President's Report

This year has not been an easy one. The challenges that confronted us in 2021 continued to play a large part in the operations of the Club, particularly with continued COVID-related closures in the first half of the year and the pressures on staff in a very tight employment market. The uncertainty in our economy has placed further constraints on our plans to grow revenue and to reduce costs, resulting in a total review of the Club's budget. In particular, the licenced venue has not performed to expectation, although it must be noted that we did start to see better results in the latter part of the year as function bookings began to increase in number. Financial pressures inevitably find their way into our ability to provide adequate funding for football activities. This requires creative and responsible thinking on the part of the Board and Executive to get the right balance between financial sustainability and on-field team success. Despite these challenges, we remain optimistic about the future success of West Adelaide Football Club.

I wish to recognise the hard work and dedication of all staff and volunteers this year. Since CEO Conny Wilson joined us in November 2021 there have been many changes visible as she has begun to implement her plans to re-energise the Club. Our profile in the Riverland zone was elevated significantly with the inaugural Russell Ebert Tribute Match against Port Adelaide in Loxton, and the game against Norwood in Port Lincoln was also a resounding success, helping to build stronger ties with football in our state. We are also working on forging

deeper relationships with our sponsors and supporters, without whom we wouldn't exist. I know that staff and volunteers do all they can to provide valuable experiences at our Club and I thank everyone who is involved in this. Part of this focus is to create better channels of communication with our coterie groups so we are united in achieving the outcomes we set for the Club, and I thank the members of the Westonians, the Past Players and the History Group for their incredible dedication to the success of Westies now and into the future. It has been a real pleasure to work with Conny this year and I sincerely thank her for her tireless dedication to the Club.

During 2022 we welcomed three new Directors onto the Board and also recognised the retirement of Troy Abbott. It has been a pleasure to work with Troy and we offer our sincere thanks for all he did during his service as a Director. In welcoming Chris Schmidt and Tiandra Tamiaans as member-elected Directors. I also look forward to working with Alison Surjan who was appointed in the newly-formed role of Women's Football Director. We have a very strong Board of Directors and I thank them all for the reliable and professional way in which they set the future direction and conduct the affairs of the Club.

In March the Board published our new Strategic Plan to take us through to 2026. It's a very ambitious document and sets very high ideals for the Club. We have held staff engagement sessions to discuss the ways in which staff can show their support for the Plan and the values that it

embodies. We recognise that delivery of each of the outcomes that are set out in the Plan will rely heavily on the formation of sub-committees and working groups and this will be an on-going focus in the months ahead. We have already seen the formation of a Football Operations Review Working Group which was convened by the Board to provide a plan for football. This plan was approved and adopted by the Board in October and the work has now begun on its implementation. I offer my sincere thanks to all those who were part of the Working Group.

We continue to work closely with the City of West Torrens as they instal improvements to the Richmond Oval precinct. It's been great to see the progress on the eastern side of the site as Council nears completion of stage one, which will open up the area to the local community and provide greater opportunities for our Club to interact with residents and their families. Planning for stage two has commenced, and I thank Council for hosting Board visits to a selection of local sporting facilities to seek feedback and ideas for the redevelopment of the grandstand side of the oval. This will be a major project and will require Council to work with both Federal and State governments to bring it to fruition. But it is essential in order to give the Club a facility that provides for the ever-increasing demands of football and associated activities.

I look forward to the year ahead. Thanks to the support of SANFL, sponsors, members and everyone associated with the Club I'm excited about the next twelve

months. Recently, thanks to financial assistance from the Westonians, we've been able to invest in upgrades to our computer infrastructure which will see improvements in our operating efficiencies. We have implemented a revision to membership categories and associated benefits to make it easier for members to choose what suits them best. Our footy zones have been expanded to include the Murraylands. We have a football department with a new look, under the direction of Paul Streatfield with a new Senior Coach in Adam Hartlett. We are ready to face this year with a new energy and a strong vision for the future. I look forward to celebrating our future successes with you all.

Finance Report

In last year's annual report, I stated the 2021/22 financial year would be even more challenging for the Club as the pandemic was far from over, there was an expansion in the number of teams and games to be played and there is limited capacity for additional financial assistance.

In preparing the budget for the 2021/22 financial year, the Board agreed to invest in the Football department as we had returning senior players, more teams, more matches, and more loyal volunteers. We were expecting an improvement in performances in all grades and playing finals. Offsetting the football spend was an expected uplift in trading through the Licensed Club after the general relaxation of Covid restrictions. The consolidated position was still expected to be a material loss.

The result in FY22 was less positive than originally budgeted. The collective Football & Licensed Clubs made an operating loss of \$164,240 (2021: profit \$224,788) after receipt of the SANFL land divestment payment. Whilst the Football Club produced a result in line with budget, the Licensed Club was approximately \$99,000 over budget. This was due to generally poor trading in the first half of the year as there were many changes of staff in the Licensed Club, we again had to close under Covid protocols and had other temporary closures due to inadequate staffing levels. The second half of the year showed much improvement, and we were trading in line with the original budget. In the second half of the year,

there was sound growth in function income, the bistro revenue continued to grow by providing quality meals, and gaming income was modestly growing. Bar trading struggled throughout the year.

As a result of the final SANFL land divestment payment, the Club's indebtedness to NAB has reduced to \$350,000. Also, there has been another positive revaluation of the gaming entitlements, and as a result, the total equity of the Clubs has also improved to \$2,902,738 (2021: \$2,542,428).

The 2022/23 year will be challenging in all areas, both on-field and off-field. We have budgeted to curtail expenditure and be sharper in the areas where we spend the Club's funds. I am expecting capital expenditure and repairs & maintenance issues will place additional pressure of the Club's resources throughout the year.

From a finance perspective, we lost Stacey Quinn at the end of the year and thank her for her efforts in 2022. Again, thank you to everyone who has assisted and patronised the Club in FY22. Your continued loyalty is much appreciated.

These are the times we also formally recognise and thank our members and sponsors – for without you, we have no Club. Your contribution does matter, and has gone a long way in assisting our Club to remain relevant, competitive – even with our backs against the wall, and proud.

Amongst it all we shared some wonderful occasions.

We celebrated our 130th birthday, a very significant milestone to reach as a football club. We fielded a second Women's team in the SANFLW Competition; stood tall as we travelled to our regional zone and hosted the inaugural Russell Ebert Tribute Match in Loxton against Port Adelaide, and our Senior Men demonstrated their fighting power in the back end of the season with some great wins and a couple of very narrow losses.

And there was fun in amongst it all. A hugely successful Back to the 80's night was put on by The Westonsians, our Past Players and Officials group introduced some memorable speakers at their Chew The Fat lunches, culminating with the Claret and Stout event with special guest Kevin Sheedy keeping more than 200 guests entertained with tall stories and tales of mischief and insights. Our Gala Auction was able to raise significant funds that went directly towards the Football Club's operations.

Finally, thank you to the Board for the work and effort that was undertaken in 2022 to ensure the Club continues toward success.

It was a tough year in 2022 for our SANFLW Program. After experiencing the highs of playing off in a Grand Final in 2021, we also experienced the lows of football finishing bottom in 2022 with a record of 1 win – 11 losses.

The program was hindered with 2021 Captain Bec Owen missing the 2022 season as she welcomed her 2nd child and recovered from a broken leg, and without reigning SANFLW Best and Fairest winner Lauren Young as she ruptured her ACL during preseason. The club was excited to introduce Jessica Macolino, the experienced midfielder made her way to Richmond after spending time at Norwood. We also welcomed ex-West Coast Eagle Beatrice Devlyn, which provided our young squad with plenty of experience heading into the season.

With Bec Owen missing the year, meant we needed to welcome in a new Captain to lead the girls through the 2022 season. Madi Russell was voted in by her peers to take the mantle and did a fantastic job in her first year. Madi was joined by Ashlea James who was voted in as Vice-Captain, and Nicole Hooper, Tiarna Harfield, Jessica Macolino and Keeley Kustermann completed the leadership team.

The club was also excited at the introduction of the SANFLW Development League, which meant being able to offer more women the opportunity to play in West Adelaide colours. The Development Squad was coached by Michael Wakim who had just come off a stint coaching in our U16 girls' program, joined by Damien Venning as midfield coach, Kelly Barltrop as forward coach.

Mark Moody again took the helm as Senior Coach of our SANFLW team, with Michael Sweatman retaining his role as forward coach, Troy Wilkey moving into the Midfield and Talia Radan joining our coaching team as defensive coach.

Madi Russell had a big year in her first year as Captain taking the League Best and Fairest, with Beatrice Devlyn and Maddy Zacher rounding out the Top 3.

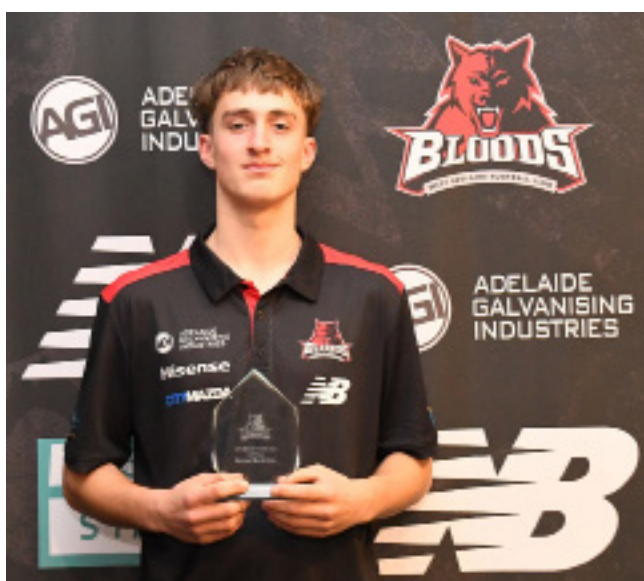

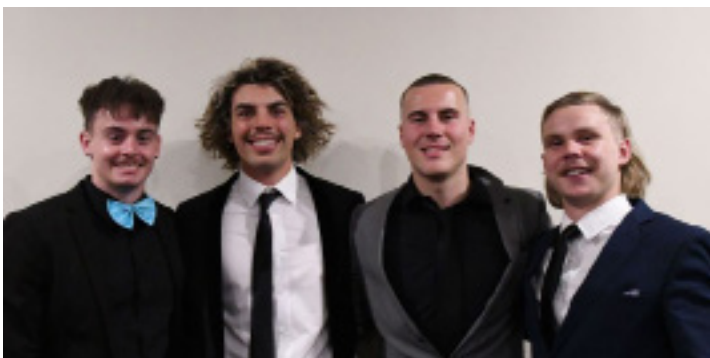
