As season 2024 approached, there was enormous excitement surrounding the club with the new recruits that had been brought into Norwood and the expectation of renewed success in the year ahead.

Although we didn't achieve the ultimate success, each of our senior teams built on the foundations of the previous years and played in their respective Grand Finals (the Senior Men's League and Reserves sides, the Senior Women's League team, and also the SANFL Wheelchair League side). Norwood's Reserves brought home the SANFL Reserves Premiership Cup to The Parade for the first time since 2019 with a fantastic 16-point win over Sturt in the Grand Final.

GATHER ROUND

This year saw the Norwood Football Club again host two games as part of the AFL's Gather Round, which was into its second season. It was fantastic to see The Parade full again, with crowds resembling football at Norwood in the '70s and '80s. There is no doubt that Gather Round is great for football, great for the State and very beneficial for the Norwood Football Club. It was a great opportunity to showcase The Parade on the national stage and highlight what a wonderful facility we have. The AFL Gather Round games played at Norwood Oval in 2024 were Brisbane Lions V North

It also confirmed what amazing staff we have at Norwood, that we were able to pull off this event together whilst still ensuring our Senior Men's, Senior Women's and junior football programs continued to operate with few interruptions.

Overall, the weekend was an outstanding success for the football club and a great way to recognise the contribution the people from the EP have made and continue to make to Norwood. We will continue to make this an annual event, as we believe it's a great way of supporting the local EP community. He also claimed the 2024 SANFL Magarey Medal in a tied count with Sturt's Will Snelling. There is no doubt that Harry epitomised the traits of Michael Taylor throughout the year with his commitment and consistency. On the back of his fantastic 2024 campaign, Harry was recruited to AFL club St Kilda, so unfortunately for us he won't be playing for Norwood in 2025. Although it is with sadness that we say goodbye, we wish him all the best for the future and acknowledge his outstanding career at The Parade which included 79 League games, the 2022 SANFL Premiership and Jack Oatey Medal, two Michael Taylor Medals, 2024 Magarey Medal, 2024 R.O Shearman Medal, multiple Advertiser Team of the Year selections and several State Games for South Australia.

HALL OF FAME MEMBERS

SENIOR MEN'S

General Manager of Football - Richard Kelly

There is no question that 2023 was a challenging year on and off the field. But as soon as the Senior Men's squad returned for their 2024 pre-season there was a different feel in the air, a sense of positivity and excitement for the season ahead. A renewed energy, and ready to turn the page over.

While there may have been some external worries, given the turnover of players with club captain Matthew Nunn, Club Champion Nik Rokahr, and several other 2022 Premiership Players and great contributors Josh Richards, Cameron Ball, Mitch Wilkins and Ben Jarvis departing the club, internally we were very confident in our 2024 playing group. Jacob Kennerley stepped up as sole captain and was outstanding with his leadership, while new players came through the door, and had an instant impact. The likes of Mitch O'Neill, Billy Cootee, Cooper Murley and Alastair Lord came into the club and hit the ground running, which isn't an easy thing to do at SANFL level. There was also internal growth with Izaak Twelftree, Jackson Callow, Baynen Lowe, Matthew Ling, Finn Heard, Tristan Binder and Tom Graham taking the next step, and having a huge impact on SANFL matches.

On top of these players, Harry Boyd was simply sensational and took his game to the next level. He went on to be awarded the Magarey Medal (tied with Sturt's Will Snelling) which is an incredible feat for a ruckman, as well as the R.O Shearman Medal (SANFL Coaches Award), Norwood Club Champion, State

Representation and The Advertiser Team of the Year. At the end of the season, he was recruited to St Kilda's AFL list, which while it's sad to see him end his time in the red and blue, we can't be more proud of his contribution to Norwood and wish him all the best. Very well deserved.

The past two seasons have shown how much a quality and uninterrupted pre-season impacts on the season ahead. Unfortunately we didn't have that in 2023, and started the season poorly. But in 2024, it was quite the opposite as the boys were fit, healthy and got to the line rearing to go. Our League side started the season with seven straight wins, three of those coming against eventual finalists in Sturt, Glenelg and Central District. The boys were playing outstanding, positive football which was fun to play and great to watch.

We had back to back losses to the Eagles and Sturt in Rounds 8 and 9, but got to the half way point in a great position at 7-2. After the Bye, Norwood won five straight matches to lock in a finals spot. We hit a stumbling block against Glenelg in Round 16, but closed out the minor round season with a 15-3 record and a top of the table finish.

We earned the Bye in the opening week of the finals series, before taking on Central District at Adelaide Oval in the Semi Final. The Bulldogs, who beat WWT in the previous week's Elimination Final, settled quicker to lead at quarter time. From there Norwood was sensational, kicking 12 goals to two in the remaining three quarters to book a Grand Final berth.

Norwood played Glenelg in the 2024 SANFL Grand Final, and it was a decider for the ages. Jackson Callow kicked the first goal of the game and it was a thrilling first half. Scores were level mid-way through the second quarter, before the Redlegs booted four straight goals to go ahead by a match-high 25-point lead in the third term. Enter, Tigers captain Liam McBean, who just proved too good on the day. McBean kicked five second half goals, and seven for the match to claim the Jack Oatey Medal and steer Glenelg to a second consecutive Premiership, 12.9-81 to 11.10-76.

While we were devastated to go down by just five points in one of the great Grand Finals, we cannot be prouder of the players, coaches, trainers, volunteers and everyone involved in the Senior Men's program in 2024. Thank you to everyone who contributed to making 2024 a memorable and positive year, we are looking forward to getting stuck into 2025.

RESERVES

2024 was the year that Norwood played in four Grand Finals across Senior competitions, and while the SANFL, SANFLW and SANFL Wheelchair League deciders didn't fall our way, the Reserves brought the Cup home to The Parade.

It was the first time since 2019 that Norwood played in and won the SANFL Reserves Grand Final, this year against Sturt in the decider 7.14-56 to 4.16-40. There were so many contributors throughout the year that again stood up on Grand Final day, including Liam Robinson with three goals, captain Xavier Tranfa with 25 disposals, Luke Bogle with 29 touches, and Isaac Saywell who won the Best on Ground Medal with 30 disposals and a goal.

The Reserves were great all season, well led by coach Aaron Jelfs who had previously been involved at U18 coaching level at Norwood. The Premiership was great reward to a 14-4 season where like the League side, the Reserves also finished on top of the ladder. Throughout the season, the Reserves played well as a team and we saw the development of several players that eventually got a taste of League football, and others that played Senior Men's football for the first time from U18s or outside the SANFL pathway. The Norwood Women's Program demonstrated remarkable success this season, even though they narrowly lost the Grand Final by five points. Their capacity to perform under pressure during critical late-season matches, where each game held significant importance, serves as a testament to the strength and resilience of the team.

The opening part of the season saw some close games and comprehensive victories. Norwood continued the ability to remain competitive in all games previous. The highlight from the early stage of the season was undoubtedly the comprehensive victory over eventual Premiers South Adelaide. During this period close losses to Central District and the Eagles ensured that we continued to learn and grow.

The midway part of the season saw some tough losses, where we gave up winning positions in the final quarter to lose to Glenelg and West Adelaide. After these defeats we were able to respond by again comprehensively taking care of eventual Premiers

South Adelaide. After losing narrowly to Glenelg only a month earlier we met again and couldn't be split in a drawn result, whilst it was an up and down period of football, we continued to show that our best was good enough.

Norwood was fourth on the ladder position late in the season, which meant every result was vital, losing two close games to Sturt and WWT meant that it all came down to Round 14 – if we won we made finals, while a loss meant we missed. A narrow six-point win against West Adelaide ensured Norwood qualified and played Central District in an Elimination Final.

Norwood played some of its best football in the finals series, and another close come from behind win against the Bulldogs showed the strength and character of the group. This win set up a Preliminary Final date with Glenelg at Glenelg Oval for a spot in the Grand Final. Both teams controlled periods of the game, but Norwood eventually ran over the top of the Tigers in the last quarter to book a spot in the Grand Final.

The Grand Final between South Adelaide and Norwood, was held at Coopers Stadium and turned out to be a game of two halves. The Panthers dominated the first half to lead comfortably at half time. The second half saw the Redlegs play some strong footy and work their way back into the game to eventually lose by five points in a thrilling final quarter.

There is no doubt that the season was a success and provides a strong platform to launch into the 2025 season. Thank you to everyone involved in the program for all the help, support and guidance.

PATHWAYS

U18 SQUAD

U18 Coach - Alex Newell

For the last couple of seasons the U18s program has had to be adaptable throughout pre-season, due to the unavailability of Norwood Oval (result of Gather Round preparation and Seniors Training), and that continued in 2024. Our group trained at ovals both in and out of the Norwood Zone, but the U18s squad and coaches are accustomed to that challenge by now and used it as a tool to galvanise the group. In 2024, the playing list was made up of about a 50-50 split of top-age and bottom-age players.

Both the U16s and U18s Round 1 game was played a week before the SANFL season began, which was a positive for us, and for the first time it was played in North Adelaide's Regional Zone of Port Pirie. The team and coaches travelled on a bus the morning of the game, travelling and arriving as a group for the country battle with the Roosters. Despite leading for most of the day in a cracking game of football, Norwood went down by five points in a thriller – we did have an opportunity to steal victory at the end. This set an unfortunate tone for the season ahead, losing five games by less than a goal over the course of the home and away season. It was a season of what could have been, and despite the lack of team success at U18 level (3-15 win loss record), there was plenty of individual and club success. The program had two representatives in the SA state program, Jacob Newton and Ned Bowman who both represented SA during the U18 National Championships. Another individual success story was Jay Polkinghorne, who overcame a knee injury early in the season to return and play some quality football in the back half of the year. Jay then had the chance to taste Senior football, promoted to the Reserves and playing a crucial role in Norwood's Reserves Premiership.

Norwood's junior program continued its run of producing AFL draftees, with Redlegs players drafted for the fifth consecutive year. Ned Bowman was a first round pick, going to the Sydney Swans, before Jay Polkinghorne was taken with Geelong's first pick in the draft. The 2024 U18s program has produced nine other players who were invited to be a part of the Senior Men's program in 2025.

The biggest challenge comes as the Adelaide School College Football season commences, and our squad gets hit hard with players having to prioritise playing for their school over their SANFL club. Norwood's U16s used over 70 players across 17 matches in season 2024; this included 15 players from our regional Eyre Peninsula zone, and 28 from Norwood's U15 side. Chris Slattery stepped into the role of U16 coach in 2024 and did a great job considering the constant changes to the team. We managed to win two games in 2024, but we knew at the start of the season that we were always going to struggle with continuity. I just want to thank Chris for his time. In Season 2025 the club welcomes Peter Turner into the role of Norwood's U16 coach. Peter comes with a very experienced background from Juniors, Seniors, community level, SANFL level and the AFL.

U15 METRO & COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

In season 2024 we had two sides represent the Norwood Football Club in the July school holidays as part of the State U15 Championships. Both teams showed a competitive nature and competed hard over the three-day carnival, the metro side was coached by Norwood Senior Men's player Declan Hamilton and the country team by Michael Curtis. These Championships gave us a great opportunity to see where our players will be in six months time when many of them will represent Norwood at U16 SANFL level. The players had the opportunity to hear from Norwood junior and current Port Adelaide AFL player Logan Evans. He spoke about the importance of our programs and what the Norwood junior program did for him to make a fast transition into AFL life.

In season 2024, three players from our region were chosen to play in the SA U15 Schoolboy championships that were played on the Gold Coast.

U14 SANFL SEASON

In season 2024 the SANFL introduced a new seven-game shortened season starting in February. Most clubs with close country regions picked a squad of 30 and used their best sides over this program. We unfortunately could only pick a metro side due to the travel from the Eyre Peninsula being too far. Through the help of the North Adelaide Football Club we were able to play our regional game against their Regional Zone in Whyalla, where we selected a full team made up of EP talent. This was a huge success as 60 players were able to wear the Norwood guernsey. We won one game and lost six, but the kids were very competitive. We look forward to season two of this format.

U13 DEVELOPMENT SQUADS

Norwood's U13 Development Squad was coached by Norwood senior player Jayden Gale. The squad started with 65 players, and was eventually cut down to 35. From there they attended one training session per week and played two matches. This is the first step in selection for the 2025 U14 season, it provided us more opportunity to focus on the fundamentals of the players. We also were treated to playing against an indigenous side from the Eyre Peninsula, which was a huge success. The squad in December was cut back to 30 and this will be our U14 squad for 2025.

WHEELCHAIR

2024 saw Norwood's SANFL Wheelchair Football League side make a huge improvement on the previous 2023 season. The Redlegs turned around a winless 2023 campaign, to have its best season since

the inaugural season back in 2021. The club registered four wins across the nine-round home and away season, and played off in their second Grand Final (2021 and 2024).

Norwood had a big pre-season, welcoming new players including State representative and experienced former Woodville-West Torrens player Chris Simpson, and focussed on fitness, positioning and gelling as a group. The Redlegs also had a non-playing coach for the first time in David Gould, which made a big difference. The strong pre-season had an immediate impact come Round 1, when Norwood registered a 16-point win over Central District. It was clear that this would be a different season to the last.

There was a clear standout team in the Eagles, who went through the season undefeated, but Norwood improved against them each outing and also had great battles with Sturt and the Bulldogs. At the end of the minor round season, the Redlegs sat in second on the table with a 4-5 win-loss record.

This qualified Norwood for the Grand Final against the Eagles, which was always going to be a tough challenge. Woodville-West Torrens claimed the Premiership with a 15.4-94 to 7.4-46 win against the highly competitive Redlegs. Despite the result on the final day, it was great to see the level of improvement across the board, and the buy-in from all players to get better each week. We are looking forward to seeing what this group can do in 2025 and moving forward.

FINANCE REPORT

On behalf of the Board and management, I have great pleasure in presenting the Norwood Football Club Incorporated and controlled entities financial report for the year ending 31 October 2024.

FINANCE REPORT

The 2024 financial year result to be reported by the club is a net surplus of \$608,155.

Despite generating a surplus of \$608,155, after necessary adjustments, the final result was in deficit. The financial challenges in 2024 remained significant, with rising costs and ongoing difficulties in increasing revenue. Like many organisations, the football club has felt the impact of the cost-of-living crisis. While revenue from the Wolf Blass Community Centre provided some support, and investments in oval lighting and LED ribbon signage helped attract external events such as Gather Round and AFLW, these efforts were not enough to offset the financial pressures we faced.

THE NORWOOD FOOTBALL CLUB INCORPORATED

Attendances at Coopers Stadium were very similar compared to 2023. We are not satisfied with simply

having similar crowd numbers each year. We have invested a great deal of time and have strategies to build this in 2025. The game day experience is critical, and we need people to attend, enjoy the entertainment and allow us to increase the income.

Facility improvement remains on the agenda and the investment often pays dividends. Membership levels were down slightly by 4.3%, which was disappointing. Like ground attendance we have invested and created strategies to have some positive movement in membership for 2025. Membership is critical to our club, and we aim to get this back to 3,000 in 2025. This is a 14% increase, and we realise it is a challenge, but we have over 20,000 on our database, so we need to convert just 2% of them into members and we will achieve this membership goal. Sponsorship was sound, however it appears significantly higher which relates to the significant sponsorship from Valio in connection to the supply and installation of the LED stadium lights and the LED boundary ribbon. The value of this will be recognised over two years. We have further plans to replace the current small screen on The Parade with a much larger LED screen that will allow us to generate new advertising revenue streams.

Merchandise sales for 2024 were \$157,000 compared to \$212,000 in 2023. These sales would have been significantly higher if we were successful on Grand Final day.

THE REDLEGS CLUB INCORPORATED

The performance of our Gaming Venue was outstanding in 2024. Gaming revenue improved, being up by 7.8%. Food and beverage was slightly down by 2.3% with an appropriate gross profit margin. We continued to update the gaming machines and we now have 38 ticket in, ticket out machines. As stated in previous years The Nor East committee is full of experienced operators helping the club to provide a terrific facility. The Nor East is important to the football operations and provides critical funds to all junior and senior football teams.

Function Income from the Wolf Blass Community Centre ("WBCC") was up 21% from business lunches, general functions and events. Beer booth and kiosk sales were up 34%. We were able to improve on our income from the AFL Gather Round games held at Coopers Stadium, generating significantly higher food and beverage income. It is fantastic that members and supporters are enjoying having facilities to utilise. It is important that we have further improvement in 2025, built around successful football performances and continually getting better at managing the venue. We changed the way we operated our kitchen in June 2024, employing our own kitchen staff and we expect this to improve the financial performance of the function centre further in 2025.



137 THE PARADE TRUST, 581 NORTH EAST TRUST AND 583 NORTH EAST TRUST

The Net result of the Trusts was a surplus of \$420,046, a 3% decrease compared to the previous year. Rent levels to our tenants remained similar and interest costs remained low due to very low levels of debt. Debt on these buildings remains at \$16,000, this is critical as interest rates remained reasonably high. We can draw down on these loans should the need arise.

Our tenants are under sound leases with industry standard increases. This is a low-risk steady return for our football club.

The surplus is due to the rent collected on The Nor East and rent from the tenants at 581 North East Road, less interest on commercial bills, sundry property maintenance, rates and taxes and other minor sundry items. The surplus is distributed to the Norwood Football Club.

SUMMARY

The Net result of the above entities was a surplus of \$608,155. If we add back depreciation, loss on scrapping of assets and right of use adjustments (\$1,057,214), remove the net deficit of Build the Fort activities (\$14,459), and remove the unique Valio sponsorship deal (\$1,777,545) the result is a deficit of \$97,717.

Everything is crossed that we get to repeat the experience next season and go one better on the field.

ADELAIDE FOOTY LEAGUE FINALS

2024 saw Coopers Stadium host three consecutive weekends of triple headers as the Adelaide Footy League returned to hosting the Division 1 Grand Final on a stand-alone weekend, which this year saw Glenunga go down for a second straight year in both the Division 1 and Division 1 Reserves, with Port Districts winning its second A Grade Premiership in three years at Coopers Stadium.

Almost 10,000 people attended over the three-weekend event (which included the Reserves NFC V Sturt Semi Final), delivering a solid result for the club revenue wise.

OBITUARIES

The Norwood Football Club had a difficult year off the field, with the passing of highly respected and much loved players, administrators and supporters during 2024. Each was highly regarded by the Norwood fraternity and will always be remembered for their passion, commitment and love of the Norwood Football Club.



VALE Walter Miller OAM **11/10/1936 - 16/10/2024**

Few individuals have helped shape the Norwood Football Club more than Wally Miller. His contribution, firstly as a player, and then as an administrator was incredible.

He was a Legend in the Club's Hall of Fame and an NFC Life Member. He was also a SANFL Hall of Famer, and in 2019 received AFL Life Membership for service to Australian Football.

Wally played 64 League matches for Norwood between 1958 and 1961, but on August 5, 1961 his career was cut short due to an injury sustained in a game at Prospect Oval. Shortly after the injury he was diagnosed with poliomyelitis.

While his playing days ended at just 24 years of age, Wally went on to devote himself to Australian Rules Football and in particular, to the Norwood Football Club.

Wally's administration record and list of achievements is almost endless, but includes: playing a major part in the nationwide introduction of modified rules for juniors, and writing a book on the art of kicking. He was Norwood's Promotions Officer in 1968 and 1969 and from 1970 to 1992 he was Secretary Manager/Football Director of the Norwood Football Club, and Match Committee/Selector (1974-1996).

During this period he oversaw the resurgence of the Norwood Football Club as a powerhouse of the SANFL, recording premierships in 1975, 1978, 1982, 1984 and 1997.

Wally Miller was one of the most highly respected members of the Norwood Football Club and the SANFL. A full tribute to Wally can be found on the website, norwoodfc.com.au.

Rest in peace, Wally Miller.

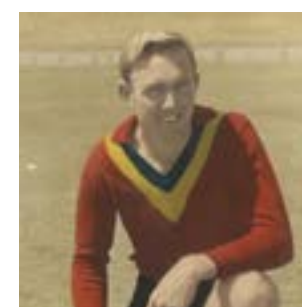

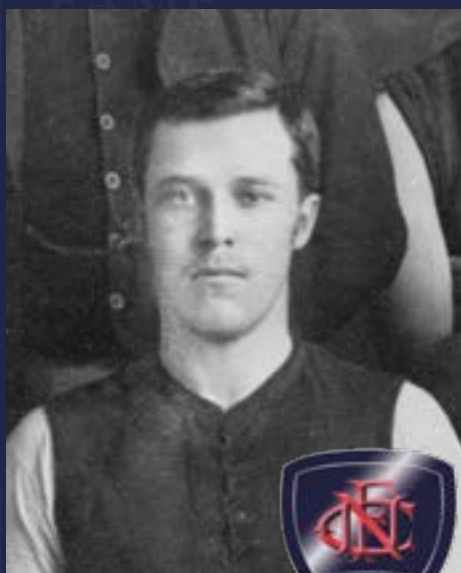

The Norwood Football Club was again fortunate to host two AFL matches as part of the AFL's Gather Round Festival, remaining the only SANFL ground to host a Gather Round match thus far.

Gather Round was into its second season, where all nine AFL matches within the round are played in the State of South Australia.

In the inaugural year of Gather Round in 2023, Norwood Oval hosted two matches, Hawthorn V GWS and Gold Coast V Fremantle which was an outstanding spectacle, great football, and a real sight to see The Parade filled with fans.

The AFL returned to Norwood for the 2024 version of Gather Round, this time with the Brisbane Lions taking on North Melbourne on Friday, April 5, and then Richmond playing St Kilda on Sunday, April 7.

The superstars of the competition were on display at The Parade, with the likes of Richmond superstar Dustin Martin and dual Brownlow Medal-winning Lion Lachie Neale running around on Norwood Oval, and great coaches Alastair Clarkson (North) and Ross Lyon (St Kilda) leading their teams.

Brisbane went on to win the 2024 AFL Premiership, and comfortably took care of the Roos 16.16-112 to 6.6-42 in front of a sell-out 9000-strong crowd.

On Sunday, nearly 9500 people piled into Norwood Oval to see St Kilda edge out Richmond by seven points.

The great aspect of Gather Round is that it's all about access and fan-engagement, with all 18 clubs holding open training sessions with signing and photo opportunities, on top of various clinics, coaching courses and activities throughout the week.

Norwood Oval hosted Brisbane, North, Richmond and St Kilda for their open trainings and clinics, with solid crowds heading to The Parade to catch a glimpse of their favourite players.

The fanfare surrounding the Richmond open training, and particularly the Tigers superstar Dustin Martin had to be seen to be believed.

Once again, the Norwood Football Club and its staff handled Gather Round very well, learnt new things and most of all enjoyed seeing Norwood Oval filled with excited football fans.

The club has again locked in two more games for the 2025 season, with the Western Bulldogs taking on Brisbane on Saturday, April 12, followed by St Kilda playing GWS on Sunday, April 13.

Three clubs have previously visited Norwood, but the club is excited to welcome Marcus Bontempelli and his Bulldogs to The Parade for the first time.

REDLEGS MUSEUM

2024 marked 15 years since the club's History Committee was established in 2009, to preserve and manage the historical resources of the Norwood Football Club and material relating to the history of the Norwood Oval. Since then, over 4000 documents and objects have been catalogued and securely stored, and several thousand photographs have been preserved and digitised.

At long last the club will be able to display much of this invaluable collection in a purpose-built museum for the enjoyment of members, supporters and the general public. Construction of the Redlegs Museum in the Western Stand of Norwood Oval commenced in late 2024 and planning is well underway for the first exhibition in 2025. The former Norwood Oval "Mayor's Parlour" is undergoing a makeover – transforming the space in the Western Stand into a red and blue celebration of the Norwood Football Club's history.

The museum will tell the story of the Norwood Football Club and the stories of the people who have guided the club over its long and colourful history. Themed exhibitions will feature artefacts and memorabilia and utilise the latest interactive technology to display images and video. The museum will be open at various times during the week and weekends and will be available for school and tour groups.

Many of the items that will be on display can be viewed on the Museum Treasures pages on the Redlegs Museum website, www.redlegsmuseum.com.au. The club was recently gratified to receive donations of two outstanding objects for the collection – Lloyd Tugwell's 1936 State guernsey and his 1936 State blazer. Tugwell played 66 games for Norwood from 1933 to 1940 and represented the State on five occasions. In 1936 the

back pocket "Tuggy" featured in two games against Western Australia in Perth for one win and a loss.

The Redlegs Museum website was launched in 2013 and has grown to become one of the foremost football history websites in Australia. Thanks to the tireless efforts of History Committee volunteers the site documents the history of the club and Norwood Oval and includes statistical records, biographical profiles and photographs of the Senior Men's and Women players and the club's SANFL Wheelchair League team. Honour Rolls record the achievements of the League, Reserves, Junior and Women's teams. Club Champions are honoured in the Hall of Fame pages. Players and Officials who served overseas during wartime are remembered on the War Veterans page.

The History Committee would like to acknowledge and remember two people who passed away during the year. Bryan Ridge, who was a long time member of the group and contributed over 150 player profiles to the website. Bryan was always an active participant at meetings and a willing volunteer when material had to be moved and displays arranged. His humour and booming voice at games shall be sadly missed.

In Wally Miller, the History Committee has lost its greatest supporter. A source of infinite knowledge and wisdom, Wally was always available to provide guidance and advice when asked and his razor-sharp memory was often called upon by the group. His legacy includes an anthology of articles and papers that document the events and issues which shaped the club during his time as a player and administrator and will be an invaluable primary source for any future history of the Norwood Football Club.

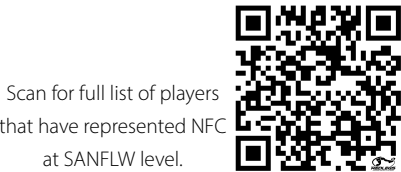

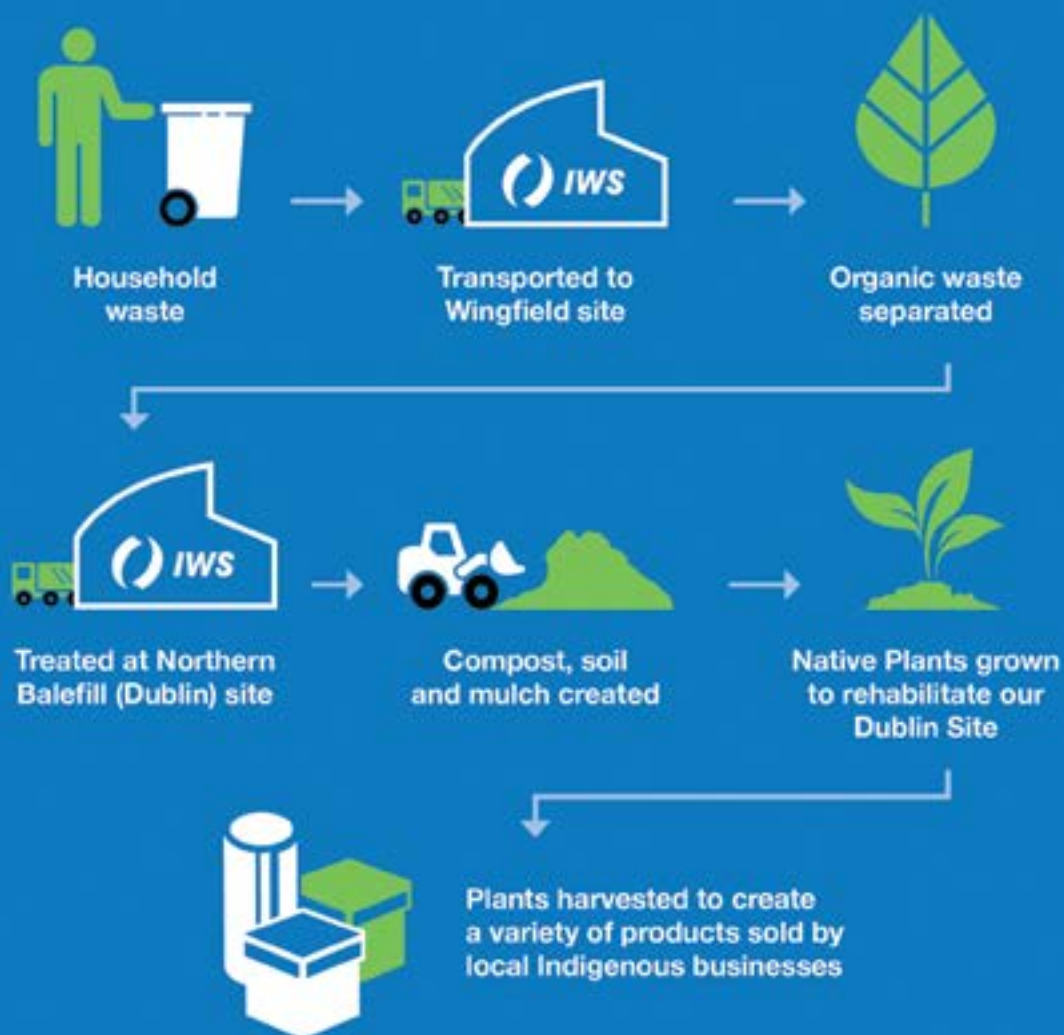
