MARKETING & PARTNERSHIPS REPORT

2021 looked once again to provide challenges to the football community, but as a Club, we continued to remain positive and resilient. 2021 has also been my second year as the Business Development Manager, which has been an incredible journey with the Club winning back-to-back premierships for the first time in the our history. We have continued to excel on the field, whilst off the field we continue to be progressive and innovative with what we do. We have managed to attract new partners whilst continuing our relationship with long-standing partners, some who have supported us since the amalgamation 31 years ago, and many others showing their support for over 10 years. This is something we are incredibly proud of.

Our women's program continues to grow, with all players having a player partner, this was also the situation in the men's program. This highlights yet another outstanding achievement. We continue to provide our members, supporters, and partners an enjoyable match day experience, including our first Family Day carnival for two years, attracting nearly 4,000 people through the gate during the day. It was really pleasing to see families staying to watch the Eagles play the Crows after. Home match luncheons continue to be popular, seeing a massive increase in patrons attending in 2021. Corporate functions like the Telstra lounge and our business networking events have provided excellent opportunities for our partners to build strong business relationships for the future.

There were many new initiatives during 2021, including the Eagles Ladies Day and our My Money House Car Lottery. Both were highly successful. The car lottery was made possible by My Money House who also became a new partner in 2022. FINANCE REPORT

2021 was another successful year both on and off the field. The last 2 years have stretched us all financially and will continue to provide challenges for years to come. However, the results for the last 2 years is a testament to the hard work of the Board and staff who continue to work hard and strive for excellence. Obtaining these good results requires a lot of hard work and commitment from the entire Eagles family. In 2021 the Club realised a combined surplus of \$6,852 (\$313,602 for 2020) and a consolidated cash deficit of \$149,556 (\$663,085 for 2020). The deficit is predominantly due to the purchase of \$300,000 of assets in order to comply with changing legislation regarding gaming machines which came into effect December/January 2020 and 2021. These assets were all purchased for cash rather than using the lease option as has been the process previously.

FOOTBALL

The Football Club ended the year with a deficit of \$123,402 (\$172,740 in 2020). A huge thanks must go to Luke Powell, Matthew Goldsworthy, Jade Sheedy, Darren Hams and the football staff for all their hard work during the year. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Andy Hood for his work and commitment in attracting and maintaining sponsors and partners and we have seen a significant increase in this area is 2021. To Melissa McKenzie, thank you for your tireless work and commitment in attracting new members, maintaining current members and managing the purchasing and sale of all the merchandise. 2021 saw an increase in membership in all categories and your commitment to our members is appreciated by all.

LICENSED CLUBS

The Licensed Clubs (Eagles Function Centre and Seven 22) realised a combined surplus of \$275,254 for 2021 (\$486,342 for 2020).

Eagles Function Centre

The venue continues to attract a variety of private functions. The hard work of Sam Conlon and Kuyan Hedaux has resulted in a number of new functions being held at this venue throughout the year. Sam and his committed staff continue to encourage members to attend the venue on Thursday and Friday nights and match days. The Function Centre realised a surplus of \$31,036 for the 2021 financial year compared to a surplus of \$2,089 for the 2020 financial year. This turn around is the result of a massive effort from Sam and his staff and the Club is truly appreciative.

Seven 22

Seven 22 realised a surplus of \$99,218 for 2021 after transferring \$300,000 to the Football Club. Gaming, was down on budget by \$136,865 due to covid shutdown, social distancing rules plus the change over to non-cash machines and facial recognition cameras. The Bar and Bistro have performed well above budget for the year. Thanks to Vicki Wright, chef Mark Giles and Kuyan Hedaux and their staff for their hard work and commitment during the year.

Vicki Wright and her staff have been working tirelessly during the year keeping the venue fresh, updating and upgrading/changing necessary assets in order to continue to make the experience for the customers as inviting as possible.

To Melissa McKenzie and Michelle Diamond, a huge thank you, for always being willing and able to provide help and support whenever requested. In addition thanks to Jemma Comitogianni for all her assistance in the staging of the events and for her extensive social media skills. I look forward to again working closely with you all in 2022.
