I would like to thank the Football Executives and Head of Football, Paul Sandercock for their guidance and support during the year.

The delivery of a high-quality Game Day atmosphere and enjoyment continued throughout the year, thanks to the great support from our members and supporters. This culminated with the Super Match King's Birthday Holiday Monday game versus Sturt which was attended by over 7300 people. Well done to all in the club for achieving this together with the great support from the SANFL. We will continue to work together with the SANFL on how we can maximise the experience and attendance on Game Day in 2024.

What an amazing year the Club has had. For the Club to win the League and Reserves men's premierships in the same year for the first time in our 100 year history was an incredible reward for the tireless work that everyone has put in to achieving the ultimate success.

There's been a saying around in footy for some time that "players win touches, teams win matches but Clubs win premierships." Its so true. You cannot deliver premiership success without great people creating a great environment, delivering high standards and living your purpose day-in, day-out. Throughout our Club, we are creating an environment whereby we are attracting and retaining good quality people, all aligned to getting better every single day and being the best we can be. At Adelaide Oval on the 24th September 2023, the footy world saw the on-field outcome of this culture we're building.

Aside from our two premierships, there was a lot to be proud of regarding our performances and the journey we're on as a Club:

- We won the Stanley H Lewis Trophy for the best performed Club in the SANFL across all grades, for the third time in the last five years.
- Our young Women's team continue to work hard and are building some great momentum under the leadership of Lexi Edwards.
- We continue to have a lot of challenges with our U18 & U16 programs with player unavailability during the College football season but both grades were highly competitive during the season under the guidance of Jared Millington (u18's coach) and Dwaine Kretschmer (u16's coach).
- As a Club, it's also humbling to see that we're building one of the best breeding grounds in Australia for AFL talent. From the 2023 season, AFL Clubs recruited the following:
 - » Matt Coulthard (Richmond, mid season draft)
 - » Toby Pink (North Melbourne)
 - » Ashton Moir (Carlton)
 - » Bodie Ryan (Hawthorn)
 - » Piper Window (Port Adelaide, AFLW)
 - » Richard Douglas (Development Coach, Gold Coast Suns)

Off-field, we've continued to build some really good momentum again this year:

- Sponsorship, membership and fundraising remains strong
- We maintained some of the highest match day attendances in the competition, including a record 7,300 people who attended our Kings Birthday Public Holiday match against Sturt FC.
- Our merchandise sales were great during year but also significantly boosted by our premiership success.
- And most importantly, culturally we have a core group of players, coaches and staff who live by our values and act and behave with integrity, respect and genuine care for everyone at the Club.

These outcomes don't just happen and I am incredibly proud of our key leaders for implementing the strategies set by our Board and for living the very values that reflect a high performing organisation.

It would be remiss of me not to recognise our key internal stakeholders for their contributions to the Club. This last 12 months have been quite relentless for everyone, so I just want to take the opportunity to thank our Board, footy department and venue teams for their efforts.

Finance:

From a financial and operational perspective, the Club remains in a strong position, recording a \$347,748 consolidated profit for the year. This was highlighted by the following key variables:

- Increases in football, food and beverage, gaming and merchandise revenue.
- These increases were offset by increased expenditure in labour and cost of goods in the venue, gaming taxes and football department expenditure.
- Our total asset position remains stable.
- The Club continued to reduce our debt and total liabilities by \$441,517.

It is important to note that whilst our cash reserves are strong to fund Club operations, considerable unfunded, high priority capital expenditure projects will need prioritising over the coming years.

Overall, the Club is in a sound financial position and is looking to 2024 with excitement and enthusiasm.

In closing, I thank all of our management team, our Board and loyal members and sponsors for your unwavering commitment and hard work.

EXECUTIVE FINANCIAL SUMMARY

Glenelg Football Club Inc & Glenelg Footballers' Club Inc
Financial Summary for the 31 October 2023 Financial Statements:

The consolidated Statutory Net Profit for the year ended 31 October 2023 for the Glenelg Football Club Trust (Venue) and the Glenelg Football Club (Football) was \$347,748 compared to \$479,701 for the previous financial year.

The overall revenue increase on the 2022 year was \$556,320, however expenses increased by \$688,273. The large expense growth was due to increased staff costs (increases in wages and superannuation), football spend in areas of IT, vision costs and women's football programs and further Investment into the gaming room. The Club has seen increased costs from suppliers during the year and these costs have been passed on late in the season with increased pricing in the venue.

The consolidated net asset position improved by \$347,748 and overall borrowings reduced by \$442,387. Given 2023 was the final Land Divestment Fund Distribution from the SANFL we will need to work hard in 2024 and beyond to generate the cash flow required to continue repaying debt and ongoing investment in the venue and football operations.

Recognition must be given to all staff in the venue and football operations for their tireless efforts throughout the year and doing all the hard work behind the scenes to help achieve the ultimate success for the club winning 2 premierships.

As we start the journey of the 2024 season we welcome supporters, patrons and public to visit the venue, take up a sponsorship or membership or purchase merchandise to start 2024 as strongly as we finished 2023.

FOOTBALL REPORT

Season 2023 was an exceptional year for the Glenelg Football Club. For the first time in GFC history the League and Reserves Teams won the Premiership. This is an outstanding effort and is a credit to so many people involved on and off the field. The club was awarded the Stanley H Lewis Trophy for being the best performed club across all grades for the third time in the past four years.

The year started with a change to our Senior Coach. Brett Hand was replaced by Darren Reeves who joined us from North Adelaide. Richard Douglas joined the club as Head of Women's Football while also assisting Darren with the League side. Clayton Lamb came onboard as Backline Coach and we were able to retain the services of Brett Exelby, Sam Baulderstone and Damien Raidis. Russell Veenvliet took on the Reserves coaching role after having success as Coach of Flagstaff Hill FC.

SENIOR MEN

The return of Brett Turner (Adelaide), Brodie Newman (Darwin), the recruitment of exciting utilities James Bell (Sydney), Connor McLeod (WWT), Jared Deep (North) and much needed Ruckmen Cam McGree (Reynella/SA) and Brock Carter (NTFL) strengthened the squad. Liam Wisdom returned from a year of travel and we had several players from local/country leagues join the squad- Stockman, Guehrer, Coulthard and Scott.

Corey Lyons won the John H Eilers Best & Fairest award which is an incredible feat in a Premiership year. Corey worked hard over pre-season to ensure his output was more consistent than 2022. Matt Allen and Lachie Hosie were dominant in their positions throughout the year. Lachie was awarded the Ken Farmer Medal for SANFL Leading Goalkicker. Matt Snook was vital at stoppages and McGree was outstanding in the Ruck. Proud, Pink, Newman, Bailey and Martini were resolute in defence.

Liam McBean was named Vice-Captain of the SA State team for their annual match against WA. Liam was joined in the State Team by Darcy Bailey, Matt Allen, Brett Turner and Lachie Hosie.

To finish the minor round season with a 15 win/3 loss record is a testament to great player management, planning and executing of training blocks and luck. Tom Stevens (Head of High Performance) has driven a S & C team that has provided our playing group with an elite program built on high standards and trust. Tom, Mia, Callum, Lachie & Jarrod worked closely with GFC medical staff to ensure players were managed to have them fit and ready to go come finals time.

Our Reserves deserve credit for their outstanding season. Russell (coach) and his assistant Todd Alexander had the boys putting pressure on the Senior squad through consistent effort each week. The performance of our next wave of league footballers was very pleasing. Lovelock, Walker, Horsnell, McLeod, Scott, Window, Brokensha, Beecken and Ridgway all showed they have ability to play at the next level.

Eight players made their league debut for the Tigers in 2023: Bell, Lovelock, McGree, Coulthard, McLeod, Kitschke, Deep and Carter.

The Club has again experienced the loss of several players post season. The GFC would like to thank the following players for their commitment and passion for the Glenelg Football Club: Jordan Moore (WWT), Brady Searle (West), Jack Yates (Country), Luke Partington (travel), Brodie Newman (Vic), Brett Turner (Echunga), Lewis Rayson (South Fremantle) and Macklinley Miller (returned home).

Congratulations to Toby Pink (North Melbourne), Ashton Moir (Carlton), Bodie Ryan (Hawthorn) and Matt Coulthard (mid-season draft selection-Richmond). We will watch their progress with pride and wish them all the best at the highest level.

The GFCW Team also underwent changes in the off-season. Jason Fairall stepped down as coach and was replaced by Lexia Edwards. Lexi returned to the club after being a member of our inaugural Women's team. Her teaching background and organisation are strengths that have allowed her to put her own touch on our GFCW Program. Lexi is determined to show the players what it takes to play footy at an elevated level on a consistent basis. We saw glimpses of strong team performances during the year and only narrowly missed playing finals. The loss to Sturt in the final minor round game highlighted focus areas for the players and coaches to address during this pre-season.

I am continually impressed by the attitude and commitment of our players. A new training base at Seaview High School and the opportunity to train and do education sessions at Glenelg on a Wednesday helps establish a stronger connection to the club.

Damian Kitschke played a vital role with our development team and his playing and coaching experiences were invaluable. Unfortunately, Co-Captain Sam Franson was hampered by a season ending injury in the early minutes of Round 1. Sam brings great energy to the group and is to be commended for her positivity around the group while dealing with her own frustrations. Ellie and Sam were well supported by Alice Bradley, Chelsea Packer, Ellen Tyminski and Madi Freeman. Thank you to Zac Ryke (Head Trainer) for his care and commitment in ensuring the players are prepared for training and matches and to Dr. Andy Ryan, Dr. Ben Magi and Alice Fry (Physio) for their support of the players.

Piper Window had an outstanding season winning the GFC B & F award, SANFLW Medal for the Best & Fairest player of the competition and was drafted to Port Adelaide in the recent AFLW Draft. Piper joins Ella Boag and Matilda Scholz at Port.

I would also acknowledge the retirement of Chelsea Packer and Caitlin Swanson. Both players were great role models and contributors to the team. Their presence on and off the field will be missed. Thank you for your passion for the GFC.

The GFC is in the process of establishing a GFCW Girls Academy in the South-East. The GFC will work in collaboration with the Limestone Coast Regional Sporting Academy. This will mirror our long running boys academies.
