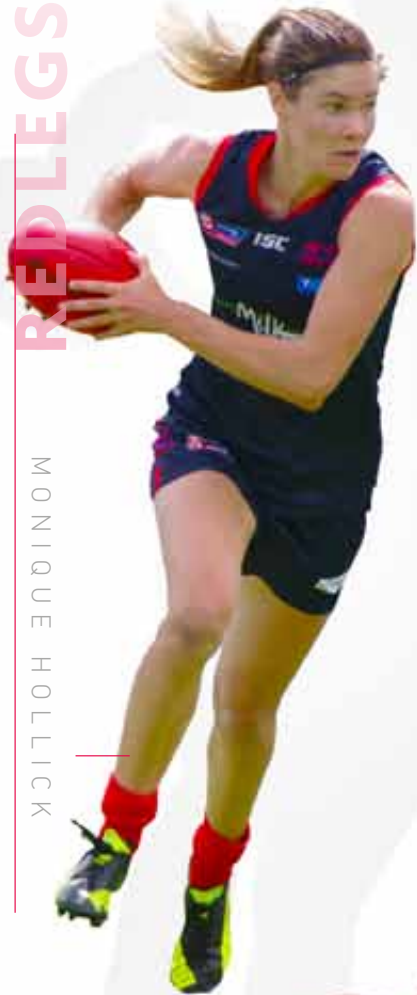

PRESIDENT'S REPORT | PAUL DI IULIO



As we look back on season 2018, we have so much to celebrate, however, we were unable to realise the ultimate prize on Grand Final day. Although that result was extremely disappointing, overall the Norwood Football Club had a very successful season, both on and off the field, and I have no doubt that season 2018 has placed us in a very strong position to deliver sustained success over the coming years.

OUR 140TH ANNIVERSARY

Who would have thought 140 years ago, that a meeting in a local hotel would lead to the creation of one of the most iconic and successful sporting clubs in Australia. The wisdom and vision of these men on that day has led to so much joy and success for our players, members, sponsors, supporters and the larger Norwood family. The record of our club is truly magnificent and the impact that it has had on the local community, the SANFL and the broader South Australian sporting community has been exceptional. To recognise this significant achievement a book was published and titled - 140 Years of the Red and the Blue. If you haven't purchased a copy I would encourage you to do so and digest the 140 magnificent years that has made the Norwood Football Club what it is today.

ON FIELD

As a club we won the Stanley H. Lewis Trophy for the fourteenth time. The trophy is awarded to the best performing Club in the League, Reserves and U18s competition throughout the minor round season. Our League and Reserves teams both finished minor premiers, however, unfortunately were not able to win their respective Grand Finals and the U18s were narrowly defeated in the Preliminary Final.

In addition, our SANFL Women's team was narrowly beaten on the last kick of the day in their Grand Final, our U16s won their Grand Final and our U15s were beaten in their Grand Final.

As we look back over the year, you would have to agree that the club had a very successful year across all the grades and we look forward to turning these narrow losses in to premiership successes in the coming years.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge Jarrod Cotton for his achievements since he took over as our senior coach in 2017. There is no doubt that his commitment, dedication and love for Norwood has transcended throughout the entire club and ensured that we are one club with one vision of being the best we can be with the clear mandate of giving ourselves the best chance to win the premiership each and every year. The Board were so impressed with the Jarrod's work ethic, dedication and ability to get the results we are striving for that we have extended his tenure for a further two years. This will ensure 'Cotts' will be our senior coach until at least the end of season 2021.

MICHAEL TAYLOR MEDAL

Mitch Grigg capped an unbelievable year with being awarded the Michael Taylor Medal as our most brilliant player for season 2018. Mitch had a magnificent season where in addition to winning our club champion award, the Michael Taylor Medal, saw him win the Magarey Medal and the Jack Oatey Medal for his super human performance in the Grand Final. He was also named in the South Australian State Team and The Advertiser Team of the Year. I think you would all agree there was nothing more that Mitch could have done in season 2018. Congratulations Mitch on an unbelievable season.

CROATIA TRAINING & EDUCATION CAMP

One of our key values of the Norwood Football Club, is being innovative and in October last year we undertook a first for any football club in Australia. We took our Men's and Women's Teams to Croatia to play a game against their National Men's and Women's Teams. Although the results were very one-sided in our favour it was a great learning experience for our players and a fantastic opportunity to showcase our club in Croatia and throughout Europe.

The coverage through Europe was amazing and I know that we have started a relationship in Croatia that can only grow and benefit our club in the long term. The opportunity to bind the Men's and Women's Team was phenomenal and strengthen another key club value, of being inclusive. There is no doubt that we all learnt a lot on the trip and to be honest it was one of my proudest moments as President of this magnificent club.

Two years ago we didn't have a Women's Team, now we have taken both our Men's and Women's Team across to Europe and expanded the breadth of influence the Norwood Football Club has on our great game.

BUILD THE FORT - WOLF BLOSS COMMUNITY CENTRE

Well it has finally started! After years of procrastination and delays beyond our control, demolition is now complete. This work marks the start of the very exciting journey to fulfil our dream of creating new clubroom facility overlooking Norwood Oval. The Wolf Bloss Community Centre, will be envy of all clubs and again place the Norwood Football Club at the forefront of all things football in South Australia.

The construction time is likely to be 9-10 months, although you will see the building taking shape throughout the season 2019, realistically it won't be fully operational until the start of the 2020 AFLW and SANFLW seasons. Although it seems like it has taken forever, it's a very exciting time for our club as we continue to invest in our future ensuring that after 140 years we continue to be strong and relevant in this State.

I would also like to take the opportunity to thank all the people have assisted in raising funds for the new build to date, and especially acknowledge the heroic contribution from Wolf Bloss, who personally has donated \$1 million toward the new facility.

LEGENDS

Our club had the great honour and privilege last year to honour five of our greats and elevating them to Legend status into our Hall of Fame. I would like to pass on my congratulations to the family of the late Walter Scott, and to Wally Miller, Michael Taylor, Michael Aish and Garry McIntosh on being our first ever inductees as Legends. There is no doubt that these five men have been referred to as Legends in the past, however, now it is official and they have been immortalised by the Norwood Football Club as Legends within our Hall of Fame.

The evening was a moving tribute to these five greats and I would like to take this opportunity to thank Michael Coligan and his Hall of Fame Committee for all their work in making this a wonderful event and recognition to these Legends' contribution to our club. In giving their acceptance speeches it was very evident how much our club means to them and from the reaction of those in attendance, how much they mean to our football club.

AFL LIFE MEMBER

In addition to becoming a Hall of Fame Legend, Wally Miller was awarded, in January 2019, Life Membership of the Australian Football League for special service to the game. This is a magnificent honour bestowed upon one of the greatest and most influential people to ever be associated with the Norwood Football Club.

1978 PREMIERSHIP REUNION

On the same night of the Hall of Fame Legends inductions were announced, we also celebrated the 40-year reunion of that epic one-point win over Sturt in the 1978 Grand Final at Football Park. It was fantastic to see so many of the players from that team there on the night reminiscing about the feats of the day. There is no doubt that was one of the greatest ever wins in the club's history and the players showed what the true meaning of Fortis in Procetta (Strength in Adversity) is. There are so many stories from that day and so many moments of individuals brilliance. Whether it was the match winning goal by Philip Gallagher, the mark in the dying moments by Michael Taylor, the five goals kicked by Brian Adamson or John Wynne providing some advice to the Sturt coaching staff, they all helped write the script of one the greatest moments in the history of our club, in one of the most successful periods of our football club.

MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE

This is a debilitating disease with no cure, at this stage. The face of this fight is VFL/AFL great Neale Daniher, and there is no doubting the courage he has shown in wanting to find a cure for this insidious disease and he has been amazing in his fundraising efforts, especially as it may all could be too late for him.

This disease has no boundaries and has also touched the Norwood family. Firstly, we lost one of our past players, Damien Lane, last year and more recently Mitch Grigg's father Chris has been diagnosed with MND. As a way to make a contribution we held our own 'Big Freeze' at Coopers Stadium on Saturday, 7th July. This was our way of showing Mitch, Chris and Damien's family how much we care about them and that once you are part of the Norwood family, you are always part of the Norwood family.

TALENT MANAGER'S REPORT | RICK SHROWDER



When looking back at 2018 the overall results and individual honours for our underage squads and players have been really impressive and pleasing. Although the U16 and U18 squads both fell just short of ultimate success, we did see many young talented players emerge and further develop giving great hope for the future of the senior side.

Our U13, U14 & U15 Development Squads were once again selected from local clubs in our metropolitan zone and gathered once a week for training at the club. Each squad played a handful of matches against other SANFL clubs and each squad experienced its shares of on field victories and defeats. More importantly, under the guidance of coaches Jamie Thomas (U13s) and past player David Payne (U14s) the players were introduced to the higher standards required at state league football.

The U15s once again coached by Chris O'Connor used the early development squad matches as preparation for the SANFL Intra State competition. After overcoming a sluggish start to this week they finished strongly and with other results also assisting, they managed to play in another Grand Final and were once again successful, defeating North Adelaide by 34 points.

The Intra State Championships are held when our Eyre Peninsula U15s and U17s squads travel to Adelaide for the week. This is a great opportunity for us to see the quality of players in our country

zone but also a chance for these players to represent our club and their region, something they do with pride whenever they put on the red and blue guernsey. Both squads competed really well with mixed results. Importantly, we have once again been given a glimpse of what to expect from our players in the country and we look forward to continuing to work with all of our partners and local leagues in the region again in 2019.

At the completion of the Development Squad commitments a select number of players were invited to attend additional skill sessions with our Academy and Women's team head coach, Steve Symonds. These sessions were an introduction to the Academy initiative that we will be building on in 2019.

The end of the boys Development Squad season saw the start of the Girls Development Squads and this year we had U15s and U17s coached by Mark Swanbury and Bek McMahon respectively and overseen by Steve Symonds. Players were selected from local clubs and schools as well as a select number from the Eyre Peninsula. Both squads participated in the SANFL Statewide Super Shield playing four games in August and September. Our U15s won two out of their three matches and our U17s won one out of four. Importantly, the development pathway for girls at our club continued to gain strength giving great hope that we will have some fantastic young players knocking on the door of the Women's team in the near future.



Our 16s squad was filled with players that had experienced success the previous year in the victorious U15s Development Squad. This no doubt fed a desire for more of the same in 2018. After a successful campaign only losing one match in the short season they unfortunately fell at the last hurdle losing the Grand Final to Glenelg. Although extremely disappointing for the entire squad, it was evident that all of their hard work and particularly the energy and passion with which Head Coach Scott Irrgang had invested in the group had certainly been worthwhile. At the completion of the U16s season, a handful of players were immediately asked to train with the U18s; a clear statement that they were certainly progressing in their development pathway at the club.



Our U18s squad was fortunate to have some very exciting and talented players, many of whom were selected in the State Squad. Unfortunately, the reality is the squad also lacked a bit of depth and whilst this made the middle part of the year a challenge, while the National Championships were on, it did provide an opportunity for a number of U16s players to gain some valuable early experience amongst the older, bigger players. In the last third of the season the team needed to win every match to remain in contention for the finals. It did this with some fantastic wins, most notably a really satisfying victory against South Adelaide at Noarlunga on a very windy day. They then managed to beat North Adelaide to play in a Preliminary Final against South Adelaide on Adelaide Oval. After a very slow start, which saw South leading by as many as 46 points at one stage, they clawed their way back into the game and only just fell short by less than a goal in the end. The opportunity to play and coach on Adelaide Oval will be an experience that everyone will remember for a long time but the result will hopefully be what everyone extracts the most learning from.

FINANCE REPORT | BEN SEEKAMP



On behalf of the board and management I have great pleasure in presenting the financial report of the club for the year ended 31 October 2018.

FINANCIAL RESULTS

The 2018 financial year result to be reported by the club is a net surplus of \$385,800.

The surplus includes the SANFL Land Divestment, proceeds of \$275,000 and further generous donations to the Build the Fort fund of \$55,718.

The financial statements presented for this year are somewhat confusing due to some restructuring and with the new structure commencing from 1st July 2018. This was done to ensure we continued to be a not for profit organisation.

THE NORWOOD FOOTBALL CLUB INCORPORATED

Attendances at Coopers Stadium decreased slightly in 2018 and as expected the total spend was down 4%. The highest attended game at Coopers Stadium was the opening game on Easter Monday against Sturt with 5,036. A game with this crowd results in a match day profit in excess of \$36,000. Again, we are pleased to report that even the lowest attended game is able to produce a profit albeit small.

On field performance for the minor round was terrific, only losing one game at home, however, we saw a small decline in membership. We commenced membership renewals early for

2019 aiming to capitalise on the strong performance in 2018 and this has proved successful. We continue to look at improvements as to what our memberships contain and what we can offer our members.

Sponsorship proved to be a challenge and we were unable to achieve some of the targets we set ourselves. We remain positive on improvement in 2019 and look to build on the products, such as the Superscreen to drive additional revenue from this great asset.

Having three AFLW games at Coopers Stadium resulted in 21,992 attending and a total spend of \$109,562. Whilst the numbers attending was terrific it did fall short of expectations as we thought the momentum would continue if not build from 2017.

We have two AFLW games in 2019 and this remains important in utilising Coopers Stadium and raising additional revenue.

Merchandise sales were very good, exceeding our budget by more than double. A grand final win would have seen substantially more sold.

We continue to feel pressure to reduce costs. We do aim to reduce unnecessary costs but we refuse to reduce the quality of our coaching and facilities. We feel that these are important to attract and retain quality people and crucial to ensure we give the supporters something worth watching.

THE REDLEGS CLUB INCORPORATED

We are very pleased to report that our gaming figures improved by 4.5%. It took some time to become very familiar with the business once we took full control of the management of this facility and in time, we began to see improvement in the performance. We continue to market, improve the facility and make changes to benefit the operation.

The Premiers Bar and other on field food and beverage sales increased, much of this due to the extra events held at Coopers Stadium, in particular the AFLW matches.

137 THE PARADE TRUST, 581 NORTH EAST TRUST AND 583 NORTH EAST TRUST

The Net result of the Trusts was a surplus of \$312,823. The surplus is due to the rent collected on the Nor East and rent from the tenants at 581 North East Road less interest on commercial bills, sundry property maintenance, rates and taxes and other minor sundry items. The surplus is distributed to the Norwood Football Club.

SUMMARY

The Net result of the above entities was a surplus of \$385,800. If we add back depreciation (\$180,120), and remove the net result of Build the Fort activities (\$55,718), the result is a surplus of \$510,202.

The NFC History Committee continued to meet throughout the year at the club and at the Cultural History Centre at St Peters. Sadly, one of the committee's founding members, Terry Page, passed away in February. Terry, a long time club member and passionate supporter, was an enthusiastic and active contributor to the History Committee's activities.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR'S ACTIVITIES INCLUDE:

A recommendation from the History Committee to introduce the status of Legend to the Hall of Fame was approved by the NFC Board.

The Hall of Fame charter was amended to allow the classification of Legend to "those players, coaches and officials who have had the most significant impact on the Norwood Football Club and the game of Australian football and caused the game to change significantly for the better". Walter Scott, Wally Miller, Michael Taylor, Michael Aish and Garry McIntosh were inducted as inaugural legends from the sixty three names in the Hall of Fame.

A book; 140 Years of the Red and Blue 1878 - 2017 was prepared and published in July. Drawing on the club's collection of archival material including photographs and information from the Redlegs Museum website, the book encapsulates the history of the club and the often colourful stories of players, officials and volunteers since the club's inception in 1878.

The book proved to be so popular that a second printing had to be hastily arranged to meet the demand.

The club's annual general meeting was held on 28 February to mark the 140th anniversary of the first AGM held at the Norfolk Arms Hotel in Rundle Street on that day in 1878. A display and slide show of historic action photos was arranged for the meeting during which the President Paul Di Iulio read an excerpt from the minutes of the first meeting.

The list of NFC life members was updated after checking the names against the club's past annual reports. The names of twenty players and officials that had dropped off the list over the years have now been added and included in this year's annual report.

An oral history interview was arranged with one of the club's most decorated players, Ron Kneebone. Former ABC journalist and commentator Roger Wills conducted the interview during which Ron spoke candidly about his career including the state games, the Killigrew years, the 1966 Magarey Medal award and the incident involving Marx Kretschmer during the 1958 grand final replay against Port Adelaide.

Two timelines covering the history of the club since 1878 and the history of the Norwood Oval since 1901 were prepared and added to the Redlegs Museum website. The site continues to grow and the team of profile writers has completed over 750 biographies of past league players. In particular, research is being undertaken into players from the nineteenth century. Until now, many of them were simply names on team lists but, drawing on resources such as the national newspaper database, Trove and other sources, our writers are discovering some remarkable on-field and off-field stories from a bygone era.

A total of 8,390 photographs have been digitised and over 1250 images of past players have been added to their records on the Redlegs Museum. Brenton Neumann's photo highlights of the 2018 season were added to the Redlegs Museum and can be viewed along with photos from past seasons, under Media on the website.

Donations of memorabilia such as badges, guernseys, publications and ephemera were received from 26 members, supporters and the families of past players. A total of 192 contributors have donated items to the collection since 2010. All donations are acknowledged by letter with the assurance that items are

catalogued and safely stored. The family of NFC Hall of Famer Hubert (Tom) Warhurst(1935-1947) presented the club with a 1930s club lace-up and three state guernseys worn by Tom during his career of 137 club and three state games.

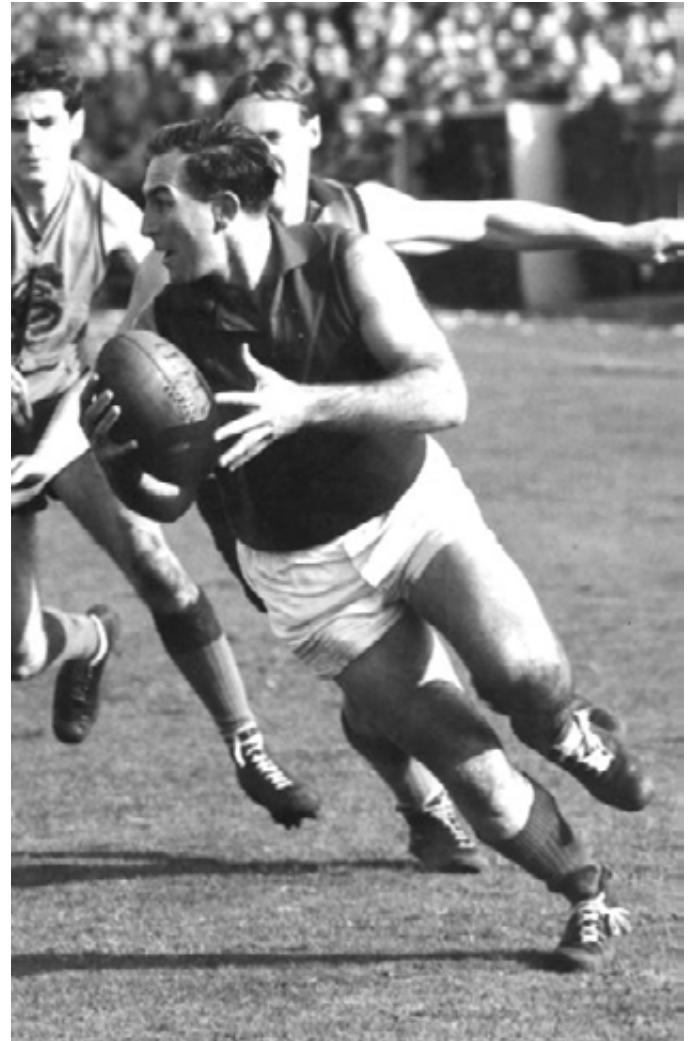
Several significant items were acquired for the collection including a gold best and fairest medallion awarded to Sydney White in 1913. The former captain and coach played 146 games from 1912 to 1925 including three premierships, and is a NFC and SANFL Hall of Famer and a member of the Norwood Team of the Century. The small gold medallion bears the mark of its designer and manufacturer Suhard & Co, the jewelry firm established by former Norwood player Lou Suhard.

The club's archival database holds records for 3,375 items including images of 1,695 objects. While the collection is housed in secure storage facilities, it is to be hoped that the current building and refurbishment work at the Norwood Oval will eventually allow many of the objects and photographs, to be displayed and enjoyed by members.

The History Committee acknowledges the continued support of NFC office and ground staff. We also appreciate the assistance of Denise Schumann from the St Peters Cultural History Centre , John Eastwood from U-Store-It and Anthony Harvey for maintaining the Redlegs Museum website.

We thank WAFL historian Greg Wardell-Johnson for his constant help in providing pictures and information for the Redlegs Museum.
