Football Association executive for a decade.

Robinson's was a life in footy well lived.

TORRENS UNIVERSITY U18 WRAP

West Adelaide kept its Under-18 Torrens University Cup finals chances alive with an upset 24-point win against North Adelaide at Hisense Stadium.

The Bloods burst out of the blocks with an eight-goal opening term and, from there, were never seriously threatened en route to defeating the ladder-leading Roosters. West midfielder Tyson Coe was instrumental in the crucial victory, collecting 37 disposals and booting three goals, along with key forward Tom Scully. North's James White tried valiantly to haul his side back into the game with 30 disposals and two goals, while Hughen Wissman (28 disposals) and Oliver Dignan (three goals) provided solid support.

Woodville-West Torrens overcame a scoreless opening term to cause a 24-point boilover against Glenelg at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval.

The Eagles also endured a goalless third term on a wild, windy day, yet managed to make the most of the Tigers' scoring inaccuracy to record their fourth win of the season. Jordan Tilbrook (22

disposals), Sebastian Menta (14) and Elex Day (25) drew high praise from the Eagles' coaching staff. James McIntyre, Tom Corcoran and Noah Sims (20 disposals) were the Tigers' better performers.

Sturt withstood a strong second-quarter challenge from Central District to bank a 37-point win at Wigan Oval.

Leading comfortably by 22 points at the first change, the Blues saw their advantage whittled down to just nine points at the main break as the Bulldogs piled on five majors for the term. But with Declan Gladigau (17 disposals, three goals), Tom McCourt (22 disposals) and Luca Slade (27) performing strongly, Sturt responded with a seven-goal second half. Liam Fawcett booted 4.2 in an outstanding effort for Central, while Will McCabe, coming off a consistent campaign which earned him MVP for the Torrens University SA under-16 team, kicked three goals.

A barnstorming 10-goal second half provided Norwood with valuable percentage in a 62-point win against South Adelaide at The

Leading by a commanding 41 points at half-time, the Redlegs accelerated to pile on a further 10.3 to the Panthers' 6.6 as they went a long way towards securing a top-four berth. Noah Hyde (28 disposals, two goals), Taj Rahui (16 disposals, four goals) and Alex Van Wyk (16 disposals, seven clearances) were major influences in the result. South's Blake Rodrigues, Jye Bottroff and Jack Delean (two goals) provided resistance but couldn't prevent the Panthers' 10th loss of the season.

TIME AFTER TIME



There have surely been too many magic moments over 145 years of SANFL history to recall them in one place. Or have there?

A stunning timeline at the SANFL exhibition *Our Footy, Our People, Our Stories* in the South Australian State Library highlights the notable events in SA footy from the inauguration of the SA Football Association in 1877 until the present day.

Footy fans in 2017 spent plenty of their own time poring over the original timeline compiled by football researcher and historian Trevor Gyss in the *In a League of its Own* presentation at the Library. It's

been updated and upgraded.

Gyss' singular frame at the exhibition is a five metre by one metre wall at the State Library. The colour scheme reflects the official SANFL colours used since 1930, while the timeline features each premier club's colours from 1877 to 2021.

The information is presented in three categories. The central category is for the SAFA/SANFL administered competition. Around this are significant events for the participating clubs and the edges contain notable individual contributions.

A number of significant themes run within the three categories.

For SAFA/SANFL all participating clubs over time are identified, as are the venues for matches and events about interstate matches.

Club themes identify the first premiership for every club, changes made to clubs' home grounds and dominant club eras.

Individual themes identify Magarey Medallists, club best-and-fairest winners, leading goalkickers, coaches and administrators.

The timeline also celebrates and identifies the contribution and achievements of its Aboriginal/First Nation participants.

The exhibition runs until October 16. Find time.


