

# Coaching with Jay

In this issue, we welcome SANFL Juniors
Umpire Coach Jay Trebilcock to the
Coaches Corner. Jay takes us through
Player Injuries and what Umpires need to
know.



What do you need to do - and when is the right time to stop play for an injured player?

As per law 8.2 of the 2025 Laws of Australian Football, it is the field umpire's responsibility to look out for player safety. This includes stopping play for an injured player, however, there are specific principles and laws which help us understand when to stop play.

The basic principle for when play should be stopped for an injured player is when 'the ball is within one kick and heading in the direction of the injured player'. Once the player has been attended to by first aid officials and is either off the ground or in no immediate danger of play the umpire can then restart the game.

If the ball was in **dispute** at the time play stopped, the field umpire shall **throw the ball up** at the location on the ground it last was. But, if a player had **clear** possession of the football, they should be **awarded a free kick** from the location they were when play was stopped. Some other specific scenarios for when a field umpire should **stop play** for an **injured player** include when they are **bleeding**, or a **stretcher** is called for.

Under law 7.3, when a stretcher is called for by a first aid official, the field umpire should **stop play immediately**. However, if a team bring a stretcher onto the field for any given reason the field umpire should still stop the play immediately. **Play can't be restarted until the stretcher is completely off the field.** 

Another situation where an umpire can stop play for an injured player is when they are bleeding. When a field umpire **determines** that a player is **bleeding**, they must **stop play immediately**, by blowing their whistle and signalling by crossing their arms to create an X. Under law 24.3.1 (a), a field umpire must **direct the player off the ground** and wait a **reasonable time for a replacement player** to take up their position. It is important to note the bleeding player can be **immediately replaced** by another player from the bench. If a player refuses to leave the ground, a red card should be shown to the player as it is a reportable offence for misconduct in failing to follow a direction of an umpire.

In each of these circumstances, the same rules about restarting play above, apply.

Player safety is paramount, and we always encourage erring on the side of caution when stopping or restarting the game.
