Thank you to Christine Williams, Luke Powell and the Board for their unwavering support during the rejuvenation of the Eagles Senior Women's Program for SANFLW Season 2022. Special mention to Matthew Goldsworthy who invested time and genuine care for the program all season. Thanks to Dave Couzner a great support in the recruiting space and is creating an environment where there are life incentives to join our Eagles family. To the medical staff, Al Kearney, Georgie Zuill, Katherine Grellman, Mike Whinnen, Emma Moore and all of the trainers, volunteers and people who show up to support this program, it is so appreciated and we understand we would not be able to get the athletes on the park without you all.

Commencing as the Senior Coach in a program that had experienced some challenges was an exciting prospect. There was a base of three years that was in need of the addition of layers to move towards to a more professional environment. The list management side of the program was a slow build with a level of commitment to the already established players who were given an opportunity to come along with a lift in standards including football IQ, culture and high performance. It is fair to say that not everyone made it through the season but on the flip side, as a program, there were opportunities provided to our younger talent already in our Talent Shield program to get involved in the senior women's program.

Culture building has been bolstered by the playing group who designed their own trademark that was lived and breathed by the players in training, playing standards and expectations. An award has now been named the 'Christine Williams Trademark Player of the year' and becomes the inaugural perpetual award within the program. The winner as voted by her peers, weekly post game, was Amie Blanden. A more than worthy winner.

Our season was a story of building consistency with three solid wins and many heartbreaking losses. We were competitive in all matches and from our front end of the season to back end the margins were lower and we were in matches for longer periods. Our leaderboard status was again not where it needs to be finishing 7th overall - winning 3 matches and losing 9.

Of note R12 Season 2022 was a winning round and not included in these numbers we kicked 7:9-51 defeating West 2:6-18 to round out our season.

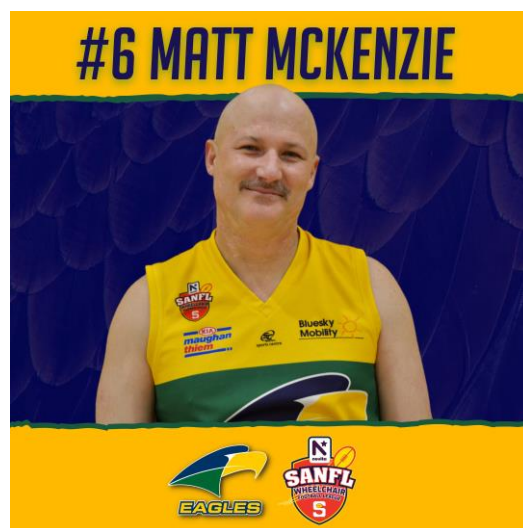

COACH'S REPORT - UNDER 16's

2022 brought some new enthusiasm with the Under 16 program. It was the first time since the inception of the Under 16's & 18's at SANFL level that the Under 16 players had the opportunity to represent their SANFL Club for an entire season.

47 players represented the Eagles this year at Under 16 level – 22 from our Country and 25 from our Metropolitan Zone. Pre-Season began late November with our final squad being selected mid-February.

Trials were held against North, Norwood and South in readiness for Round One which was on the 26th of March. Congratulations to Tom Luck who won the Medal for the Best Player on the ground.

FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT REPORT**Male**

Our U13 & 14 Metropolitan Squads began mid-April. After four trainings and a game, each squad was selected with 35 talented young footballers from our Metropolitan Zone. During the 16 week program, games were played against Norwood, West, South, Glenelg and Centrals under lights on a Friday evening.

The players experienced a standard and level of footy they don't often get with their community clubs. Many thanks to Paul Sheldon who coached the Under 14's and his assistants Dave Mazey and Wayne Prideaux who help direct the players to further develop their football.

FINANCE REPORT

The last 3 years have stretched us all financially and will continue to provide challenges for years to come. However, the results are a testament to the hard work of the Board and staff who continue to work hard and strive for excellence. In 2022 the Club realised a combined loss of \$137,464 (surplus of \$6,852 for 2021) and a consolidated cash surplus of \$263,021 (deficit of \$149,556 for 2021). The deficit is predominantly due to the payout of \$80,000 in relation to the lights from a grant received the previous financial year, together with the building of the new coaches' boxes at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval.

FOOTBALL

The Football Club ended the year with a surplus of \$62,639 (a deficit of \$123,402 in 2021). A huge thanks must go to Luke Powell, Matthew Goldsworthy, Jade Sheedy, Darren Hams and the football staff for all their hard work during the year. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Andy Hood for his work and commitment in attracting and maintaining sponsors and partners and we have continued to see new sponsors being attracted to our Club during 2022. To Melissa McKenzie, thank you for your tireless work and commitment in attracting new members, maintaining current members and managing the purchasing and sale of all the merchandise. 2022 saw 157 new memberships and your commitment to our members is appreciated by all.

LICENSED CLUBS

The Licensed Clubs (Eagles Function Centre and Seven 22) realised a combined deficit of \$200,103 for 2022 (a surplus of \$275,254 for 2021). This was after transferring \$676,000 to the Football Club.

Eagles Function Centre

The venue continues to attract a variety of private functions. The hard work of Sam Conlon and Kuyan Hedaux has resulted in a number of new functions being held at this venue throughout the year. Sam and his committed staff continue to encourage members to attend the venue on Thursday and Friday nights and match days. The Function Centre realised a deficit of \$3,023 for 2022 compared to a surplus of \$31,036 for the 2021 financial year. 2021 included the Grand Final income.

Seven 22

Seven 22 realised a deficit of \$197,079 for 2022 compared to a surplus of \$99,218 for 2021 after transferring \$676,000 to the Football Club. All areas of the Bistro performed better than budget. Thanks to Vicki Wright, head chef Kuyan Hedaux and their staff for their hard work and commitment during the year.

Vicki Wright and her staff have been working tirelessly during the year keeping the venue fresh, updating and upgrading/changing necessary assets in order to continue to make the experience for the customers as inviting as possible.

To Melissa McKenzie and Michelle Diamond, a huge thank you, for always being willing and able to provide help and support whenever requested. In addition thanks to Anastasia Greer-Clarke for all her assistance in the staging of the events and to Anthony Marafioti for his extensive social media skills. I look forward to again working closely with you all in 2023.

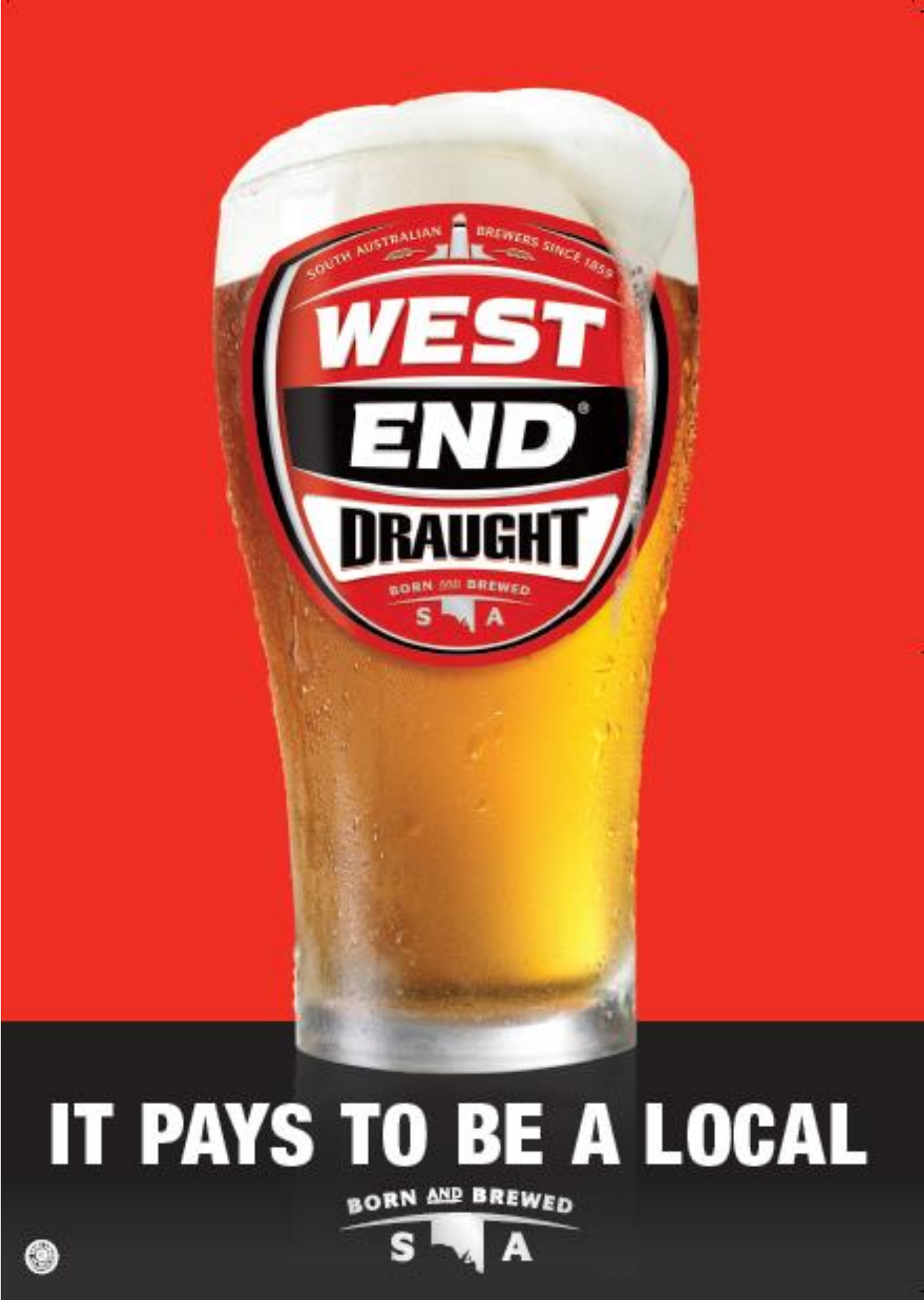
