SCOREBOARDS

Scoreboards are an important part of football club facilities that enable the scoring of matches and can also support other sporting codes. Modern scoreboards reduce reliance on volunteers to operate in the open and link directly to digital scoring systems that can be run from anywhere at your club.

A scoreboard project should follow these steps: scoreboard research, selection and procurement, structural engineering advice and funding model.

The recommended size for community football is approx. 3.84m x 2.24m. The priority for community level football is to display the score however Clubs may choose to install a larger than standard scoreboard for additional functionality and use. Funding applications should be based on the recommended standard.

SANFL recommends [Big Screen Video \(BSV\)](#) for assistance with scoreboard projects, having delivered high-quality digital scoreboards to multiple community venues across the state.

- Gold (not copper) diodes for long lasting screen life
- Automatic brightness and sun detection
- 10mm pixel pitch - (best viewing from > 10m away)
- Link to PlayHQ scoring or proprietary software (club preference)
- Measured quality control in China and Australia
- Confirmed after sales support
- Local repairs in Adelaide
