The 2024 financial year replicated our on-field performance. We enjoyed some highs, rode some lows, didn't finish where we would have liked but with still plenty of room to improve. Our consolidated result improved to a loss of \$254,164 compared to \$360,397 in the 2023 year. Whilst the recording of any loss is rarely pleasing, the improvement year on year should be acknowledged.

The improved consolidated result is predominately down to our licensed club performance. We have experienced another year of revenue growth which has been driven by a full year of bingo sessions. We expanded from one to two sessions part way through the year to continue to grow this revenue stream. These revenues were classified as other income in the previous year but have been moved within functions given their significance. Our gaming started the year very strongly, operating at nearly 20% up on the prior year but flagged towards the end of the year.

On the cost side of the venue, we have made significant improvement to our stock management which has seen our margins approach industry standards. We have reclassified costs this year, removing the administration category and including an occupancy costs category. This incorporates the costs of keeping the venue operating together with the rental charge from the Football Club.

Our challenge in the venue is the wage cost. We have endeavored to the run the Club as leanly as possible, whilst trying to meet legal and service standards. The increase this year is reflective of the increase in the base rate that we are required to pass on, together with some additional wage costs required to deliver the bingo program.

It is becoming increasingly clear that the venue is not capable of generating the sufficient revenue to justify the current level or structure of operations. The relocation of our gaming machines will be a significant priority for the 2025 year. This relocation will have some flow on impact onto how and when our venue operates which will mean change for our members and community. In implementing any change, we will be focused on balancing issues like opening hours/operating times with the need to be financially sustainable.

The Football Club operations continue to be generally stable. Cost control and management is the most significant area in which we can improve, and we have set a budget that intends to capture these.

Thank you to our members and sponsors for your continuing support, whether that be directly contributing to the Football Club program, frequenting the venue or getting along on game day. We continue to work hard to secure our Club's future.

Finally, I'd like to acknowledge the work of our staff, whether directly related to the finance sphere or in the broader team your dedication and effort to the Club. It has been a challenging year, particularly with the unexpected and tragic loss of Sean Nicholas. A special note of thanks to CEO, Conny Wilson, I value your energy and drive to move our Club forward.



The team arrived well-prepared for preseason training, thanks to the strength and conditioning program designed by Joel Dunstan, during the off-season. Many players achieved personal bests in our 1.6km time trials, with Olivia Smith leading the pack—a fantastic outcome. We welcomed 21 new players from the 2023 season, which meant a lot of effort was required to bring them up to speed with our game plans and structures. Additionally, we saw the return of several players recovering from injuries, including four coming off ACL surgeries.

The season began on a high note with three consecutive wins, including an exhilarating after-the-siren goal by Emma Kilpatrick to secure a narrow victory over South Adelaide, the eventual premiers. During these initial rounds, we also introduced three new league players to the club: Brooke Smith from the Adelaide Crows, Emily Mableson from our junior program, and Jemma Ellis, who joined us from South Adelaide. All three proved to be valuable additions.

The subsequent three games included a solid win against North Adelaide at Prospect, followed by two narrow losses: one to Glenelg at the Bay, where we started strong but couldn't maintain the lead, and another close six-point defeat to Central Districts at home, which could have gone either way.

With our finals hopes still within reach, we faced South Adelaide at Noarlunga, losing by just one point to the eventual premiers, and then fell to Sturt by two points in a crucial game the following week. To keep our finals chances alive, we needed to win our last two games. We achieved a convincing win against the Eagles, featuring the debut from a patient Nicola Biagi. With favourable results elsewhere, a win against Norwood in the final round would have secured a finals spot. Unfortunately, we suffered our fifth defeat by six points or less of the season, missing out on the finals by just one game.

Overall, the season marked a significant improvement from last year. We had a strong contingent of young players who showed great development, with five girls—Lucy Boyd, Asha Dufour, Ruby Ballard, Emma Kilpatrick, and Chloe Tonkin—selected for the state under-18 program. Additionally, five juniors from the West Adelaide Football Club made the State U16 team. Some other individual successes we were able to celebrate as a team were the selection of Zoe Venning and Hannah Button in the first State Women's team that defeated a Western Australian team in Perth. We also had 5 girls who made the State Under 23 team that won against the State 18 girls, they included Zoe Venning, Olivia Smith, Tess Huxtable, Georgie Pater and Jemma Ellis.







In its early years and for many years after, the heartland and spiritual home of the West Adelaide Football Club was the West End of Adelaide. Much has changed since those early days, but one thing that has remained is the enduring contribution from this Club to the great game fo Australian Rules Football.

A club with a colourful history, West Adelaide was formed in 1892. After winning two 'Parklands' Priemierships, it was admitted to the SA Foottball Association (SANFL) in 1897. Since then, it has collected nine Premierships, including four in five years from 1908 to 1912 with two 'Champions of Australia' victories amongst them. Four Advertiser Cups were added between 1955 and 1962, the last leading to the club retaining the trophy. Two SANFL Cup Premierships in 1985 and 1987, and the first SANFL club to win the National Foxtel Cup Premiership in 2013.

Adam Richardson is four times Ken Farmer leading goalkicker medalist, and Peter Phipps in 1957. Roger Luders, in 1983, was our first player to kick 100 goals in a season.

Boasting 13 Magarey Medal winners and 138 League State Players, which for the first time includes 2 of our Women State League players, the Bloods also lay claim to some of the greatest names in SA Foootball history. Club legends like Dick Head, dual Magarey Medalist - Bruce McGregor, Neil Kerley and Brian Faehse left their mark across the code. The club holds the honour of having the first Bronlow Medal winner from SA in Bernie Smith. This award has since been won by former club players, Adam Cooney, Mark Ricciuto and Patrick Dangerfield.

All Australian Blazers have been worn by Jack Lynch, Stan Costello, Neil Kerley, Don Roach, Robert Day, Geoff Morris and Craig Williams. Bruce Lindner (1987-88), Mark Mickan (1988) also gained All Australian honours from State of Origin Carnivals.

Alot can be written and told about our abundance of colourful characters and their contribution to the club. The Club is proud to count as their own such individuals as Doug Thomas, Jack Broadstock, Fos Williams, Grantley Fielke, Tony Modra, Mark Mickan and Shaun Rehn, to name a few.

The recent year's addition of the Women's team is positively enhancing our club and we look forward to their continuing presence and contribution to our Club history.

Of course we are powerfully appreciative of our support workers, administrators, loyal members, and supporters whose contribution make up 'The West Adelaide Football Club'.
