2022 will be a year none of us will ever forget. It was eventful, enjoyable, rewarding, frustrating, satisfying and successful.

There were quite a number of changes from the 2021 season, in regards to our playing group. Many experienced players departed, which created an opportunity to rethink how we recruit players to Norwood. We targeted players within the age bracket of 18-25, who had high quality character and had the playing ability to play SANFL football. These principles were agreed to by our Senior Management Team of President, CEO, Coach, Football Director and Football Manager.

With change, it can create inconsistency. This was evident in the first six rounds, where we were two wins and four losses. The team was still working itself out, we had COVID-19 challenges and players were still grasping the demands of what it took to be a Norwood player. After the state game, where we were represented by Nunn, Rokahr and Boyd, we started to get some synergy within the group. We had good wins

against Central District and Adelaide, followed by a loss to North Adelaide at Prospect. This had us four wins and five losses at the mid-season break.

The next six weeks were outstanding. After the recruitment of Luke Surman, following the away win against Port Adelaide, we defeated Sturt, an away win against Woodville-West Torrens, a win against North Adelaide, an away win against South Adelaide and a win against Adelaide. The group became resilient, consistent and dangerous. This was the period of the season that belief had been established, and no opposition was too great of a challenge for the players.

We dealt with long-term injuries to Nunn, Charlton, Cotter, Wilkins, Panos, and appendix surgery for Lowe. Spence had a long-term knee injury, and a knee injury to Stockdale. This offered opportunity to new players – Hodge, Larkins, Mitch Carroll all making their debut late in the season, as well as Michalanney playing three games before being drafted to Adelaide.

After a terrific win against Glenelg at Coopers Stadium, which more or less guaranteed a top three spot, we dropped the ball against West Adelaide away from home in the final round of the season. We lost our form and this carried over into the finals series.

The first final against Adelaide was a train wreck. There was not one redeeming feature of Norwood at its best, and Adelaide shot the lights out. We didn't prepare at the level required, at all levels of the football club. At three-quarter time we spoke to the group about starting our preparation for next week's final from the start of the fourth quarter. Whilst far from a perfect display, the group started to get back to what we do well, and this served us well in setting ourselves for Glenelg. We took ownership of what our reality was after reviewing the Adelaide final. Players, coaches and staff all understood that we had more to give. The Glenelg final looked different straight away. We were aggressive, we closed the space when they had the ball, but we were clunky going forward. After quarter time our form started coming back. We looked dangerous going forward, we were ruthless defensively and we were winning plenty of contests. We secured a 28 point victory and were quickly realigning our focus on playing Adelaide again.

The Preliminary Final reflected our season. Compete hard, slip behind on the scoreboard, claw our way back through believing in what we do, and then pulling away late in the game. The 'strength in adversity' was on show throughout this final, when 14 points behind at the 20 minute mark of the third quarter. The players found some momentum late in the quarter, and carried this into the final quarter, which was one of the most inspirational efforts by the playing group in 2022. The atmosphere around the ground belied the relatively small attendance figure. The win put us into a Grand Final and also put to bed the demons of the first final against Adelaide.

The Grand Final was epic. The preparation for the week was good, despite not training so well on the Thursday night session. The players were remarkably calm on the Saturday morning session, as well as pre-game on Grand Final day. It had everything you would want, tough, challenging conditions, momentum swings and a close finish. The players were incredible. They stuck to the task, never lost belief and once again found a way late in the game when it was on the line. When we hit the lead, with approximately 50 seconds to go, the players took complete control of the situation. Leadership across the ground put us in the best possible position to set the ground up the way we wanted, and prevent any further scores against us. The feeling of hearing the final siren is indescribable. The efforts that we saw from the players were reflective of

a group who wanted to play for each other. We ask our players and staff to 'play their part' on repeat, and this was done 'time after time'.

Our medical team did an outstanding job in 2022, but were at a new level during the finals series. We had several players returning from injury, or, playing under duress. Doctor Andrew MacDonald, Dr Simon Van Lint, Tyler Goldstone (Physiotherapist), Kerry Bungey (Physiotherapist), Shayne Faulkner (Head Trainer) and Taylah Jack (Head of High Performance) were able to manage our players to a level that allowed them to perform on game day and manage their work load during the week. The efforts of this team had a major bearing on the outcome of our season.

The celebrations following our 31st premiership were unbelievably rewarding. Seeing Coopers Stadium filled with red and blue on the Sunday night, with Norwood people dancing on the ground, to our amazing DJ Aleks. Walking down The Parade with the cup on Monday, and getting photos in front of sponsors shop fronts, as well as getting a photo in the middle of the intersection of The Parade and George Street at 11am. Seeing our colours at the top of the West End Brewery chimney, and so many of our supporters there to see the unveiling. Having a premiership Best and Fairest night. Being invited to Parliament House by Steven Marshall for dinner. Having premiership themed cans of Coopers Pale Ale. Seeing the players and staff become closer. Seeing our people at the club, purchasing premiership merchandise. These memories are etched into my mind forever.

Strong football clubs are aligned, driven, accountable and humble. I believe our club is all these qualities. Our President Paul Di Lulio and his board have offered stability, support and direction. This is crucial to our club being great again. Paul has been outstanding in his support of myself, our players and coaches. He goes above and beyond for our club, and his passion for Norwood drives me every day. Ten players made their senior debuts for the club being Rosie Boon, Tamsyn Nation, Stephanie Simmonds, Grace Mulvahil, Molly Brooksby, Grace Smallacombe, Amelia Rusden, Natasha Allison, Jazmine Egan and Coby Morgan. The Development League did not have a finals series after a seven round season but our team had a respectable first season finishing in third place with four wins and three losses. Our Senior League women finished the 2022 season with six wins and six losses just missing the finals on percentage finishing in fifth place. We had two exceptional servants in Ashlee Gould and Sophie Armitstead play their 50th SANFLW games. In addition to this we had three U18 State representatives in Lana Schwerdt, Molly Brooksby and Sachi Syme. Alana Lishmund had a great season in front of goals winning the League leading goalkicker award with 15 goals and made The Advertiser SANFLW Team of the Year. Midfielders Jade Halfpenny and Sachi Syme were also named in the Team of the Year. This was followed with Jade signing with Port Adelaide Football Club as a Free Agent and Sachi Syme being drafted in the third round of the National Draft also to Port Adelaide. With a youthful list we are looking forward to the up and coming 2023 season and hopefully a return to finals football.

JUNIOR GIRLS

The Junior Girls U14s and U16s team were led by players from our Senior Women's program in 2022 and both teams enjoyed successful campaigns winning two out of their three fixtures and learning lots throughout the programs three month duration. These young girls showed that the future of our female football program will be very strong. A number of girls from the U16s squad were subsequently invited to join the Senior Women's pre-season program.

U13/U14 DEVELOPMENT SQUADS

In season 2022, our Development Squad players were very lucky to have two senior players as their coaches in Declan Hamilton (U13s) and Harry Boyd (U14s). The squads were cut down to 35 players where they attended one training session a week and played five games. The U13 team also were able to play the State U12 side, and this looks like becoming a regular event on the calendar. The focus on these squads was to start introducing the players to what is required and start understanding the commitment at the next level. We also had a big focus on the players starting to

understand the culture of the Norwood Football Club.

U15 METRO AND COUNTRY SQUADS

In season 2022 we had two sides represent the Norwood Football Club in early October in the State U/15 championships. Both teams showed a competitive side and competed hard over the three day carnival, the Metro side was coached by Aaron Jelfs and the country team by Michael Curtis. These championships gave us a great opportunity to see where our players will be in six months when many of these players will represent the club at U16 level. The players were treated to a night at the club which many said was their highlight of the program with guest speakers and past junior players Alister Lord (Essendon), Cooper Murley (Collingwood) and Jackson Callow (Hawthorn) who spoke to players about their journey from the U15s carnival to being on an AFL list.

U16 SQUAD

In 2022 the U16 squad was heading back into a full season of 18 games. The previous seasons had only been a short seven game season that ran early in the year and allowed us to play our best team in each game. The positives of having a full season allowed us to keep players longer in our program, the negative was that when college season hit, our squad would be hit hard. We used 70 players in season 2022, this included 20 players from our Eyre Peninsula zone, 15 from the U15s and five father/son products. The highlight of the year was beating the Woodville-West Torrens who went onto win the flag in 2022. So it shows that when we were at full strength, our talent was just as good but could not get the consistency with so many changes throughout the year.

U18 SQUAD

In season 2022 we had a new coaching group at the helm. Michael Knoll stepped straight out of League football and into the head coaching role. Michael's knowledge and understanding of the senior game plan allowed the players to be introduced to the same style and plan that the senior players were playing. The season started slowly but with the players buying into the program they ended up finishing the season as minor premiers. This was a huge achievement considering the impact college football has on the junior grades. The U18s made the Preliminary Final, but unfortunately just fell short of making the Grand Final stage. The boys had an outstanding season and a couple of positives to take out of it were, Max Michalanney drafted to Adelaide and Phoenix Foster to Geelong.

The Norwood Football Club is grateful that you all did your bit through financial sponsorship in a premiership year.

Testimony to the loyalty of our Partners is the fact our Platinum Partners - Coopers, Apelle, IWS - will all continue their partnerships in 2023. This is also the case with all Major Partners - Barossa Boy, PQSA, People's Choice, Findex, Paradise Mazda, Mannix Air Conditioning, Palmer Bet, Climat Air Conditioning and Solar. At the time of writing this report we are working through all Corporate Partners and Player Sponsors and early indication is that the vast majority of them, if not all, will return to do their bit in 2023 also. Revenue from Sponsorship and Fundraising was up 7% in 2022 and on the back of a premiership, we have already had a lot of interest from potential new Partners wanting to get on board which will help drive further growth in 2023 and beyond.

Overall I am pleased to report that we continue to be in a strong position when it comes to sponsorship and we will continue to work hard as a team to grow our Partner network and drive value for their investment in our football club.

Touching on Merchandise sales, we had a very strong result as reported in the Finance Report with sales up 145% on the back of finals and premiership merchandise sales. Even when just comparing sales across the home and away period (excluding finals and post premiership sales), there was double digit growth in merchandise sales which was also pleasing.

Across any season there are numerous programs engaging supporters and Partners and helping raise money for our club. One in particular I would like to highlight is the Norwood Business Lunch held on the last Friday of every month featuring high calibre speakers including Stephen Bradbury, Sam Willoughby and Christopher Pyne. Across 2022 we had close to 1000 people attend and the Norwood Business Lunch has again established itself as one of the must attend events on the business calendar each month, just like it was back in the days of the old Redlegs Club. Stay tuned for an exciting line up of speakers in 2023.

I would also like to touch on the exciting addition of the high-performance VALO Zenith Gen-V LED Light towers, ready in time for season 2023. Not only will these provide a night match experience to rival Adelaide Oval, this is a huge step closer to our goal of becoming the first Carbon Neutral Stadium in South Australia. The Norwood Football Club is proud to be partnering with a fast-growing, game-changing South Australian business in VALO, also our partner for the LED Digital Display Boundary installs last season. Thanks to Aaron Hickmann and the VALO team for being a fantastic partner in making this happen. Get excited Red and Blue army, this keeps your club at the cutting edge of stadium fan experience and night football at The Parade is about to get a whole lot better!

FINANCE REPORT

On behalf of the board and management I have great pleasure in presenting the Norwood Football Club Incorporated and controlled entities financial report for the year ending 31 October 2022.

FINANCIAL RESULTS

The 2022 financial year result to be reported by the club is a net surplus of \$83,586.

This was the first season that was reasonably unaffected by COVID-19, something that had challenged us significantly in the previous two seasons. We were able to focus on utilising the Wolf Blass Community Centre for match day events and other functions. This venue was extremely well supported and something we are proud to use for match day events. At face value the surplus may appear to be low considering the premiership success, however, most of the benefits of winning a premiership show in the following financial year. It shows that we need to continue to be careful from a financial perspective and utilise our resources

well. The Norwood people are amazing supporters, and they were well rewarded with the amazing premiership victory.

The government assistance received over the past two years such as Job Keeper and the cash flow boost ceased. The SANFL Land Divestment received was \$350,000, which is set aside for building works. We have a final \$300,000 to receive at the end of October 2023.

THE NORWOOD FOOTBALL CLUB INCORPORATED

Attendances at Coopers Stadium were unfortunately down compared to 2021. Many reasons contributed to this such as the weather and people being cautious of COVID-19. However, the spend at the ground was well up which is perplexing. Membership was slightly down but we expect this to increase as we prepare an active campaign to win back members especially off the back of a premiership season. Similarly with sponsorship, this was slightly down but we expect this to improve. We now have the LED ribbon signage fully functioning

allowing much better dynamic exposure for sponsors. Merchandise sales for 2022 were \$318,000 compared to \$130,000 in 2021. We sold \$190,000 worth of merchandise in September and October and a further \$96,000 in November and December. The passion our members have for this club is proven by the desire to have Norwood premiership merchandise. It was difficult to keep up with the demand.

THE REDLEGS CLUB INCORPORATED

The performance of our Gaming Venue continues to be strong. Gaming revenue was up 7.6%, and food and beverage was up 3.5%. We continue to invest with new gaming machines and the introduction of note acceptors, ticket-in ticket-out and cash exchange machines continues to be successful and popular. The Nor East committee is fortunate to have a wealth of experience and they guide us tremendously well ensuring we have the most appropriate resources, good service and a well maintained facility. The Nor East provides important funds to the football activities.

Income from the Wolf Blass Community Centre, corporate boxes, the Premiers Bar and the other kiosks at the ground was up 25% from 2021. The Wolf Blass Community Centre alone experienced an increase of 42% and the Premiers Bar was up 44%. It is fantastic that members and supporters are enjoying having on field facilities to utilise. It is important that we have further improvement in 2023, built around successful football performances and continually getting better at managing the venue. The new oval lights will make night football a much better experience and we expect crowd numbers to increase as a result of this investment.

137 THE PARADE TRUST, 581 NORTH EAST TRUST AND 583 NORTH EAST TRUST

The Net result of the Trusts was a surplus of \$384,680, an 18.5% increase compared to the previous year. Rent levels to our tenants increased 8% and interest costs decreased significantly as we were able to pay down the debt against the properties significantly. Debt on these buildings decreased from \$976,000 to \$16,000, this reduction was well timed as we saw interest rates increase significantly. We have the ability to draw down on these loans should the need arise.

We expect to see some further increase in rental income in the current financial year. Being able to maximise our return on investment is important and something we spent time on during the year.

The surplus is due to the rent collected on the Nor East and rent from the tenants at 581 North East Road,

less interest on commercial bills, sundry property maintenance, rates and taxes and other minor sundry items. The surplus is distributed to the Norwood Football Club.

SUMMARY

The Net result of the above entities was a surplus of \$83,586. If we add back depreciation (\$310,556), and remove the net deficit of Build the Fort activities (\$52,757), the result is a surplus of \$456,899.

Guests enjoyed a two course meal, Barossa Boy Wines and Coopers beers, raffles and auctions.

INCREDIBLE JOURNEYS

We continue to offer these fantastic events sharing remarkable stories from inspiring women. Athletes, Sam Boag, Izzy Vincent, Angela Foley, Jess Stenson nee Trengove, Anna Liptak and Rachel Sporn shared their journeys with emcee Ali Clarke. We then hosted some of our finest hospitality legends, Valerie Henbest, Kate Laurie and the pocket rocket Nikki Govan. Next year will include fashion, arts, medicine and research.

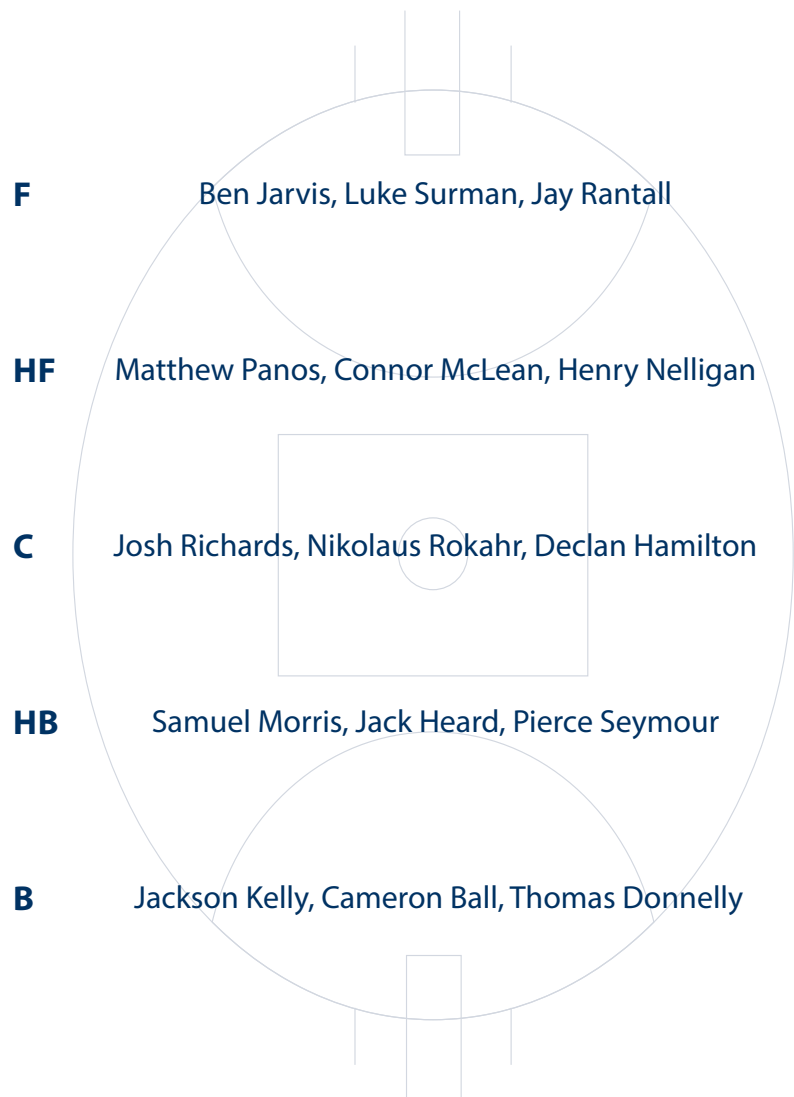
