

A club with a colourful history, West Adelaide was formed in 1892. The club won two Parklands Premierships prior to 1897 and has since collected nine SANFL League Premierships. Added to these highlights are two Champions of Australia titles against Essendon and Carlton, two SANFL Cup Premierships 1985 & 1987 and the first SANFL club to win the National Foxtel Cup Premiership in 2013.

Boasting 14 Magarey Medal winners and 136 State Players, the Bloods also lay claim to some of the greatest names in SA Football history. Club legends like Dick Head, Bruce McGregor, Neil Kerley and Brian Faehse donned the red and Black. We have four time Ken Farmer Medalist in Adam Richardson and the club holds the honour of having the first Bronlow Medal winner from SA in Bernie Smith. This award has since been won by Westies Adam Cooney and of course Mark Ricciuto.

There have been colourful characters like Jack Broadstock and Doug Thomas, as well as greats like Fos Williams, Grantley Fielke, Tony Modra, Mark Mickan and Shaun Rehn.

In May Murray Forbes retired from the role as President and I was approached to complete his term until the AGM, at which time I would decide whether to re-nominate for the role. I would like to thank Murray Forbes for his unwavering commitment to the Club and the efforts he, and retiring Finance Director Mark Goddard gave to West Adelaide, our players and Members.

After accepting the role for that short term, I knew that there were some critical projects to be undertaken. The City of West Torrens is embarking on the redevelopment of the Richmond Oval. A committee, Andrew Tickle, Conny Wilson and myself (Chris Schmidt added recently) was set up to work with Council to ensure this project occurred and benefited West Adelaide. It includes the sale of our Clubrooms to Council who will build new Clubrooms on the Western side of the oval. I believe the project will take 3 to 5 years to complete. With this in mind, our Strategic Plan required reviewing and modification. During this short period,we have reviewed the Plan and will release it shortly. It will outline the direction the Club will take in 2024 and beyond.

Financially, we are working to build a model that reflects a sustainable approach to the way we do business, cater for our members and sponsors, as well as having the flexibility to attract key players to our Club. My aproach is that we cannot continue to do the same thing every year and expect a different result, therefore a new look West Adelaide in a new facility with a plan to maximize gaming revenue needed to be considered and worked towards. Andrew Tickle, our newly appointed Finance Director will outline further information in his report. I believe we are in excellent hands with Andrew and thank him for his assistance throughout my term.

2023 saw the new Football Plan put in place with Chris Schmidt, Conny Wilson and Paul Streatfield's input. Adam Hartlett is charged to deliver it. The benefits can be seen through all our teams, both men and women as we improved this year with competitive teams that move the ball quickly across the ground. I am confident that if we continue to stay the course the club will become stronger on the field. I would like to thank Chris Schmidt, Paul Streatfield and all the Coaches, staff and volunteers within the Football Program.

The Licensed Club continues to be the area that we focus on. Costs have been reduced and while bar revenue still needs considerable work, the Function Room has improved our position, particularly since the introduction of Bingo. We have 2,700 sqm of building which has significant costs associated with it to remain open for trading. We need to find ways to increase our return or a better operating model.

The Westonians, Past Players and Officials and the History Group have an important role at West Adelaide as they are our key Coterie groups that assist in bonding the players, sponsors, members and supporters of our club while raising funds. I would like to thank the Westonians for their donation of nearly \$39,000 to the Club in a challenging environment. Thank you to the Past Players & Officials Committee for their great work in assisting the Club. The History Group continue to collect and store many hundreds of thousands of dollars of memorabilia and I look forward to their expanding collection.

Unfortunately, I have decided that I will not seek to nominate for the Presidency of the Football Club past the AGM. Firstly, my work as a sole professional makes it difficult to commit to the time required to fulfil the role, and secondly, for personal reasons that require my attention over the longer term. I would like to thank the Board, Conny and the administration for their support, tireless work ethic, long hours, and wish the coaches, players and volunteers throughout the club for the 2024 season a successful season. I would also like to thank Bradley Abraham and Tiandra Tamiaans who retired from the Board in November, and Marteine Edwards who will not seek re-election.

While I will not be continuing as President, I have over 45 years involvement at West Adelaide and will keep supporting the Club and it's Community from the sidelines to assist in the redevelopment of Richmond Oval, and any other areas that I can contribute towards. Finally, my passion for West Adelaide has never wavered, and would like to thank the SANFL, Sponsors, Members and our entire Community that shares my enthusiasm in making this Club a proud and successful participant in the SANFL.



The 2023 financial year represented another challenging year for our Club. We have shared a similar experience to many in our community with increasing day to day costs impacting our result for the year. The combined result of the Football and Licensed Clubs was a loss of \$342,053 compared to a loss in the prior year of \$164,240 in 2022. The 2022 year saw the final receipt of the SANFL land divestment payment of \$300,000, offset in 2023 by an increased SANFL distribution of \$150,000.

Whilst this means that the past two years results are broadly comparable when these amounts are excluded, continued loss making at this level is not sustainable. As you should expect, our refreshed Club strategy has sustainable financial performance at its core. We are focused on putting in place projects, processes and activities that will enable us to build a sound foundation for our Club and that put us in a position to invest in our purpose, delivering on a football program that you can be proud of.

As we have navigated these challenges, there have been positive markers that our plans are achievable. The Licensed Club has grown its revenue by approximately 18% in a year where hospitality across our state continues to be tested. Our objective for 2024 is to hold the standard of hospitality and service that is clearly bringing increased

foot traffic to our venue whilst managing our costs down to an industry standard to capitalise on this momentum. Within the Football operations we continue to juggle the need for financial sustainability with the desire to invest across all areas of the Club. While the biggest opportunity improve financial performance to lays in the Licensed Club side, we are also keen to ensure that our membership and sponsorship offerings provide mutual value and ongoing connection to our Club. We will continue to work in this area.

Thanks to all who have contributed and supported our Club throughout the year, it is the backbone of our Club. We have an incredibly committed off-field team across all areas, however in the finance area I would like to specifically call out Conny Wilson and Sean Nicholas's contribution. I would also like to note our gratitude for the support of the SANFL across the year. There is no doubt 2024 will present new tests and the need for tough, calculated decisions. Equally, there are opportunities and significant room for progress. We look forward to tackling them head on with your support.

I am pleased to present the CEO report for the year 2023. It has been an extremely busy year, both on and off the field. Our 'stronger together' club value is what has guided our work and inspired our people to achieve the outcomes that we strive for; to be a successful, admired and resilient SANFL League club. This year the Club has made significant strides to improve the on-field performance of our teams, experiences of our players, engagement of our members and acknowledging the value of many volunteers. We have also worked to build the patronage of the Bar and Bistro and create a welcoming and, family friendly social environment.

We have been constantly working toward strengthening our internal structure, our governance and our financial resources, while still retaining our identity and building our connection with community.

There have been many significant changes throughout 2023. Murray Forbes, retired as President in May, while Finance Director Mark Goddard retired in April, both having served near four years. I would like to thank them both for the time and commitment they put into the Club. Thank you to John Kantilaftas who stepped into the role of President and Andrew Tickle who has taken on the Finance Director role.

We welcomed two new Senior Coaches -Adam Hartlett and Bruce Dawes to the Club; Talent Manager and U 18's Coach Russell Godson to the Football Department. Paul Streatfield won the position of Head of Football while Shane Baldock was appointed League Reserves Coach. Michael Wakim will continue as Development Coach for the Women.

The Club travelled to Loxton again for the Russell Ebert Tribute Match and then honoured Neil Kerley as we took on the Crows in Murray Bridge. We took home the Teakle Cup after defeating Norwood in Pt Lincoln. Our regions are important to us and supporting them is supporting our community. Our Women's teams are also continuing to develop and we look forward to what they can produce in 2024.

We welcomed new players and we farewelled those who had either retired or went in search of new opportunities. I would like to thank Jono Beech for his services to the Club, as well as recognise Ron Manning who has served

this Club for 23 years. Lisa Dunstall joined the team taking care of our administration and Membership, while Phil Reilly has settled into his role as Venue Operations Manager in the Bar and Bistro. We also welcomed Sean Nicholas as our SANFL Shared Services Finance Manager.

Member outcomes are always a chief consideration and deserve considerable focus. A number of events were delivered during the year and engagement from past players, members and the sponsors was something to be proud of. A special thank you to Bernie Conlen and the PP&O committee for the many hours and hard work that was needed to make the '83 reunion dinner and other functions such a success. Our Chew the Fat lunches also featured speakers from that year, and our numbers continue to grow. Thanks Nicky Dee and John Flanigan for all your work hard work.

In 2023 Mark Mickan was officially recognised as a Legend of the West Adelaide Football Club. Delivering a humorouos and heartfelt speech, Mark left the stage to resounding applause. Life membership was presented to the following: Aaron Anderson, Tom Keough, Matthew Matchoss, Mike Memmler, Kaine Stevens and Richard Sykes. Congratulations on this achievement.

BL Shipway presented the Celebration of Football Luncheon during the inaugural Gather Round and that too, was a big success contributing to our fundraising in 2023. The Westonians were active helping greatly with fundraising including their annual raffle. Doug Allen and Graeme Barton were integral to the success, while Kristen Demetriou and Tiandra Tamiaans presented the 90's night. The History Group was always on hand to assist with queries, follow ups and building the memorabilia and knowledge of our past to share with all.

2023 was a milestone year for our partnership with Adelaide Galvanising Industries. We celebrated 21 years with our longest serving sponsor of the Club. Thank you for your ongoing generosity and support. Hisense, our Oval Naming Rights sponsor also deserves a mention as they too, continue to give to our Club. Many individuals sponsored players, donated time to help raise funds. We thank you and all our sponsors for your unwavering support in 2023.

We are posting regularly on our website and the quality of our newsletters is improving with every edition. We have received very positive feedback -it is always important to us, and welcome suggestions and ideas.

Hisense Stadium also hosted the Amateur League finals which brought approximately 5,000 spectators to the Club to watch enjoyable football and visit the Bar and Bistro. Collingwood used Hisense Stadium for training during Gather Round.

Rotary West Torrens generously donated a new defibrillator that is mounted in the front bar. West Adelaide is lucky enough to have a fantastic group of committed and competent volunteers. To each and every one of you, on behalf of the board and staff, I would like to thank you for your service. I would also like to thank SANFL for their assistance in 2023. Along with all our partners, we appreciate and value your contribution and belief in our Club.

To the staff of West Adelaide, thank you for the hard work and commitment you have demonstrated. Your dedication, time and energy is admirable and often goes unrecognised. I would like to thank the Board of Directors for their work. Murray, Mark, Bradley, Tiandra and Marteine, I wish you all the best and look forward to seeing you at Westies in 2024.

Looking ahead, we will release our 2024 Strategic Plan to members, which will guide us for the next four years. This is an ambitious planning document, with measurable Key Performance Indicators (KPIs). I want to express my gratitude to our Board, our dedicated team, players, partners, and stakeholders for their unwavering support. In Round 1, Senior Coach Adam Hartlett and wife Sarah were busily welcoming their third daughter Elke into the world while Senior Assistant Coach Ryan Anderson travelled to Prospect for the start of the 2024 Season. It's probably fitting that the season began this way for Adam, as he has been tasked with leading a group of emerging talent for the years to come, branded by many as the 'Baby Bloods'. With an average age of under 21, this describes a youthful energetic group that love the club and are journeying together.

There were also changes during the off-season. Retirements from players including Tom Keough, Logan Hill and Hamish Hartlett (amongst others) meant that 2024 was always going to lead to new opportunities for younger players, and with that, a glimpse at what should be an exciting future ahead for the club. 14 players made their debut in 2023, half of these being local zoned talent which has been a focus for our club moving forward. None of these debutants looked out of place and showed they are more than capable at the level. The 2023 season overall is one that both excited and frustrated us at the same time. SANFL is a quality competition. The gap between the top and bottom sides is closing each year. This happened all too often this year with some slow starts costing us; patches of quarters that saw the opposition gain momentum. Closing the gaps of these ups and downs comes with game experience and confidence, which will only continue to improve as this list develops together. Josh Ryan capped off an outstanding season by winning the Neil Kerley Medal. At times defenders don't get the recognition they deserve, but Josh has shown he is one of the best players in the competition and he is an integral part of our club. Hamish Ellem and Callum Park both played 50 SANFL games, highlighting the impact they've had on the competition to date.

For the second year running we were privileged to play in Loxton against Port Adelaide for the Russell Ebert Cup. Recent SANFL boundary changes resulted in the River Murray Football League being assigned to us, and we were thrilled to honour Neil Kerley in Round 16 when we played Adelaide in Murray Bridge. To honour these football legends and also venture out to our country zones is very important for us and we look forward to this continuing in 2024.

The end of the 2023 season has brought about some inevitable player movement. Without naming all players that are departing, we pass on our best wishes to Michael Mattingly who advised us mid-season that he would be returning home to continue the next chapter of his life. Michael has been an excellent contributor to our club since joining us for the 2022 season and his runner-up finish in the Neil Kerley Medal this year highlights his impact. We of course need to thank Jonathon Beech on an outstanding career and for his overall contribution to South Australian football. fully understand that it's time for Jono to move on to the next phase. Thankyou all for your continued support of the club. I hope you can see that we have a clear path of where we are heading and have a team of players, volunteers and staff that are all committed to getting there together. We look forward to seeing you again in 2024.

2023 saw a fresh start for our SANFLW program as we farewelled previous Head Coach Mark Moody at the conclusion of 2022, and appointed ex-Sturt SANFLW coach Bruce Dawes 2023. Along with a change in Head Coach, we also welcomed some new Assistant Coaches to the program. Raymond Billing joined the program as Defensive coach for our **SANFLW** program, and Damien Venning moved up from Development League Midfield coach to taking over the SANFLW midfield. Janet Bradley (Dev League Midfield), Matt Bedford (Dev League Forward) and ex-SANFLW Captain Lauren Gee (Dev League Defense) all joined Michael Wakim (Dev League Head Coach) worked within our SANFLW Development League Coaching team.

We were also fortunate enough to welcome a couple new faces to the playing group, notably ex-Richmond and Collingwood AFLW player, Iilish Ross, and young tall Tess Huxtable joined us from South Adelaide. Speedy outside mid Paige Allan joined us from Central District. Milli Gentle rounded out the recruits with previous experience, spending a year playing in Canberra. We were also fortunate enough to welcome Port Adelaide star, Gemma Houghton to the program after being allocated to us though the SANFLW Mini Draft for interstate AFLW players. Madison Russell was voted by her peers as Captain for a second season, while Bec Hansen was voted in as our 2023 Vice Captain. Leadership group was rounded out by some experienced players in Jessica Macolino, Nicole Hooper, Tiarna Harfield, Paris Francis, Iilish Ross and Milli Gentle.



After finishing 8th in 2022, our season started in a positive way. We beat 2021 premiers Glenelg in Round 1, and followed up with a victory against the reigning premiers North Adelaide to start our season in а perfect way. Unfortunately, week is a long time in football, and the following week having only lost by 2 points, we also suffered a big set

back with 3 players suffering season ending injuries. Captain Madi Russell and Paige Allan suffered ACL injuries, while prolific ball winner Jess Macolino suffered a dislocated shoulder that required surgery. Two further ACL injuries to midfield Zoe Greer and AFLW player Hannah Button, a knee injury to Vice Captain Bec Hansen, ankle injury to State U18 representative Lucy Boyd and a season ending injury to exciting forward Tabby Saville meant that we were forced to test our depth early on in the season.

We were able to give some of our junior footballers an opportunity at SANFLW level which meant we debuted 15 new players in 2023.

Unfortunately, we started the season on 2 wins, and the season finished out that way after narrowly missing out on opportunities, including a draw against Woodville and an agonising 1-point loss to Sturt. However, despite the wins and losses, the team remained upbeat, positive and determined to go out each week and compete against quality opposition.

It was a big year for Zoe Venning, who took out her 2nd West Adelaide Football Club Best and Fairest after a strong year, Zoe also finished 2nd in the SANFLW Medal Count falling only 2 votes short of winning the prestigious award. She is also the first player to reach 50 SANFLW games for West Adelaide. Young Gun Lauren Young finished 2nd and new recruit lilish Ross rounded out the Top 3. While Annie Brearley took out our Development League Best and Fairest, up and comer Molly Petersen finished 2nd and Scarlett Griffiths finished 3rd.

We're already gearing up to a really positive 2024, with Bruce Dawes having signed on as Head Coach again for the next season. The girls are looking fit and determined to change the results of the last couple of years and again establish ourselves as one of the top teams in the SANFLW.



However, the players demonstrated remarkable resilience and adaptability, transitioning smoothly under the leadership of interim Head Coach Paul Hollands. Throughout the season, player development remained a top priority. This commitment was evident in the team's growth and ultimately contributed to their impressive run to the Preliminary Final.

The Under 18 squad faced a challenging season in 2023. A significant change in game style, focusing on adapting to the senior level at WAFC, presented a steep learning curve.

Despite comfortable wins in the early trial games, the team faced several heavy losses, testing their resilience and character. The feeling of not gaining results despite their hard work was undoubtedly frustrating.

However, we rotated players throughout the season and gained valuable insights into their adaptability and making decisions in regards to progressing in higher programs which was very fruitful. It's important to note the individual and collective development of the players, particularly in the back half of the season where they won 3 of their last 5 games. This demonstrates their resilience and commitment to improvement.

While the challenges were substantial, the Under 18 squad showed remarkable growth throughout the season. Their dedication to learning and adapting will serve them well in the years to come.

President's report

The History Group has been busy with the storing and cataloguing of items with regular working sessions held on Thursdays. Bob Loveday (259 games over 16 seasons) loaned his many team photographs and have been scanned. We are working toward having a digital library of team photographs. A number of significant photographs and guernseys are now displayed in the Front Bar area of the Club including "The Oxygents" showing the great Tom Leahy in ruck against Norwood in the 1908 Grand Final. The Oxygents being the Norwood players who were administered oxygen at half time by the club dentist supposedly to enhance their performance: the Bloods won the game by 3 points and went on to defeat Carlton by 29 points to become Champions of Australia.

The History Group has lost two valuable members, Bob Reidy and Luke Jamieson. After roles as League Assistant Property Manager and Reserves Time Keeper, Bob came to us and immediately became our 'go to' person with anything relating to computing. Luke had red and black blood coursing through his veins. He was an inaugural member whose knowledge of club memorabilia, assistance on valuation days and presence around the club will be greatly missed.

The heartland and spiritual home of the West Adelaide Football Club was the West End of Adelaide. In 1911 after winning the premiership and beating Essendon to become Champions of Australia, the manager of the West End Brewery chose to adopt the black and red colours of the Bloods as those of the brewery the nickname 'The Bottletops' soon followed. Our early players, administrators, volunteers and supporters hailed from the

West End. The History Group is conscious of the need to capture memories from this diminishing group. We aim to map the West End showing where those families lived and their connection to the Club. Rod Sutherland has taken on this enormous task and already has a list of names and has spoken with 'West Enders'.

The West Torrens Historical Society held their June meeting at the Club after which Doug spoke briefly about the history of the Club and some of the personalities. As a consequence of this meeting, a volunteer for Virtual the War Memorial Australia has listed our veterans honour board. This can be viewed at vwma.org.au/explore/memorials/10632 In October, the SANFL History Centre hosted a meeting of history groups from the league in the Westonian Lounge allowing the sharing of ideas and for them to see the Bloods Hall of Fame and Mark Beswick Room.

Hall of Fame presentation night in August saw Mark Mickan elevated to Legend status and Tony Burgess, Chris Schmidt, Jason Porplyzia and Daniel Caire inducted into the Hall of Fame.

Steve Tzoumas and Graeme Barton, reframed our Hall of Fame recipients and provided a new hanging system giving a smarter appearance to the display cabinet.

During the year, a number of old metal player lockers were recovered from West Torrens Council storage. These were offered to the most recent player whose name appeared on the locker which subsequently raised funds for the History Group.

Thank you to the many people who made donations to the History Group. Grant Hudson for the 1961 Premiership pennant adorned with membership badges and red and black ribbons. David Shipway for Ken Eustice framed display, 1947 team photograph and other items, David Ellis for West Suburban Football Club photograph, Eugene Byrne for boxed premiership commemorative port and Magarey Medallist port, Peter Stoll for Premiership dinner and Review programmes, Sue Carn for photographs, Hallett Shueard for Football Budgets and other items and Robbie Donaldson for membership badges.

Annual Reports are one of our most useful research resources but we don't have copies of reports from 1922, 23, 24, 30 and 1931. We have none prior to 1908 and cannot be sure if annual reports were even printed. We would greatly appreciate donation of either the reports or digital copies of the same.

Jos Dailey captained the Premiership and Champions of Australia team in 1908 and went on to captain the Bloods to 3 more Premierships. Following the Champions of Australia win in 1911 against Essendon, the players unanimously voted him the recipient of a cup engraved, "Presented by D. H. McDougall Esq to Mr Jose Dailey Captain West Adelaide Football Club Champions of Australia for Able Generalship Season 1911." We are most grateful for the assistance given by Nick Karasoulos in facilitating in the purchase of this cup and a photograph album with various football and personal photographs. The cup (pictured) is displayed in a cabinet in the Front Bar area.

I thank John Duggan for his ongoing work as our Historian and Statistician and for the many hours he contributes in researching enquiries, Richard Sellers for his Secretarial role, Rod Sutherland for the ongoing West End project, Robbie Donaldson, Hallett Shueard and Lincoln Tyner for their efforts particularly on work sessions and Graeme Barton for the many tasks which go unnoticed. Thanks also to the front office staff for all of their help, especially Lisa Dunstall, Josh Ryan and Conny Wilson.
