# BLOODS BACKMAN ON SONG

At long last, after 441 barren days and 26 consecutive losses, it was time to celebrate.

When West Adelaide ended its long drought by beating Port Adelaide three weeks ago, a hearty rendition of the team song was in order, followed by some well-deserved revelry into the night at Milner Road.

There was one conspicuous absentee. Kaiden Brand, one of West's best in the 27-point victory with another stellar display at full back, was sitting in the trainers' room next door concussed during the song before being escorted to Ashford Hospital to have his gashed head stapled.

"I was hit in the head on the way down with an innocuous knee running past and from then on, I was pretty dazed," he recalled of the incident that occurred 10 minutes before the full-time siren. "Because the back of my head was split open and I was fairly out of it, I was in the next room while they sang the song, then had to go straight to hospital to get staples put in my head and do all the concussion testing. It was a great day for the club and I was so rapt we got that first win but it was disappointing I wasn't able to celebrate with the boys."

A dearth of wins in 2022 aside, Brand is enjoying being back at Westies after a nine-year absence. "There's a lot of different people here but it still has the same home feel for me," the 27-year-old said. "Although we haven't had the success on the field, it's certainly a great place to be off the field."

A Bloods junior from the club's Riverland zone and an Adelaide Crows supporter as a kid, Berri-born Brand was selected by Hawthorn with the 66th pick in the 2012 national draft. A combination of persistent injuries, including having both shoulders reconstructed, and the powerhouse Hawks' awesome strength – they

completed a 2013-15 AFL premiership three-peat in his first years at the club – meant Brand didn't make his senior debut until 2016. The 198cm key backman eventually played 43 AFL games for Hawthorn, then another five with Sydney.

"It was a very hard team to break into when I got there – a lot of guys from those years will be Hall of Famers," Brand said. "There were a plethora of key defenders around at that time, which didn't make it easy for me to get a game. I also had a few injuries, so I had to bide my time. I certainly felt I had to earn it."

Brand's defensive prowess came to the fore in State colours in May when his courageous mark running back with the flight of the ball secured SA's thrilling four-point win over WA at Optus Stadium.

"That was a great experience, getting to play with the best players in the State," said Brand, who works as a disability mentor. "It was good to meet a lot of those guys you play

against each week. That was my first win for the year, so it was great to soak that up and enjoy it with the boys afterwards."

Brand, who is contracted until the end of 2023, hopes West can jag at least one more victory down the home stretch, maybe this afternoon against South Adelaide, allowing him the opportunity to sing that elusive team song. If there was one silver lining from his injury against Port, it was that Brand avoided the dreaded inner-circle "Powerade shower", a ritual for first-time SANFL winners. "I think I escaped the circle ... I'll count it as a de facto circle and I'll be joining the outside," he laughed.

"We're not getting blown out in too many games recently and we're building towards something. We know it's not going to be right now but if we keep focusing, keep the group together and keep everyone in the same direction, then it shouldn't be too far away."

# MATCH PREVIEWS

## CENTRAL V NORWOOD

The Legs are pumping. The excitement is building at The Parade at the same rate as the mounting wins, now up to six in a row – and eight of the past nine. Norwood is within a win of top spot and, although there won't be any talk just yet from the club about premiership hopes, you can hear a murmur from outside it. Long-time SANFL scribe Warren Portland declared "Norwood deserves to be tagged premiership favourite" after the Legs beat Adelaide – which had been on top of the table – by 12 points. "Don't be deceived by the margin, the Redlegs dominated much of the contest," he wrote in the Sunday Mail. Coach Jade Rawlings was pleased his Legs were shifting from an "almost team" to one that can overcome the barriers in front of it and win the tough clashes, after losing games by 15 points, two points and six points in the first six rounds. Strong defence is what premiership teams are built around these days and Norwood is conceding just 64 points per game, the best in the league. The Crows had been averaging 96 points a game before the Legs kept them to just 53. There will be plenty more ground to defend at Elizabeth and Norwood won't want to be looking any further ahead than this clash with Central, because the Bulldogs are also one of the most improved sides over the past couple of months. After winning just one of their first nine games they have won three of the past six and were universally proclaimed "unlucky" in a four-point loss against Sturt. Can Paul Thomas' men follow the Legs' lead and start winning those close ones?

## WEST V SOUTH

What a difference a close win makes. South coach Jarrad Wright lamented the Panthers' inability to seal games in tight finishes when his men suffered an agonising three-point loss to Norwood – their

third defeat by less than a goal in six games. But by escaping with a six-point win against Sturt at Unley, South has suddenly revived its flagging finals hopes. With Mitch O'Neill and Hayden Sampson causing havoc on the inside and outside and Joseph Haines as always mopping up from the back, the Panthers showed they are not about to give up on a third successive finals appearance, throwing into jeopardy the Blues' major-round credentials. Wright was relieved the win "keeps the heart pumping" but South supporters probably feel they've had enough heart-stopping games for one season. While the low scoring of defence-minded modern-day footy means close games are much more prevalent, South has had 10 games decided by less than two goals this year, for five wins and five losses. One win can make everything look completely different and that was the case for Westies when they broke through after 26 losses on

the trot to beat Port. Coach Brad Gotch didn't want his side to be a "one-week team", looking for consistency across four quarters week-to-week and the Bloods threw everything at flag hope Glenelg, within a kick in time-on of the last quarter. Gotch believed the intensity and effort of the players was another step in the right direction. Seeing how much the nine-point loss hurt was another good sign. As it was for the Panthers, if you can learn from the close losses, it might be different next time. And, if you're a South fan, you just know it will be close.

## GLENELG V NORTH

It's crunch time at the top of the table. And let's hope the clash of these great rivals of the 1980s is just as good as their other battle this season. North commemorated its century of footy on Prospect Oval against Glenelg in Round 6 – 100 years to the day these sides clashed there for the first time – but Rooster celebrations had to

wait until the 26-minute-mark of the last quarter. It was only then Aaron Young snapped the decider in another close encounter of the heart-stopping kind. The Bays had done just about everything in their power to wreck North's celebrations, leading by 27 points in the second quarter. It took a free kick – one of those Collingwood's Jack Ginnivan doesn't get any more – to decide it as the Roosters kicked the last 2.3 of the game. Now they are locked together at the top of the table with 11-4 records with both coaches hoping their side has turned the corner after back-to-back losses.

North overcame the loss through injuries of Lachlan Grubb and Kym LeBois before half-time and crunched the Eagles by 48 points, skipper Cameron Craig showing the way with 24 disposals while, more importantly, restricting SANFL's leading goalkicker Daniel Menzel to just one kick (and one goal). And Glenelg backed up a strong win against the Eagles by beating West

by nine points. With premiership stars Luke Partington and Andrew Bradley sidelined, Corey Lyons stepped up the midfield with 15 kicks, 15 handballs and nine clearances and if he continues with that sport of form, the loss of Brett Turner in the mid-season draft won't be so strongly felt.

#### STURT V PORT

The Blues felt they let a golden opportunity slip with their narrow home loss to South. Instead of being two games clear in the top five they are just one ahead of the Eagles, with the Panthers now back in it only one game further back. Marty Mattner's men will know they finish the minor round with tough match-ups against the Eagles and North, so they will need to be right on the ball against the Magpies. When they clashed at Alberton in Round 4 the Blues had to kick the last four goals to get over the line by 13 points. And it will be tough again at Unley after Port ended a run of five losses by beating Central

by 23 points last up, coach Matt Lokan pleased to have "a good spread of players play well". Tough on-baller Sam Mayes inspired his troops as he kept up his season average of a touch under 30 disposals a game, while injury-hit Power forward Orazio Fantasia made a welcome return with three goals.

#### EAGLES V ADELAIDE

When you face an AFL team you never quite know what you're going to be up against. And the Eagles didn't know what hit them when they tackled the Crows in Round 7. Big Reilly O'Brien amassed 37 disposals, 11 marks, 42 hit-outs and 13 clearances, Matt Crouch picked up 35 touches and seven clearances and, with Harry Schoenberg chipping in with 29 disposals, it doesn't seem much of a surprise Adelaide romped it in by 33 points. That has been O'Brien's only SANFL game of the season but Eagles fans will be wary of who runs out for the Crows in this week's crucial clash. Whoever is playing for Adelaide, there can be no more hiccups for the Eagles if they are to stay in the hunt for a premiership hat-trick. Three losses in the past four games leave them a game out of the five and they were swamped by 48 points by North in their most recent clash, coach Jade Sheedy admitting, "we're a long way off finals footy". Injuries to Joseph Sinor and Troy Menzel are costly but Sturt's last-gasp loss to South has helped their cause and you keep expecting them to turn their season around. But Adelaide coach Michael Godden, who lifted the Eagles to a premiership in 2011, won't be about to show any sympathy to his former club. The Crows, who have lost two of their past three games and slipped to third, only ahead of fourth-placed Norwood on percentage, will be just as desperate to win this one.

# KING KERLS FAREWELLED

The life of South Australian football icon Neil Kerley was on July 25 celebrated at an emotional, moving State funeral at Adelaide Oval, the site of many of his greatest triumphs. Leading dignitaries, politicians and a who's who of football royalty were among more than 1000 guests paying their last respects to a much-loved and highly-respected South Australian who was often referred to as 'the King', such was his standing in the State he loved.

Kerley, also affectionately known as 'Kerls', or 'Knuckles', died, aged 88, on June 29 when he suffered a medical episode while driving near his Walker Flat home. There has been an outpouring of grief since and his remarkable achievements as an inspirational footballer, coach, media identity and larger-than-life personality over seven decades were recalled amid tears and raucous laughter by dignitaries and family in the William Magarey Room at Adelaide Oval.

Kerley's daughter Gail, son-in-law Leigh Hossack and grandson Campbell paid moving tributes. Long-time friend, former AFL chief executive Wayne Jackson provided a eulogy, while Graham Cornes and Peter Marker, Glenelg greats under Kerley who became influential media commentators, provided

heartfelt reflections. Victorian media personality and long-time Collingwood president Eddie McGuire and former Crows champion Mark Ricciuto rounded out the tributes before Kerley's coffin was given a final lap of honour around Adelaide Oval's hallowed turf to a standing ovation from guests.

A loud blast of the final siren at the ground put a fitting end to a moving celebration of the life of an SA great. Also watched by thousands online, mourners included the Premier, Peter Malinauskas, Governor, Honourable Frances Adamson AC, and SA football greats including Barrie Robran, Malcolm Blight, John Platten, Peter Carey, John Halbert, Andrew Jarman, Ken Eustice, Peter Darley, Rex Voigt and Laurie Rosewarne. AFL CEO Gillon McLachlan was among those who had travelled from Melbourne, along with Robert DiPierdomenico and Sam Newman. And there were fans adorned in West, South, Glenelg, Eagles, Central and Adelaide Crows scarfs, caps and jackets and one Tigers fan was draped in a duffel coat from the 1970s.

"He would want it to be big, there's no doubt about it, he would want it to bring tears but he would want laughter as much as anything,"

Cornes said of the gathering, which ticked all those boxes. "If there was one word to describe Neil Kerley, it was 'leadership'. He was born to lead."

Cornes also believed Kerley led the way among football identities in what he described as the golden era of SA footy. "It began in the early '60s, when television brought the game into our lounge rooms, and it stretched through to the late '80s," he said. "It was a football era that defined a generation and Neil's influence extended right throughout it. The names from that era were some of the greats of football – Williams, Oatey, Motley, Head, Halbert, Cahill, Ebert, Robran, Blight. We could debate it but Kerls was the most powerful, charismatic figure of that era. They called him the King, King Kerley and there's only one king."

While Kerley loved nothing more than beating the Vics there was always healthy respect and wonderful friendships. And McGuire declared: "We Victorians love Knuckles." He said Kerley was regarded in Victoria as "a legend" and believed he should be elevated to a legend of the game in the Australian Football Hall of Fame. All the 1000-plus guests at the King's moving funeral know he already is one.

# SA AT THE DOUBLE

**S**A Country burst out of the blocks to claim a memorable 27-point win against WA Country at Adelaide Oval last Saturday. The strong win gave the Croweaters a double over WA this season after the Jade Sheedy-coached State team in May beat the Sandgropers by four points in Perth.

SA Country, coached by Rick Macgowan, was inspired by forward Ben Edwards, who booted three of his four goals in a dazzling opening term. The Croweaters led by 18 points at the first change before effectively shutting the visitors out of the contest by half-time with a 36-point advantage.

Captain Matt Willson continued the red-hot form which saw him named Player of the SA Country Championships earlier in July. The South East midfielder was fittingly awarded the Barry Stringer Medal as SA's best player.

Former Adelaide SANFL player Sam Tharaldsen was another strong performer, while Zane Montgomerie, Jack Kenny and Murphy Short were recognised for their positive efforts.

South Australia had mixed results in junior championships in the past month with the under-16s crowned national champions while the under-18s managed just one win from four games.

The Torrens University SA Under-16 team stormed home to claim the championship with a blistering 63-point win against Victoria Country at Thebarton Oval. Having beaten WA by 48 points but lost by just three points to Victoria Metro,

the Croweaters were still in the hunt to win the title after the Sandgropers upset Vic Metro.

SA needed to hit the scoreboard regularly to secure victory on percentage after Victoria Metro and WA also had claimed two wins. The Croweaters kicked away to the championship with a sensational seven-goal final term. Tall Central District defender Will McCabe was

SA's Most Valuable Player for his consistency across the three games.

SA's under-18s started their campaign with a 37-point win against the Allies before succumbing to Victoria Country (two points), Victoria Metro (73) and WA (20). Captain Adam D'Alia was SA's MVP.

# TORRENS UNIVERSITY U18 WRAP

## Woodville-West Torrens forward Tyler Welsh showed plenty of heart in the Eagles' upset 26-point win against North Adelaide in Round 15 of the Under-18 Torrens University Cup at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval.

Despite playing the first three quarters of the Eagles' under-16 game earlier in the day, Welsh, the son of former Crow Scott Welsh, filled in admirably with three goals after being a late inclusion due to a teammate's pre-match injury. After also booting three majors in the under-16s, Welsh played 15 minutes each quarter in the under-18s as Patrick Toole, Noah Angove and Sebastian Menta led the way in an impressive Eagles performance. The Roosters, who still sit on top of the table, were well served by Max Blacker (22 disposals, two goals) and Jed Dignan (19 disposals, two goals).

## West Adelaide overcame a goalless third term to keep its finals hopes alive with a spirited two-point win against Glenelg at ACH Group Stadium.

Trailing by five points after kicking just two behinds in the 'premiership

quarter', the Bloods hit the front when tall forward Harry Lemmey goaled in the 11th minute of the final quarter. From there, West, led by ruck Darcy Minchella (21 disposals), Charlie Haysman (25) and Jack Oates, did enough to hold on in a tense finish. Glenelg's Charlie Hildyard (20 disposals), Tom Corcoran (19 disposals, one goal) and Bowen Payne (27 disposals) fought hard.

## South Adelaide set up a surprise 11-point win against Sturt with a strong opening half at Flinders University Stadium.

Out of contention for the major round, the Panthers proved they are capable of shaping the top four by jumping the Blues to lead by 24 points at the main break. Hugh Daniell, Koby Cockshell (four goals) and Talon Copley (22 disposals) stood up as South withstood a second-half Sturt charge inspired by hard nut Kobe McEntee. The younger brother of Power-listed Jed McEntee, he picked up 24 disposals and six tackles, while Chad Reschke (three goals) and Tom McCourt (15 disposals, nine tackles) lent solid support.

## Norwood ran over the top of Central District to bank valuable percentage with its 74-point win at X Convenience Oval.

Beau Baldwin was a catalyst behind the Redlegs' second-half surge as they booted 11.5 to the Dogs' 1.3 after the main break. Baldwin racked up 29 disposals and two goals while Damon Pitt gathered 17 disposals and booted four goals. Central lauded Beau Thomas, Riley McDonald and Will Schmidt for taking the fight up to the Legs.

# MAGIC OF OLDEST MEDAL

**O**ur Footy, Our People, Our Stories, 145 Years of the SANFL is an exhibition that is kicking goals at the State Library. And one of the highlights of a must visit for footy fans is a stunning 60-page souvenir booklet that captures the essence of the sport's wonderful history in SA. In it, John Halbert, Sturt's 1961 Magarey Medallist, discusses the Medal.

William Ashley Magarey was Chairman and Commissioner of the SA Football Association in 1897. He relinquished the role of Commissioner – who dealt with naughty footballers – after just one year but retained the role of Chairman and later took on the title of President. He retained that position until his death in 1929.

He was concerned about football 'thuggery' and decided to offer a medal for the 'fairest and most brilliant' player each year, awarded on the votes of the umpires. After some reluctance the League committee agreed. He stipulated three requirements for the format of the medal: It must be gold, his name must not be on the medal – only the winner's name – and each medal must have its own unique design.

So the Magarey Medal began its wonderful history as the first individual award of any sport in Australia with Alby Green's win in 1898.

Up until 1912 umpires recorded

just one vote at the end of the season for the best player for the whole season. From 1913 they were required to record one vote for the best player at the end of each game, with finals included. If the count recorded a tie in votes, the umpires were balloted and nominated their preference for the medal. In 1921 Dan Moriarty tied with three others but won the umpires' ballot. In 1925 Magarey suggested the idea that, if there was a tie, both players should receive a medal, but the League rejected the proposal.

Voting in 1939 changed from 5-3-1 to 3-2-1 and a system was introduced that when a tie occurred the player with more first

preference votes would be awarded the medal. This process continued until 1990, when Mr Allan, the delegate for South Adelaide on the League Management Committee, convinced the League if two or more players secured the same number of votes, they should each receive a medal. This was passed by the members and later it was decided all those who had tied in the past and not received medal recognition would receive one retrospectively. These were presented to relatives of those players at a special function in 1998. Unfortunately, it has meant Magarey's original requirement that each medal have its own design could no longer be followed.


