



# COMING THIS SEASON...

#### **CEO REPORT**

2021 will go down in our history books as the Club's Centenary Year. And what a year it was, both on and off the field. As CEO, it would be remiss of me not to formally reflect on our 100 years in our Annual Report and, in particular, what makes this Club a great football club.

The definition of a successful football club can be measured in a variety of ways. Longevity, premiership success, the symbolism of the guernsey, the status within their local community, the people within the Club or a mixture of all of the above.

This football club is not a normal footy club. It has formed a soul and a heartbeat stronger than most sporting clubs in Australia. In fact you could argue it has rivalled the powerhouse football clubs in Australia. At different times over our journey, our heartbeat has pounded loudly enough that everyone in the country knew about Glenelg Football Club... and at various other times, it's been on life support.

During our halcyon days of the 1970's & 80's, this Club played in 14 grand finals in 24 years - a feat only achieved by very few clubs in this game at State and AFL level. Over our 100 years, the greatness of this football club can't be judged on premiership success for there have only been six (including our Women's one this year). But there's something more palpable, more significant and more powerful than our name on the Thomas Seymour Hill Premiership Cup.

This Club has been built on the values of our local community and we've created lifelong memories and friendships that have transcended each generation. Those values are still as prevalent today as they were 100 years ago, when we struggled through a period of not winning a game in our first four years. Passion, loyalty, integrity, honesty, inclusiveness, authenticity, diligence and, most of all, resilience have been the character traits that define us, not only as a Club, but as a community. We are The Bays. This is us. This is what has defined us over 100 years and will continue to define us for another 100.

As we start our journey into our next 100 years, we have all the ingredients to give ourselves every opportunity to create our next dynasty. Strong values and leadership, a great culture, great support from our fans, our predecessors, our Council and our local community and, most of all, a great bunch of committed, hardworking and humble male and female players who have all of those character traits in spades.

#### Finance:

From a financial and operational perspective, there continues to be several key challenges that confront the Club during the Covid-19 pandemic. However, it must be said our financial results have been exceptional given the current economic climate.

The Club has posted a \$736,896 consolidated profit which was significantly above our budgeted expectations.

This was predominately due to:

- Significant growth in sponsorship, membership, merchandise and match day revenue.
- All of our Centenary Year activations and initiatives generating incredible financial support from our community.
- Stronger than forecast bar and bistro revenue, which is a fantastic achievement given the current challenging conditions the hospitality sector has faced during this pandemic.
- Stringent budget and financial performance management.

The key variations in our financial performance are highlighted by:

- The re-introduction of the SANFL Land Divestment Fund: unbudgeted versus \$300,000 received.
- An increase of \$278,000 in key football revenue areas (sponsorship, membership, merchandise, fundraising, match day) from \$682,000 to \$960,000.
- A reduction of revenue in our gaming portfolio of \$230,000.
- An increase in budgeted food and beverage sales from \$1.96M to \$2.18M.

As opposed to the 2020 financial year whereby the Club was a benefactor of both State and Commonwealth Governments stimulus packages, the 2021 results reflect a year of significant operational growth and one which provides us with a strong cash position to withstand the continuing volatile economic conditions and allows the Club to invest in key areas of the business to support our financial sustainability.

#### Football:

We set out from the end of the 2020 season with the ambition to win our 6th men's premiership in our Centenary Year, and while that goal rolls off the tongue pretty easily, the reality is that it's incredibly difficult to execute and you need everything to go right at the right time of year to give yourself the opportunity to win one.

As gut wrenching as the League grand final loss was, that two hour period doesn't define who we are. There is actually a bigger picture at stake and whilst our purpose as a Footy Club is to win premierships and engage our members and community, that bigger picture is our culture and our ability to support each other to overcome adversity, build resilience and continually improve. And for that, this year we've delivered that in spades.

These are some of my observations of what's defined us over the last 12 months:

- Replacing our 2019 premiership coach Mark Stone late in November 2020 meant we didn't actively have a Senior Coach until the end of January 2021. Our coaching staff and leadership group did an amazing job to develop our fitness and skill base and maintain high standards of commitment.
- For Brett Hand to coach the League team to 17 wins (1 loss) in the home and away season was exceptional given his late start to his coaching tenure at the Club.
- Brett's commitment to our 'one Club' culture has enhanced our programs which had a significant impact on each grade making the grand final this year.
- Club Historian Peter Cornwall delivered a captivating history lesson to every single male and female player throughout the Club.
- A group of dedicated and committed players, coaches and support staff demonstrated significant resilience to win our first SANFLW premiership.
- We've built some awesome and symbolic display cabinets throughout the Club to showcase our rich history.
- We now recognise all male and female premiership players with their name on the changeroom lockers.
- We've unveiled a strong and symbolic away strip, which is the replica of our 1934 premiership guernsey.
- We now have the competition's best female changeroom facilities.
- We've invested heavily in the personal leadership development of our playing group.

As CEO, I remain committed to providing our Club with not only an environment to win our next premiership, but to continue challenging for a premiership every year we play in both male and female grades. We must continue to make the right decisions for the Club, support our key leaders to drive high standards, walk-the-walk in building a greater one Club' culture and engage our community on our journey to create a dynasty.

#### The Glenelg Club:

The Glenelg Club, like all hospitality venues, continues to suffer from the heavy restrictions placed on licensed operators in order to support the government's efforts to minimise the spread of Covid-19. Social distancing regulations are forecast to continue making it extremely difficult to maintain profitability.

Heading into 2022, it will be critical that the Club maintains our venue as a second home for our members and local community from both a social and financial sustainability perspective. The coming period of time will continue to be full of ups and downs for everyone in our community, and hence, we will aim to provide a safe, comfortable and enjoyable environment for our community.

In closing, I thank all of our management team, our Board and loyal members and sponsors for your unwavering commitment and hard work. As your CEO, I feel extremely honoured to serve the Club and remain committed to building a legacy that will sustain our next 100 years.

## EXECUTIVE FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Glenelg Football Club Inc & Glenelg Footballers' Club Inc Financial Summary for the 31 October 2021 Financial Statements:

The 2021 financial year was another solid year financially for the Club given the challenges we had to endure for the second year running with the ongoing Covid pandemic. The Consolidated Statutory Net Profit for the year ended 31 October 2021 for the Glenelg Football Club Trust (Venue) and the Glenelg Football Club (Football) was \$736,895 compared to \$555,889 for the previous financial year.

Just like most other businesses involved in sport and hospitality in South Australia the challenges we face keep stretching our staff but the financial results that we produced are a testament to their hard work and commitment. We have seen a strong performance in the Venue again due to the quality of our food and service and our Football has been able to maintain our sponsors and members through these difficult times when people have been questioning value for money of their contributions.

Again we thank all our Members and Sponsors for your continued support as the results we produced could not have occurred without this support.

Whilst we have been able to chip away at our debt with the ANZ Bank and the City of Holdfast Bay Council from the proceeds of the SANFL Land Divestment Funds, at this stage we are due to receive our last distribution in October 2023 and this will still leave us with a debt of approximately \$227,666 to the ANZ and \$1,029,922 to the City of Holdfast Bay Council. We appreciate and are very grateful for all the support that we have received from the City of Holdfast Bay Council. Our goal is to work with them to try to eliminate this debt as quickly as possible to strengthen the financial position of the Club and allow us the opportunity to reinvest back into Football and the Venue.

#### **FOOTBALL REPORT**

Season 2021 was an unprecedented year for the Glenelg Football Club with all five teams playing off for a Premiership at season's end. The club was awarded the Stanley H Lewis Trophy for being the best performing club across all grades for the second time in the past three years. While our Men's side crashed to a more committed Eagles outfit, we had cause to celebrate with our Women's team winning their inaugural Premiership. The Reserves also held the trophy aloft while our U/16's and U/18's lost to South Adelaide and Eagles respectively.

The year started with our Senior Men's and Women's teams travelling to Darwin to play against a combined NTFL side on Australia Day. It was an opportunity for new coach Brett Hand to spend some valuable time with 30 players he had had little to no face-to-face interaction with following his appointment in mid-December and challenges faced with Covid-19 and isolating protocols. The benefit of the two programs spending time together discussing leadership strategies, trademark and simply getting to know each other was critical in our bid to create a "One Club" feel. It was an invaluable experience for all involved and helped form strong foundations for the season ahead.

The return of Lachlan Hosie (North Melbourne) and Toby Pink (Sydney) and the recruiting of key defender Sam Durdin (North Melbourne) provided the squad with greater depth and flexibility. Will Chandler also joined the club from Corowa (NSW).

Luke Partington had another outstanding year as did Matt Snook. Luke and Matt shared the John H Ellers award and both players finished in the top 5 of the Magarey Medal. Liam McBean continued his recent dominance of the Ken Farmer Medal (SAN-FL Leading Goalkicker). Liam also represented SA in their victory against WA along with Reynolds, Hosie, Partington, Proud and Curran.

The side showed a great resolve through the minor round winning 17 matches in succession before losing to Port late in the year. There were pleasing aspects in this string of victories. The resilience and determination shown in come from behind wins over Sturt, Norwood (twice) and a dominant effort at Noarlunga provided the group with confidence. Finals football put the spotlight firmly on us as we entered the finals with the best win/loss ratio for the season. Unfortunately, we were unable to bring the resilience and effort we displayed many times during the year. After a narrow loss to the Eagles in the second semi and a hard fought win over South in the Preliminary Final we were headed to our second GF in three years. It would be fair to say we saved our worst game of the year for the biggest stage. We were completely outplayed, outmuscled and outclassed for much of the game. An enormously disappointing result.

Our Reserves deserve great credit for their outstanding season. Joel Tucker (coach) and his assistants Brett Todd and Damien

Raidis had the boys playing a strong and united brand of football. The performance of our next wave of league footballers was very pleasing. Searle, Moore, Crompton, Holder and Horsnell are some of the names to follow in season 2022. Scharenberg and McCarthy, both Premiership players, look to re-establish themselves after a good finish to the year. Minchin and Cole look to put some pressure on the ruck spot in the League side. Joel displayed great temperament with the young group throughout the season and his ability to work closely with Brett and educate the playing group was essential to success in both grades through the minor round.

Ten players made their league debut: Sam Durdin, Toby Pink, Cooper Horsnell, Brodie Newman, Dylan Landt, Nasiah Wanganeen-Milera, Brady Searle, Liam Wisdom, Will Chandler and Gibson Turner. Brett Turner also made his Tigers debut.

The Club has again experienced the loss of several players post season. There are many challenges facing SANFL clubs as we continue to work at developing our lists. The Under 18 program is becoming more and more crucial to Senior success as it is difficult with employment opportunities and accommodation for interstate recruits. Darren Trevena is working to find and nurture the next wave of Glenelg footballers through our country and metropolitan zones.

The Club would like to thank the following players for their commitment and passion for the Glenelg Football Club: Chris Curran, Brad Agnew and Marlon Motlop (retired), Brodie Newman (NT), Dylan Landt (Vic), Jackson Edwards (West), Callum Park (West), Liam Wisdom (QLD), Tom Condon (Norwood), Darcy Le-Cornu and Clay Symonds (SHOC's), Tom Schott and Jack Kluske. Congratulations to Nasiah Wanganeen-Milera and Oscar Adams on being selected in the National Draft by St.Kilda. We look forward to watching them develop at the highest level and wish them all the very best as they embark on the next phase of their footy journey.



The GFCW Team showed great resilience and commitment under coach Jason Fairall to achieve the ultimate reward. It is evident under Jason's coaching he has complete support of the playing group. They work hard and enjoy the challenges that the game of football presents. The timing of the SANFLW season provides many hurdles for our women but they make no excuses. Jason was well supported by Ang Moritz, Richard Gray, Braedon Talbot, Tammy Scott and Emily Woods. Tina Donovan is relentless in ensuring the girls have everything they need to perform to the best of their ability. Ellie Kellock (Captain) is one of the few remaining "originals" from season 1 of the SANFLW competition. Ellie is hugely respected within the club for her uncompromising standards both on and off the field. Ellie leads by example and her team-mates follow. Jess Bates had an outstanding year winning the 2021 Club Champion. Sarah Goodwin, Piper Window and Brooke Tonon emerged as players to watch. Brooke was drafted to Adelaide FC and there is no doubt we will see her succeed on the bigger stage. Congratulations to all involved on winning the club's first women's premiership in the 100th year of the GFC. An outstanding effort.

Congratulations also to Scott Uppington (U/16's) and Darren Trevena (U/18's) for reaching the Grand Final with their respective teams. It is quite a balancing act coaching the Glenelg underage programs. The college football commitment sees many of our players unable to have the continuity within the SANFL programs and our country players have club commitments to juggle with training and playing in Adelaide. We understand the challenges facing these young footballers and Darren works tirelessly to ensure we are represented by the best teams available each week. Thank you to our country families who support their children in their pursuit of playing football at the highest level by driving them to and from games many weekends of the year.

Season 2022 is fast approaching. We have added Sam Baulderstone to our senior coaching group. Sam was the premier ruckman in the SANFL for many years and will take charge of our midfield. Jordan Murdoch has returned to the Club after 10 years in the AFL. Jordan will provide us with great leadership on and off field. We need to regroup and put our energies into giving ourselves every opportunity to play finals and look to rectify our extremely poor effort on Grand Final day.

#### WOMEN'S FOOTBALL REPORT

#### BY JASON FAIRALL

When I reflect back on our incredible premiership season, there are three watershed moments that I believe profoundly shaped us and became the catalyst to launch our assault on 'Everest' in 2021 – our centenary year.

Firstly, the NT trip in late January brought our entire club together. What started off as awkward discussions between the male and female players on the first day quickly led to a strong and organic connection within the space of 24 hours. Our board and administration have been instrumental in bringing the whole club together and the NT trip was a masterstroke that has aligned and intertwined all the 'silos' within the Club. One thing was clear - our female players felt they were now part of one Club, which I believe is one of the most important factors in high performing successful organisations.

The second watershed moment was our Team Building Day, which was facilitated by Anita Schneyder and Meagan Harrison from Teams on Purpose. Anita and Meagan were able to illustrate the journey we have been on since the 2019 preseason, which was our base camp. They also made us acutely aware of where we were currently at after a frustrating and disappointing 2020 season. More importantly, they created a space that allowed us to identify the areas we needed to improve and the gaps we needed to close if we were going to achieve our goals. This incredible process provided us with a complete awareness of ourselves, which in turn allowed us to accelerate the necessary improvements we needed to make as a team.

After what could be best described as a shaky start to the season, the third watershed moment was the recovery training session immediately after our disappointing round 6 draw, after we were up by a goal with just a couple of minutes to go. Excitingly, this was the first ever SANFL Women's game on Adelaide Oval. Disappointingly, our season was now well and truly on the line as we headed into the bye having recorded two wins, three losses and a draw - hardly that of a premiership contender! What happened next and how we responded as a group set us up for the remainder of the season. The Leaders, well led by Ellie Kellock, held a players-only meeting to air a few issues that were shacking us, as well as brainstorm to identify what we were lacking. Feedback was provided to the coaches and adjustments were made. It was like a dark cloud had lifted and we were able to see the 'Everest' peak and we began to take steps towards the summit.

From that point forward, we didn't lose a game. By the time Caitlin Gould and Ebony Marinoff joined us, we had a fair bit of momentum and established ourselves in the top 4, defeating some of the powerhouse SANFL Women's teams along the way. Belief was growing by the week. By the time finals came around, we were well and truly rolling along. Incredibly, we continued on our way undefeated through the finals and finished victoriously with the Club's first SANFLW Premiership.

2021 was a season of firsts and broken records. For the first time ever, we won four games in a row, then five, then six, then the Grand Final being seven. We won our first ever final and obviously our first ever premiership. We kicked our highest ever score of 11 goals and six behinds for a total of 72 points.

2021 saw the family connection grow with the additions of Laura Chigwidden, Alice Bradley, Shae Partington and junior Piper Window to the playing group.

Sadly, there are always players who retire or move on at the end of each season. Ellen Fauser, Tess Morcom, Brooke Trevena and Emily Woods have been significant contributors to our program over many years. Whilst they are and will continue to be missed (although Tess and Emily are coaching at Glenelg), the legacy they have left will positively impact our program forever. Congratulations also goes out to youngster Brooke Tonon, who was drafted by Adelaide Crows.

In 2022, the team is hungry to achieve back-to-back premierships, but we know there is plenty of hard work ahead of us. We have added former North Melbourne star Lindsay Thomas to our coaching group and have welcomed several new recruits. We look forward to building upon our belief and legacy in the Year of the Tiger.


