CHANGE ROOMS AND CLUBROOMS

Change Rooms and Clubroom buildings not only support the participation of players, officials and umpires in football, but also provide for a welcoming space that brings the community together. As well as football activity, clubrooms deliver broader benefit to the community and drive income for club sustainability.

The AFL Preferred Community Facility Guidelines provide the minimum design requirements for these facilities. Project and site planning is the first stage when considering change room / clubroom project, including stakeholder engagement, needs assessment, design and budgeting. The time taken in planning will outweigh the construction phase and clubs should be prepared for that.

The main options for building construction include new built form, refurbishment and modular building options. Depending on the scale of your project, you will need to engage with your local council, state and/or federal MPs, funding partners, architect, various consultants, builder and contractors.

Modular construction may be an ideal solution for end-to-end project management, streamlined design process, quick construction timeframe and reduced installation cost. More information can be found at ausco.com.au
