PRESIDENT/CHAIR REPORT

As this year draws to a close I would like to thank everyone for their continued support and commitment to the WWTF. We are very fortunate as a Club to have such amazing sponsors, members, volunteers and supporters who continue to adapt to whatever changes and challenges present themselves. You are the backbone of our Club and we value your continued support.

2024 has been the year of change and achievements and it is appropriate that we, as a Club, reflect and celebrate our achievements. Achievements such as we have seen during 2024 are the result of the 'One Club, One Culture' ethos, however, it also takes someone to continually drive these changes and to this end I extend sincere thanks to David Couzner. Through David's persistence, drive and ingenuity the following has been achieved during 2024:

- **Recruitment of New Head Coach and Key Players:** The recruitment of Sam Jacobs as the men's senior coach for the 2024 season brought fresh energy and perspective to the football program. It was also a great achievement that the squad also welcomed key players, including Josh Morris, Cam Fleeton, Jordan Moore, Luke McKay, and Nathan Barkla, all of whom brought depth and skill to our team. Having Sam come back to the Eagles was a magnificent achievement and one that certainly paid off in making the finals especially given the injuries suffered throughout the year.
- **Introduction of Gavin Colville as Mentor to Sam Jacobs:** Gavin Colville joined us as a mentor to Sam Jacobs, providing valuable guidance and support to our new head coach. Gavin's experience and insight was instrumental in helping Sam transition smoothly into his role and strengthening our coaching framework. Again, this was a crucial step in the success that we had in 2024 and others will also have the opportunity to benefit from Gavin's guidance in 2025.
- **Introduction of Club Values and Motto – One Club, One Culture:** Introduction of our Club values and the motto "One Club, One Culture," emphasising unity, commitment, and inclusivity across all programs and teams. This foundational approach has been instrumental in building a cohesive environment that supports all players and staff. This 'living' of these values has been through David's continual commitment to ensuring they are at the very core of everything that is done throughout the entire Club.
- **Rebranding and Enhanced Communication with Members:** The regular CEO's communication to members has ensured a concerted effort to rebrand our presence and strengthen connections with our membership base through improved communications and meaningful interactions.
- **Comprehensive Review of the 2024 Men's Season:** A comprehensive review of the men's program was conducted, identifying areas of change to ensure an environment of continual improvement. This process highlighted key areas for improvement, including training focus, strategic adjustments, and support requirements, to ensure we maintain a competitive edge in the coming season.
- **Achieving Early Signings for Male SANFL League and Reserve Players:** By September, David had secured signatures for all male SANFL League and Reserves players, even with the AFL Reserves conditions in place. This early commitment underscores our proactive recruitment strategy and focus on team stability heading into 2025.
- **Improvements to the Eagles Function Centre and Administration Foyer:** Upgrades to the Function Centre and Administration foyer, including the addition of a new trophy cabinet and honour boards, have significantly enhanced the Club's aesthetic appeal and provided a fitting display of our achievements and history. This has shown players of the past that they are valued and a significant part of the Club.
- **Recognition of Past West Torrens and Woodville Players:** The history and contributions of all past West Torrens and Woodville players have been honoured by dedicating a prominent display in the foyer of the Administration building. This tribute acknowledges our Club's roots and celebrates the legacy of those who have shaped our journey.

- **Introduction of Administrative Life Governors:** The recognition of Administrative Life Governors to honour those who have dedicated themselves to the Club's progress. This move reinforces our commitment to acknowledging contributions across all areas of the Club.
- **Alignment of Male and Female Programs:** Meaningful steps to align and integrate our male and female programs, fostering a unified approach that emphasises collaboration and mutual support. This alignment has strengthened our "One Club, One Culture" philosophy and has been well-received by players and staff alike.
- **Winning the Club's First Wheelchair Premiership:** Achieving our first 2024 Wheelchair Premiership is a landmark accomplishment and a proud moment for our Club, highlighting our commitment to inclusivity and excellence across all forms of the game.
- **Winning the 2024 U18 Premiership:** Our U18 team achieved an outstanding victory, securing the 2024 Premiership title. This success reflects the strength of our youth development program and the dedication of our coaching staff and support team.
- **Completion of the Barry Jarman Changerooms:** This project stands as the largest construction and financial commitment the Club has undertaken in the last decade. Its completion marks a new era of improved facilities and a strengthened infrastructure. David's continual drive ensured that the project has been completed in time for the 2024 season and everyone is incredibly proud of what has been achieved in this space.
- **First-Ever SANFLW Game at Eastern Parade:** Hosting our inaugural SANFLW game at Eastern Parade was a significant milestone, highlighting our commitment to expanding women's football. This took considerable effort on David's behalf to convince the SANFL of the viability of hosting such a game. Also acknowledgement for the massive amount of work David carried out in getting the venue ready for the match, which was a great success.
- **Facility Upgrades at Eastern Parade:** David met with the Mayor and Asset Management Staff and successfully gained approval for the investment in the enhanced visitor changerooms and the new behind-the-goal netting at Eastern Parade, further improving the venue's quality and visitor experience.
- **Financial Turnaround:** In order for the Club to meet the financial obligations in relation to the changerooms, it was necessary for the Club to use the \$1.1m Divestment Funding. The use of these funds was under the proviso that they be paid back into the Term Deposit Account. Successfully returning the Divestment Account to \$1.1 million following the Barry Jarman build project has been a major achievement led by David and the entire staff. This accomplishment provides a more secure financial foundation for our ongoing projects and initiatives.
- **Strengthening Our Relationship with the Old Eagles:** This year, focus was on deepening our connection with the Old Eagles, hosting events and fostering interactions that honour the legacy and contributions of past players. These efforts have brought together multiple generations, reinforcing our shared history and commitment to the Club's values.
- **Support for the SANFL's West Lakes Lobbying:** The Club remained committed to supporting the SANFL's lobbying efforts for the West Lakes redevelopment, recognising the significant impact that this will have on the broader football community. David actively engaged in discussions with Counsellors and the general public to ensure our interests align with the SANFL's vision for future growth and opportunity.
- **Celebration of the Men's Season:** Despite the challenges faced, the Club celebrated the season's end with over 300 members, players, and supporters at the 2024 Club Champion Awards, recognising the resilience and determination shown by the men's team. This gathering highlighted the strength of our community and the unwavering support from our members.
- **Hosting the First Woodville Football Club Past Players' Function at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval:** For the first time, the Club hosted a dedicated Past Players' Function at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval, bringing the Woodville Football Club community back to its former home ground. This historic event was a meaningful way to honour the legacy of Woodville past players, fostering a sense of pride and connection across generations.

PRESIDENT/CHAIR REPORT (cont'd)

- **Introduction of the Inaugural Annual Round 1 Reversible West Torrens and Woodville Playing Guernsey:** In recognition of our history, David introduced a unique reversible guernsey for both our men's and women's teams in Round 1. This special guernsey honours both West Torrens and Woodville and has become an annual tradition that connects our players and supporters to our Club's rich heritage.
- **City of Charles Sturt Lease Negotiations:** Approval has been given by the City of Charles Sturt for a 20+20 year lease with rent reduced to \$40,000 commencing December 2024. Securing these favourable terms is significant for our Club and a testament to the working relationship between the Council and our Club. David has spent a numerous amount of time working on this project and we are very fortunate to have this come to fruition.
- **Lobbying for SANFLW Rounds 1-4 at Eastern Parade in 2025:** David has been actively advocating for SANFLW rounds 1-4 of the 2025 season to be hosted at Eastern Parade. This initiative would provide our women's team with strong home-ground support and enhance our presence in the community early in the season. This would provide a significant advantage to our SANFLW teams and give them a good start to the season.
- **Percy Fox Grandstand Refurbishment:** Scheduled to commence in October 2025, the refurbishment of the Percy Fox Grandstand will bring significant improvements to our facilities at no cost to the Club. This project reflects ongoing support from the community and will provide a fresh, updated environment for our fans and players. David has been, and continues to work with Council on this project.
- **Discussions with the City of PAE on Eastern Parade Oval Lengthening:** David has been actively discussing with the City of Port Adelaide Enfield the possibility of lengthening the Eastern Parade Oval. This modification could significantly enhance the playing field and support our long-term facility goals.

Congratulations to Shane Reardon on yet another U18 Premiership, we are so fortunate to have the services of Shane. After 15 years, Darren Hams will no longer coach the U16s but will continue on in his role of Talent Manager. Darren and Shane have worked so well together over many years in enabling players to meet their dreams of being drafted into the AFL or at the very least playing at the highest level possible. We will still see Darren at all the games and hopefully he now has some leisure time during the year to enjoy with his family.

A sincere thank you to all the WWTFC and Eagles staff. David and his small, but very talented and professional team of people, are completely committed to ensuring the Club continues to grow and thrive and be the best Club in the SANFL. To all of our coaches, assistant coaches, medical staff and support staff a massive thank you for all your hard work and very long hours that you have put in during the year. Your continued support is immensely appreciated by all. Thank you also to my fellow Board members always striving to ensure the Club is the best it can be both on and off field. We have unfortunately had some long-term and committed members of the Eagles pass during the year and our hearts and thoughts are with those families during this most special time of the year. I wish everyone a prosperous New Year and we look forward to season 2025 for all of our teams. I cannot wait to see what other milestones we can achieve in the coming season.

WOMEN'S SENIOR COACH REPORT

The growth of the Eagles SANFLW program in 2024 was evident for those following the SANFLW competition. We play an attractive style of football and were in most matches for the year. We had some significant wins and some close, heartbreaking losses and the ladder result of no change from 7th was disappointing for everyone involved. There is no time to dwell and there has been much reflection about how we break the ladder position cycle that has existed since Eagles SANFLW entered the competition.

In 2024 there were many positive outcomes. For the first time we had a player in the top 10 for the SANFLW League medal count, we recorded our highest ever games won during a season, and we beat Grand Finalists Norwood twice during the home and away season. Our largest loss margin was 35 points against the eventual Premiers, South Adelaide. This is the first time we have limited a +30 loss to one match during a season. It is also the first season we have not had a +60-point loss.

Our offensive scoring is also heading in the right direction. In seasons 2019 to 2021 we scored approx 200 points, with 300+ points for seasons 2022 to 2023 and 430 points for season 2024. What these numbers and facts tell us is that we can match it with all the teams in the competition and we are trending in the right direction. This competition will only continue to improve and as a collective we need to keep working together towards playing finals.

The Women's Club Champion awards were held shortly after our season concluded, and Poppy Waterford won her maiden SANFLW Best and Fairest with the ever-consistent Annie Falkenberg claiming Runner Up Best and Fairest, with Third Best and Fairest going to Christina Leuzzi. Other awards included Best Defender Christina Leuzzi, Leading goalkicker Rosette Zerella, Best 1stYear Player Imogen Trengove, Friday Lunch Group Award Leah Cutting and The Christine Williams Trademark Award was awarded to Marlie Fiegert.

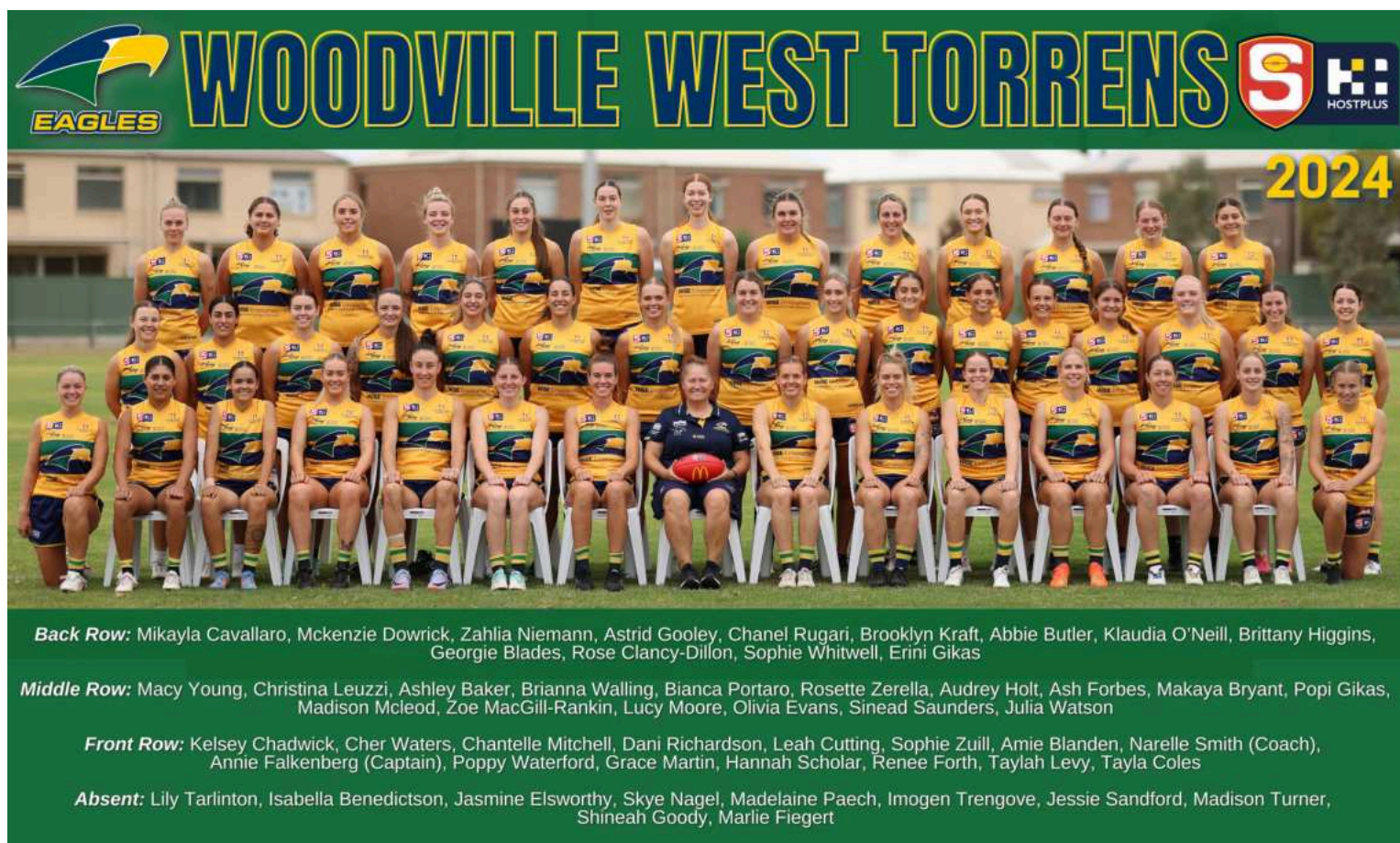

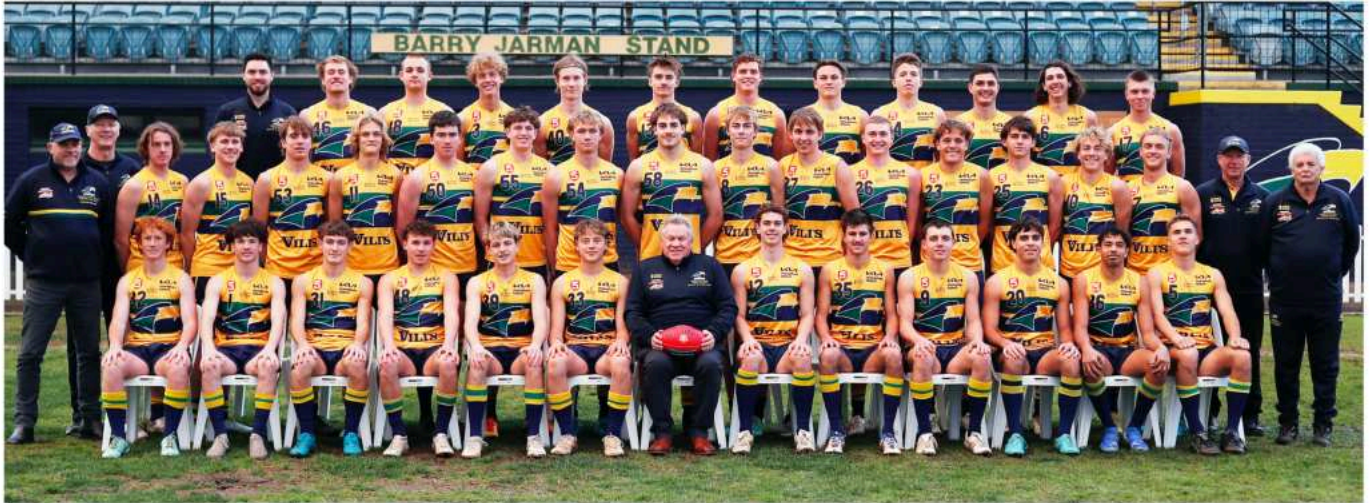

AUSKICK

Auskick gives young children of the ages 5 to 7 a football experience before entering the playing arena with a Club or school. This year, in our metropolitan area, 835 children participated in Auskick spread across 9 Community football clubs and 12 schools, encouragingly up 10% from 2023.

Our country regions don't have the population growth of the Metropolitan area, therefore numbers remain quite similar from year to year. On the Adelaide Plains this year 6 centres through Community Clubs encouraged 121 participants in the Auskick Program which is up 35 from last year. The North Eastern Football League attracted 106 participants again through 7 community clubs which is slightly down from 2023.

On the Yorke Peninsula, 8 Community Clubs and 3 schools ran Auskick sessions for the 5 to 7 year olds. With 264 participants, we saw a growth in the female space but a decline in the male participant, and overall slightly down from 2023.

Nazareth Primary, West Lakes Shore and the North Eastern Football League Auskick Centres were provided an opportunity to do Auskick at half time on Adelaide Oval.

FINANCE REPORT

A combination of the current economic climate and the completion of the Barry Jarman Grandstand change rooms has certainly provided challenges for the entire Club. In 2024 the Club realised a combined loss of \$320,803 (surplus \$504,075 for 2023). The major variations between the 2024 and 2023 results is due to the lack of \$350k Divestment Funding in 2024 and a grant of \$330k grant received in 2024 for the change rooms. In 2024 the Club realised a consolidated cash loss of \$1,115,533 (consolidated cash surplus of \$55,343 in 2023). The cash loss for 2024 was predominantly due to the payment of over \$800k in relation to the change rooms, together with the refurbishment of the office, Eastern Parade and Eagles Function Centre.

FOOTBALL

The Football Club ended the year with a deficit of \$208,144 (a surplus of \$650,470 in 2023). As stated above the major differences are accounted for due to the Divestment funding of \$350k ending in 2023 along with additional costs relating to a changeover of footballs, and the refurbishment of Eastern Parade and the foyer. The fact that the Club has achieved what it has within the current climate and still be in a stable financial position with which to start season 2025 is a testament to the staff led by David Couzner. David and the staff have made considerable sacrifices during the current financial year in order to achieve, once in a lifetime changes to the facilities, whilst still meeting the needs of players, members, sponsors and supporters. The Club certainly is incredibly fortunate in have these people working for us and for their continued and ongoing commitment to making our Club the best it possibly can be.

LICENSED CLUBS

The Licensed Clubs (Eagles Function Centre and Seven 22) realised a combined deficit of \$112,659 for 2024 (a deficit of \$146,395 for 2023). This was after transferring \$701,000 to the Football Club.

EAGLES FUNCTION CENTRE

The venue continues to attract a variety of private functions. The hard work of Sam Conlon and Kuyan Hedaux has resulted in a number of new functions being held at this venue throughout the year. Sam and his committed staff continue to encourage members to attend the venue on Thursday nights and match days. The Function Centre realised a surplus of \$36,980 for 2024 which is the largest surplus the Function Centre has made for several years. This is a testament to magnificent work of Sam and his staff, servicing Club patrons as well as the general community.

SEVEN 22

Seven 22 realised a deficit of \$149,639 for 2022 which is comparable to other years and after transferring \$701,000 to the Football Club to support the football programs. All areas of the Bistro performed better than budget. Thanks to Vicki Wright, head chef Kuyan Hedaux and their staff for their hard work and commitment during the year.

Vicki Wright and her staff have been working tirelessly during the year keeping the venue fresh, updating and upgrading/changing necessary assets in order to continue to make the experience for the customers as inviting as possible.

To Melissa McKenzie and Michelle Diamond, a huge thank you, for always being willing and able to provide help and support whenever requested. In addition thanks to Anastasia Greer-Clarke for all her assistance in the staging of the events and to Anthony Marafioti for his extensive social media skills. I look forward to again working closely with you all in 2025.
