#### **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

Season 2023 was certainly one of great change where we bid farewell to some and welcomed others. In May we said farewell to David Couzner after 8 years on the Board as Football and League Director. David was voted onto the SANFL Commission, meaning that all SANFL Clubs could benefit from his knowledge and expertise. On 14<sup>th</sup> June, Luke Powell announced that he would be resigning his position as CEO on 30<sup>th</sup> September, to spend more time with his 3 very energetic boys. We sincerely thank Luke for his hard work, commitment and passion for the Club both as CEO and a player and we wish Luke, Lisa, Mason, Syd and Lenny all the very best for the future. Luke has since been voted onto the SANFL Commission. His knowledge of SANFL football both from a player and administrator's perspective will be invaluable to the League.

On 1<sup>st</sup> August Jade Sheedy announced that he would be leaving his position as coach of the Men's League side at the season's end. The Club expresses its gratitude to Jade for his dedication, commitment, and professionalism in establishing and leading an exceptional football program over the past four years. Under Jade's leadership, the WWTFC achieved back-to-back SANFL Premierships in 2020 and 2021, and an impressive fourteen players have been drafted to the AFL within the last four years. The end of season 2023 also saw Matt Knight leave the Club after having coached the Development Team to a Preliminary final. Thank you to Matt for his involvement in the Club in both the Men's and the Women's programs and we wish him and Stacey all the very best in their new ventures.

The vacating of these positions provided opportunities to welcome others into these very important roles. On 27th July, David Couzner took up the position of CEO. David clearly understands the WWTFC football community, the SANFL landscape and the vision and strategic direction of the Club. This, together with his strong commercial and corporate governance, marketing and sponsorship knowledge, community and social engagement, and local, state and federal government relations ensure that David 'hit the ground running'. Since rejoining the team David has been instrumental and driven the signing of players (both men's and women's), secured employment and housing where necessary, the appointment of a new League coach, worked with the football department to secure the services of all other coaches, been a constant driver to get the changerooms completed prior to season 2024, purchased the Trophy Cabinet in the foyer, upgrades throughout the administration area and the function room, installation of the new carpet in the Eagles Function Room and Eastern Parade function room, liaised with the City of Port Adelaide Enfield Council for further upgrades to Eastern Parade, and secured the upgrade of the Percy Fox away changerooms commencing July 2024 which is being fully funded by the City of Charles Sturt Council. The Club is thrilled to have retained Narelle and looks forward to a successful 2024 SANFLW season.

The WWTFC Wheelchair team again secured a spot in the Grand Final against Sturt. Unfortunately Sturt were too good on the night but we are looking forward to what season 2024 will bring for these very talented athletes.

A sincere thank you to all the WWTFC and Eagles staff. We are a small but a very talented and professional team of people completely committed to ensuring the Club continues to grow and thrive and be the best Club in the SANFL. A special thank you to Kelli Pearce, Sam Conlon and the game-day staff and volunteers who operated all year under less than ideal conditions with the renovations.

#### WOMEN'S SENIOR COACH'S REPORT

The WWTFC Women's program kicked off in October 2022 for the SANFLW 2023 Season. We set our sights on pushing up the ladder and the preparation left no stone unturned. The Eagles SANFLW athletes worked incredibly hard to build the athletic profile of the squad and the results were evident as we embarked on our season.

Our season opened against Centrals (the eventual premiers) where we kicked off with a 13 point loss, played some good football and came away not buoyed but not deflated. Round 2 saw us let one get away with an 8 point loss to Glenelg. Round 3 saw a lapse of concentration for a quarter and a half and saw North pile on 8 goals to give us our worse loss for the year.

Going into the break we were 0-3 and we would suffer another loss in Round 4 against an AFLW topped up Norwood. Our first win came in Round 5 against West the eventual wooden spooners and we finally got some offensive connection which was pleasing. Round 6 saw us return to Oval Avenue and get blown off the park by a rampaging Sturt and suffered our second 10 goal loss. This was the last of our inconsistent play and from this half way point of the season we certainly settled and competed with all the teams and played better football. The hard cold fact is when you start the season 1-5 it is a hard road to have any chance to play finals. As a program we re-assessed our season goals and fell back to the old football cliché of one week at a time.

Round 7 saw us play against South at Oval Avenue on Easter Thursday and the conditions were horrendous which saw our lowest score for the season. We led all night until a lapse in concentration saw us give away a 25m penalty to give the opposition a 2 point lead. Then some creative game delays by the opposition saw the game slip away and we were left feeling flat with a game that got away. South went on to play in a Grand Final showing we can compete with the top teams.

Round 8 marks the blue print of how the Eagles SANFLW teams want to play. Coming up against the Bays it was evident from the first bounce we had come to play. Playing a 4 quarter game of high level football we won by a convincing 23 points.

The challenges kept presenting as we then came crashing down with a draw against West, 8 point loss against Norwood and 19 point loss against Centrals in Rounds 9, 10 and 11. During this time we played some good football but had moments where we lacked concentration and focus. Another area of growth for us is to put sides away when we get the chance which will be a major focus area for the whole of the program moving forward. Our final match against North was a fitting way to finish our season with an 8 point win and we showed that we are a side to be watched and not far off some success.

In Season 2023 the Eagles Senior Women's program had its best win record with 3 wins 1 draw. It is pleasing to report the majority of our list committed immediately following the season end which is reflective of the playing group's desire for some finals action. We thank the Club as a whole, which is overtly supportive of the women's program and can't wait to once again do the hard yards during the warmer months to best prepare to continue to flip the win / loss ratio and taste some finals.

#### WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT COACH'S REPORT

The Woodville West Torrens Football Club development league season started in October alongside the league team. Training together through the entire season is a highlight of our program with players feeling included within the program to strive for opportunities in League and beyond. The ultimate goal for the season was to be the first team to win the Development League Premiership with playing in the Grand Final firmly in our sights.

In round six against Sturt (third position), we found ourselves in a position just outside the top two and fighting to keep our season alive. Again, we lost by three points missing a few important opportunities in front of goal causing us to fall to fourth position and the Grand Final potentially out of reach.

In the final game of the season we were competitive for the first of half of the game, but ultimately missed goal opportunities which proved costly with South (Premier's of the development league) using their League experience to their advantage.

In closing, in the 2023 Development League season we achieved the goals of players taking their opportunity at league level. However, we did not reach our ultimate goal of playing in the grand final and being the first Development League Premier's.

The club has been an amazing support of the Development League program. We are excited to start the 2024 season and take the next step of playing in the Grand Final.



#### **PARTICIPATION REPORT**

Participation plays an important role within an SANFL Club, ensuring the game remains vibrant at the grass roots level along with creating community links and promotion of the Woodville West Torrens Football Club.

Chantelle Mitchell and Mikayla Kafi were employed by the SANFL as Development Trainees for 2023 to support Scott Biddle the SANFL's Zone Development Leader to deliver Participation Programs throughout our Metropolitan Zone for young children to engage in football.

Todd Thorne and Will Schultz promote the Eagles brand in our country zone as our Game Development Coordinators, supporting Country Clubs, Schools and Communities in football. Todd works closely with the Adelaide Plains and North Eastern Football Leagues, whilst Will works with the Yorke Peninsula Football league. Both Will and Todd do a fantastic job in ensuring football remains vibrant and the Eagles are at the forefront throughout our Country Zones.

#### AUSKICK

Auskick gives young children of the ages 5 to 7 a football experience before entering the playing arena with a club or school. This year in our Metropolitan area 760 participants participated in Auskick spread across 23 Centres with an 18% increase in Female attendance.

Our Country Regions don't have the population growth of the Metro area, therefore numbers seem to remain similar from year to year. On the Yorke Peninsula this year 270 children participated in the Auskick Program across the 12 Centres. This year the Yorke Peninsula Football League along with Will created an Under 9 Program for players to play at Club land, previously children were going from Auskick into Under 11's.

The Adelaide Plains and North Eastern Football League, Todd coordinated 6 Centres in the APFL with 86 participants, whilst in the North Eastern there were 7 centres with 132 children involved.

#### MINI LEAGUE & LITTLE LEAGUE

Mini League and Little League provide opportunities to school and club teams to play on Maughan Thiem Kia Oval and Adelaide Oval during the half time break. Anthony Howard did a great job in ensuring all the kids had a fantastic match day experience. With Six Metropolitan Clubs, the Adelaide Plains Football League and the North Eastern Football League all providing their players the opportunity to have a game on Maughan Thiem Kia Oval during the season.

The North Eastern Football league gave opportunity to its Auskickers as well as its Under 11's to have a kick on Adelaide Oval, whilst 4 Metro Clubs & 3 Metro Auskick centres were able to provide the same.

#### SCHOOL FOOTBALL

Six schools with 12 Football Teams participated in the Saturday morning school competition at West Beach this year.

We thank everyone who was involved in 2023, whether it be an employee or a volunteer, the work done at grass roots level to keep our game alive and well is fantastic. Therefore many thanks to all the Coaches and Volunteers who give up countless hours in ensuring we continue to provide opportunity to young people to be involved in this great game.

### **FINANCE REPORT**

2023 has been a year that has thrown up a number of challenges for the Club, both financially and non-financially. I am very proud to report that we have met those challenges and have laid the foundation to continue to strengthen ourselves to be a stronger and more resilient Club, on and off the field, for years to come.

Our greatest challenge has undoubtedly been in relation to the development of the Barry Jarman grandstand and changeroom facilities. Unavoidable delays with the construction resulted in an impact on our regular revenue streams, which was magnified by us not hosting our first home game at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval until round 5. In addition to the impact on income, significant additional costs - such as the need for temporary away changerooms – also had an effect on the Club's financial resources.

It is therefore a tribute to our tireless and dedicated team, that the Club was able to deliver a financial result that equated to a combined operating profit of \$504,075. This is represented by a combined increase of net assets of \$504,075 (\$4,389,311 as at 31/10/23, compared to \$3,885,236 as at 31/10/22).

Following the completion of the Barry Jarman grandstand and the extensive renovations of the Eagles Function Centre and Champions Bar, the Board are intently focussed on generating a number of new income streams in 2024, as well as maximising the growth of our traditional income streams.

In addition to our facilities at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval, renovations at Seven 22 and at Eastern Parade, Ottoway, will expand the income producing potential to both existing and new customers. Several other exciting initiatives are also underway, which will not only provide financial benefits to the Club, but will build on the "One Club, One Culture" mantra established in 2023.

It has been my pleasure to act as Finance Director for this great Club in 2023 and I would like to thank the enormous support of our great team, our passionate members, our generous sponsors and my fellow Board members.
